

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH ALERT

It has been reported that an attempted home break-in occurred in Fairfield during the month of July '04, at approximately 2 a.m. while the homeowners slept. Moms In Touch International

Every week, in every state of the U.S. and in 85 countries around the world, thousands of mothers meet to pray for their children and their schools. They gather in Mexico, New Zealand, China, Germany, India, Uganda, Egypt, Romania, Russia and many other countries. They are all part of *Moms In Touch International*, an interdenominational, nonprofit ministry of women who believe prayer makes a difference.

The group was founded in 1984 by Fern Nichols while she was stationed in Abbotsford, British Colombia with a Christian ministry. She had two sons entering junior high school. Nichols knew her boys were going to face their greatest test yet in resisting immoral values, vulgar language, and peer pressure. She found other concerned mothers, and they began meeting for prayer.

The following summer Nichols and her family moved to Poway, California, where by the fall of 1985, a group was established at Poway High School. The women met once a week and prayed for a full hour for their children and the school. They prayed for a *Moms In Touch* group for every school in their district, and they shared the concept with their friends and other moms they met. Two years later, Nichols published a *Moms In Touch* booklet, and the following January the first *Moms In Touch* retreat was held. Today there are thousands of *Moms In Touch* groups meeting worldwide.

The organization's goal is to have a group of two or more moms praying for every school in this country and throughout the world. We know our children face many challenges at school (academics, drugs, peer pressure and violence), and to stand in the gap for them through prayer is our highest calling.

The mothers meet once a week to pray for teachers, principals and administrators, conferences, respect for authority, curriculum choices, holiday situations, coaches and athletic programs, high standards, family values, after school programs, problems faced by the students and for the specific needs of the children of the mothers in the group.



We Need Volunteers and Families!

Family to Family Network is an organization that empowers families of children with disabilities by providing information, training, referral and support. As Wheelchairs Roll In, Disability Conference Ushers Out Church Exclusion of the Developmentally Disabled

Most of us would never imagine that there are families who are routinely turned away from places of worship. However, families of children or adults with developmental disabilities and neurological disorders such as cerebral palsy, Down syndrome, autism, Asperger's syndrome, and mental retardation, or who have had a brain injury or who have a mental health disability, commonly tell of the painful rejection they have received from the faith community.

While public schools have learned to accommodate these students, most churches are not prepared to meet their physical, emotional, educational, or spiritual needs. The result? Some parents take turns going to church while one stays home with the child, but many become discouraged and will simply stay at home rather than take on yet another battle.

In response, "Taking JOY to the World," a Disability Conference Helping Churches Help Families, will be held September 24-26, 2004 at Graceview Baptist Church in Tomball, Texas, just northwest of Houston. Its goal is that conference participants will become aware of the thousands of families who live with disability and will leave equipped with the desire, knowledge, and curriculum to start a disability ministry at their own churches, regardless of denomination.

Graceview became aware of this need in 1994 when a family with a 12-year-old who had multiple severe disabilities started visiting. When church leaders asked what they could do to help, Denise Briley shared her dream of a class for her son where he would have friends like himself and not be tucked away in the nursery or the kindergarten class, and she or her husband would not have to leave a worship service when the boy started vocalizing. The "JOY" class was born when Graceview's pastor, Bryan Donahoo, presented the need to the congregation and a small army of dedicated volunteers responded. As more children joined her son, the class grew into a family ministry, and Briley eventually became Graceview's Director of Special Education.

More than 60 families who have been touched by disability are now enjoying full participation at Graceview because of the JOY Ministry. Parents and siblings attend the activities of their choice while their family member who has a disability is paired with a volunteer who sees to all of their needs.

As word has spread, hundreds of churches have contacted Briley for assistance with beginning a disability ministry, which she believes should be just as common as having a nursery. The "Taking JOY to the World" Conference will share Graceview's experience through "JOY" family video montages, awareness and acceptance sessions, parent-led panels, a pastor-to-pastor roundtable, a grandparents' forum, volunteer training, and other seminars. The event will include special music and worship, as well as an exhibition hall showcasing the latest breakthrough products, resources, and services for the disability community.





Jerry was the kind of guy you love to hate. He was always in a good mood and always had something positive to say. When someone asked him how he was doing, he would reply, "If I were any better, I would be twins!" He was a unique manager because he had several waiters who had followed him around from restaurant to restaurant. The reason the waiters followed Jerry was because of his attitude. He was a natural motivator. If an employee was having a bad day, Jerry was there telling the employee how to look on the positive side of the situation.

Seeing this style really made me curious, so one day I went up to Jerry and asked him, "I don't get it! You can't be a positive person all of the time. How do you do it?" Jerry replied, "Each morning I wake up and say to myself, Jerry, you have two choices today. 'You can choose to be in a good mood or you can choose to be in a bad mood.' I choose to be in a good mood. Each time something bad happens, I can choose to be a victim or I can choose to learn from it. I choose to learn from it. Every time someone comes to me complaining, I can choose to accept their complaining or I can point out the positive side of life. I choose the positive side of life.'

After 18 hours of surgery and weeks of intensive care, Jerry was released from the hospital with fragments of the bullets still in his body.

I saw Jerry about six months after the accident. When I asked him how he was, he replied, "If I were any better, I'd be twins. Wanna see my scars?" I declined to see his wounds, but did ask him what had gone through his mind as the robbery took place. "The first thing that went through my mind was that I should have locked the back door," Jerry replied. "Then, as I lay on the floor, I remembered that I had two choices: I could choose to live, or I could choose to die. I chose to live. "Weren't you scared? Did you lose consciousness?" I asked. Jerry continued, "The paramedics were great. They kept telling me I was going to be fine. But when they wheeled me into the emergency room and I saw the expressions on the faces of the doctors and nurses, I got really scared. In their eyes, I read, 'He's a dead man. "I knew I needed to take action." "What did you do?" I asked. "Well, there was a big, burly nurse shouting questions at me," said Jerry. "She asked if I was allergic to anything. 'Yes,' I replied. The doctors and nurses stopped working as they waited for my reply. I took a deep breath and yelled, 'Bullets!' Over their laughter, I told them, 'I am choosing to live. Operate on me as if I am alive, not dead." Jerry lived thanks to the skill of his doctors, but also because of his amazing attitude. I learned from him that every day we have the choice to live fully. Attitude, after all, is everything.

College Freshmen, Beware: 'Dorm Disease' Set To Return

High school graduates have more in common with newborn babies than one would think. Although departing the proverbial family nest, incoming college freshmen need vaccinations, too.

Meningococcal meningitis, the bacterium-induced inflammation of the lining of the brain, primarily affects first-year college students who live in dormitories. While health experts do not fully understand why this demographic is more susceptible than others, they have long believed that living in close quarters provides the most logical explanation.

"For reasons that are not completely understood, young adults are susceptible to being infected as they go away to school and live in dormitories," said Dr. David Tweardy, chief of infectious diseases at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

The culprit, a bacterium called Neisseria meningitidis, is transmitted person-to-person and settles in its hosts' nasal passages, where it can reside for days and even weeks at a time. The organism either remains in a harmless state or enters into the bloodstream and gains access to the brain where it causes infection. People whose immune systems have no prior exposure to the bacterium are the most susceptible to infection.

Out of approximately 3,500 cases of meningococcal meningitis each year in the United States, up to 10 percent of patients die within a few days to weeks of contraction. Even those who survive infection

may suffer from serious neurological repercussions like permanent hearing damage.

Detection of bacterial meningitis can be tricky because of its non-specific symptoms, which may include fever, headache, malaise, nausea and vomiting. Photophobia, the fear of bright light, a stiff neck and a runny nose may also occur.

Although physicians are not always diligent about vaccinating graduating high school students, a growing number of colleges are treating incoming freshmen as soon as they set foot on campus.

"Getting vaccinated is a benefit to reduce the small but nonetheless real risk of getting this disease, which can be devastating," said Tweardy.
