Homeowner's Association (HOA) Update

You, the residents, have spoken and we have heard your requests. In an attempt to keep you abreast of what is going on right here in Village Creek, there will be an update each month in the Gazette.

At last months meeting, locations for the NEW BIKE RACKS were discussed and agreed upon—there will be one bike rack placed in the area around the pool/playground and the second bike rack will be located near the spray park. So, inform the bike riders in your home that they will soon have a place to rest their ride other than laying it on the ground.

Also, it has been confirmed that there will be an additional entrance/ exit to Village Creek in the future. The time frame has not been communicated. Lake Vista Drive will connect into the adjoining neighborhood in the back of the community, allowing direct access to the elementary school that many of our children attend. We will keep you posted on this progress.

Another 'pocket park' is under construction and will be opening in the near future and discussions occurred regarding connecting all walkways to create a green belt throughout the community. Additional STOP signs may be going up at key intersections so be aware as you enter and exit the neighborhood via Lake Vista Drive. Keep in mind that there are several small children, runners, and pet-owners walking with their four-legged friends, so keep your speed at a reasonable rate (preferably around 25 mph). Maybe consider treating Lake Vista Drive like a school zone to keep our children and residents safe.

As always, any resident is welcome to attend the HOA meetings. However, if you are unable to attend, you may contact your HOA Board Representatives for information. Creepy Crawly Gelatin

1 ¹/₂ cups boiling water 1 pkg (8-serving size) JELL-O Orange flavor gelatin 1 ¹/₂ cups cold water Gummy worms



Stir boiling water into gelatin in large bowl at least 2 minutes until completely dissolved. Stir in cold water. Pour into 9-inch pie plate which has been sprayed with no stick cooking spray.

Refrigerate about 1 ¹/₂ hours or until thickened. Push gummy worms into gelatin. Refrigerate 2 hours or until firm. Unmold. Garnish with additional gummy worms, if desired.

Note: To unmold, dip pie plate in warm water for about 15 seconds. Gently pull gelatin from edge with moist fingers. Place moistened serving plate on top of pie plate. Invert pie plate and serving plate; holding plates together, shake slightly to loosen.

Candy Corn Popcorn Balls



microwavable bowl on HIGH 1 ¹/₂ to 2 minutes or until marshmallows are puffed. Stir in gelatin until well mixed.

Pour marshmallow mixture over popcorn and candy corn in large bowl. Mix lightly until well coated. Shape into 15 balls or other shapes with greased or wet hands. Wrap each ball in plastic wrap and tie with raffia or ribbon if desired.

EGGSHELL GHOST

- 1. Wash out and let dry over night, eggshells from 3-4 eggs
- 2. On a piece of poster board, draw a simple ghost outline about an 8¹/₂" by 11" size
- 3. Cut out the ghost and punch a hole at the top
- 4. Draw and color two eyes (and mouth if wanted)
- 5. Put the eggshells in a ziplock baggie and have the kids roll a canned good can back and forth over the eggs until they are crushed into an even texture
- 6. Spread glue over the ghost in sections and let your little one sprinkle the crushed egg all over the glue. Sprinkle until finished and let your ghost dry.
- 7. Tie a piece of yarn through the punched hole to hang for decoration.

Some of the eggshells do fall off, so you may need to find a suitable location for hanging your ghosts.
