L.I.F.T. (Leadership Inspiration Facilitation Team) is a new leadership program for eighth grade students that began last spring. Students were selected because two or more teachers felt they would benefit from the opportunity to develop and exercise their leadership skills. The purpose of L.I.F.T. is to give these students a chance to be part of something larger than themselves. Our goal is to train leaders for tomorrow and help the students learn more about their own strengths through teaching and mentoring Arnold's youngest students.

In June, each L.I.F.T. member attended a three-day R.O.P.E.'s camp which enhanced their problem-solving, leadership, and cooperation skills. The games and activities that the students played enabled them to take abstract ideas such as responsibility, respect, and diversity and apply them to concrete experiences they may encounter both in school and at home. All of the members were able to shine in ways beyond their own expectations, and the camp set an enthusiastic tone for the upcoming school year.

L.I.F.T. students currently visit sixth grade advisories each Friday, and we call it The Friday Experience. Now, they are leading and facilitating the same games they learned during the summer camp. After the games are completed and before ending advisory, members reflect with the sixth graders. They help the students connect the themes from the game to life lessons and skills everyone needs to be successful. These discussions are the key to unlocking the leaders within our L.I.F.T. members and building mentoring relationships with their advisory students.

One of the most unique aspects of L.I.F.T. is the program's reliance on student input and feedback. Already, our members selected incentives for a school wide survey; they chose twelve fellow members to attend the Superintendent's Student Leadership Conference, and they are currently brainstorming ideas to raise money for the Ataxia-Telangiectasia (A-T) Children's Project. Future L.I.F.T. endeavors include field trips, visits from guest speakers and fund raisers such as a Fall Fun Run and a Messy Olympics. We are all looking forward to a dynamic and rewarding school year.
