



Every week, in every state of the U.S. and in 85 countries around the world, thousands of mothers meet to pray for their children and their schools. They gather in Mexico, New Zealand, China, Germany, India, Uganda, Egypt, Romania, Russia and many other countries. The group was founded in 1984 by Fern Nichols while she was stationed in Abbotsford, British Colombia with a Christian ministry. She had two sons entering junior high school. She found other concerned mothers, and they began meeting for prayer.

The following summer Nichols and her family moved to Poway, California, where by the fall of 1985, a group was established at Poway High School. The women met once a week and prayed for a full hour for their children and the school. They prayed for a *Moms In Touch* group for every school in their district, and they shared the concept with their friends and other moms they met. Two years later, Nichols published a *Moms In Touch* booklet, and the following January the first *Moms In Touch* retreat was held. Today there are thousands of *Moms In Touch* groups meeting worldwide.

The organization's goal is to have a group of two or more moms praying for every school in this country and throughout the world. We know our children face many challenges at school (academics, drugs, peer pressure and violence), and to stand in the gap for them through prayer is our highest calling.

Did You Know? Jesus said, "Let the children come to me and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child will never enter it" (Mark 10:14-15).

Jesus obviously loved children, and he was more than willing to bless them when mothers brought them to him. But he didn't just do so simply as a routine ritual. In the midst of a generation who admired and followed the rich and famous, Jesus, on the contrary, used children to illustrate those who would actually enter God's Kingdom. Why? Because, unlike proud adults, children are humble. They have no aspirations to greatness, and the applause they seek isn't for selfish gain; it's for parental approval. Children lack pride, and this allows them to accept gifts without insisting on paying the giver back. Jesus had a gift to give, and it was his life to save sinners from the wrath of God. He gave himself on the cross in death and told everyone that if they would only believe he would save them. Children also have simple faith in that they believe what they're told. Their minds are like sponges soaking up all that is fed to them. They accept truth and error, so it's the teacher's responsibility to teach them Truth. Those who trip them up will answer to their Maker.

Jesus was not saying that only children will inherit God's Kingdom; he was saying that it takes the *attitude of a child* to enter into heaven. And he warned that those who won't receive God's Kingdom as a child won't enter it at all. Those who recognize how insignificant and small they are, however, *will* enter heaven. This is what ultimately prevents the rich and famous from entering God's presence – they're too into themselves and their own so-called significance.

Those who do come to Christ "as little children" are held in Christ's arms and blessed, for he loves them intensely. God's love for all people is one of action as evidenced by Christ's death at the cross, but His particular love for His chosen ones, those who come to Him in faith, is especially intense – like that of a mother to her children. Childlike faith is what distinguishes God's children from the rest of the world. We may not understand all that God does or has done, but His true children know that God knows best; that He is sovereign and in control – the same way a child goes to sleep at night knowing that his mom and dad are protecting him. Christ holds those with that kind of faith close to his heart. He loves His children – those who have faith in Him alone for salvation.



Psalm 127:3 says Children are a gift from the Lord; they are a reward from him. $^{(NLT)}$




