More Trails Planned Near Circle C

The October newsletter reported planning efforts to create a biking trail from Barton Creek Greenbelt to the Wildflower Center. Although plans for this trail may take some time to become reality, there is another project that may bring us nearby hiking and biking trails much sooner. Planning is underway by a City of Austin sponsored group to provide public access to the Proposition 2 Lands that lie adjacent to Circle C on the west. You may recall that Proposition 2 was a bond election in 1998 approving \$65 million to purchase Water Quality Protection Lands (WQPL). The WQPL land adjacent to Circle C is known as the Slaughter Creek Watershed and includes the Baker, Hafif and Hielscher tracts totaling 646 acres. This land is bounded by Circle C on the east and south and FM 1826 on the west. WQPL land is under the management of the city's water department, but they have decided to look to volunteer organizations to develop public access. Plans have been made for hiking, mountain biking, and equestrian use of the Slaughter Creek Watershed and funding has been authorized by Texas Parks and Wildlife for trail construction, but will not be released until a city permit is obtained. Permitting depends upon the volunteer organizations, known collectively as the Stakeholder Steering Committee, to develop rules acceptable to the city for developing and using the properties. Some activity has already occurred such as thinning of the juniper and planting native grasses. Trail construction should begin as soon as the permit is obtained.

Volunteers from several participating organizations such as the Hill Country Foundation and Austin Ridge Riders will perform most of the work. Circle C Homeowners Association is also a member of the Stakeholder Steering Committee and welcomes Circle C residents to volunteer to assist in creating and managing this recreational resource. There are opportunities for trail construction and maintenance, native plant management, property docents for leading group tours, rules use development, etc. Please contact the Circle C HOA office if you are interested in volunteering.

And you will see us adding compost to some of the perennial beds over the next month.

Campo Public Hearing On Removing The Bridge On Wm. Cannon @ South Mopac From The Regional Toll Plan

6:00 pm Monday, December 13, 2004 LBJ Auditorium 26th and Red River

The past month has seen a number of important developments regarding the proposed Austin area regional toll plan. At its November meeting, several CAMPO directors voiced support for a compromise that removes the proposed toll at the soon to open bridge on South Mopac at William Cannon. In return, the state would need to replace expected toll revenue from that location in order to fund additional improvements elsewhere on Mopac.

At this point, the proposed improvements to Mopac are all north of Town Lake and south of 183. They would include adding sound walls to protect central Austin neighborhoods and creating what are termed "optional" toll lanes (using existing shoulder and right of way) to expand capacity.

If CAMPO and state officials agree on the proposed compromise, the rest of the regional toll plan would still be very much alive. At this writing, there was some discussion of delaying the charging of tolls for up to two years for some stretches of roadway (most of these in northeast and east Austin) – but additional details were not yet available.

CAMPO will hold an important public hearing on removing the Wm. Cannon toll from the plan at its December 13 monthly meeting. The hearing has been moved to the LBJ Auditorium, which can accommodate a larger audience. Residents attending the hearing to express their views may do so by speaking publicly or documenting their comments on index cards.


