

Cypress Mill Homeowner's Association Annual Meeting

For now we need each homeowner to consider participating on the board. If you have ideas for improving our neighborhood, or want to meet more of your neighbors, or want to understand and control the association fee you pay, or have some constructive criticism, you should be on the board. This year we will have four of our director's terms expire. Alan Schubert, our developer does not plan to retain his board position. This is very critical in the fact that the developer will no longer retain the majority vote. It is now up to the community to retain majority vote on all elections.

We need at least four homeowners with an interest in the investment in their home and neighborhood to step forward and join the board. If you choose to run be advised you are running for a position as a director, not as an officer. The board holds its own election for the officers after the board members are selected. If you are interested, you will have the opportunity to speak to the community at the annual meeting and be given the chance to be elected to the board through a vote of the homeowners.

The quality of life in a community depends on the participation of its residents in activities that affect the area. You have the choice of simply paying your annual assessment, and that is all you must do. However, another choice is to be active and make a difference in your community.

What makes for a better community is participation as an active member of the community on one of the committees of the homeowner's association or your becoming a member of the board. If you Moms and Dads don't take the time to participate, the quality of life in this area will decline for you and your children.

Our mission as the Board of Directors of your homeowner's association is to:

- 1. Develop programs, resources, and financial strategies to maintain and improve the community,
- 2. Develop short- and long-term objectives,
- 3. Establish implementing plans and performance measures,
- 4. Maintain oversight of functions (the efficient enforcement of CC&Rs and all Association standards, and the maintenance and improvement of the services and amenities provided and maintained by the Association), including fiduciary responsibility, and
- 5. Develop future community leaders.

We encourage all homeowners to attend the annual meeting. Even if you do not plan to serve on the board or a committee, you will have the opportunity to participate in the election of directors and get an update on the direction of the community. Not only will the board present its plans for the community, but also there will be committee updates as well as a question and answer period.





Pool Supplies/Repairs: Miscellaneous repairs or supplies needed at the pool. Includes \$2000 to bring the Park pool and \$5700 to bring the Cypresswood pool into compliance with new State Codes.

Grounds Improvement: Extras not included in the contract, replacement of plant materials and other improvements. Includes \$1400.00 to install two live oak trees next to tennis courts.

Deed Restriction Mowing: This amount is reimbursed by the property owner.

Access Card System: Miscellaneous expenses for access card system at Fitness Center, including 400 access cards (100 cards @\$460.00)

Club/Fitness Room: Misc. repairs and preventive maintenance, including air freshening contract.

Sprinkler Repairs: Cost to maintain irrigation system.

Tennis Court: Cost to maintain courts - i.e. nets, windscreens.

General Repairs: Cost for any misc. repairs to common area - i.e. playground, signs, brick walls. Includes \$1,020 to relocate the flag pole.

Audit: Cost to prepare annual audit, and Federal tax return.

Legal Fees: Expense for collection of maintenance fees, and enforcement of deed restrictions. Costs are billed back to homeowners account.

Management Fee: Based on a full management contract. Includes an increase based on additional owners.

Postage: At cost.
