





ATTENTION FAIRFIELD PET OWNERS ...

My name is Susan Locke, I am the Lost and Found Pet Coordinator for Fairfield. Geri Bishop is hanging up her leash after many years of providing an outlet to match lost and found pets in our community. Thank you Geri for your years of dedication in reuniting lost animals with their families, it is greatly appreciated.

I would like to explain the services I am trying to provide our community and what I am not. I am a contact for someone that has lost or found a pet that tries to match the two together. I am unable to pick up, deliver or provide medical assistance to lost, found or injured animals. I am here to encourage the Fairfield pets Yahoo Group site and provide an outlet for animals that are lost and found. In the first 3 weeks of officially receiving calls and emails, I was overwhelmed of the amount of found animals with no identification. I encourage all of you go stop by a pet store and by a \$5.00 or less animal identification tag for your animal. Not only does it speed up the process it can also save your animal's life if picked up by Harris County, as it is their policy to extend the 72hr euthanasia period if the animals has identification. I wrote an email to the Yahoo groups web site that I encourage all to log on and read about the 97% rate of euthanizing animals here in Harris County, it will open your eyes on the overpopulation of pets in this county and the need for all animals to have a collar with tags and please spay and neuter your animals.

This month we have 3 dogs that are in need of loving homes. The first is a female border collie that was rescued on HWY 290 in October. She is very smart and would love a home with another dog to play with or kids to love. The 2nd is a Australian Sheppard and possibly 2 pups. She was found in Dec at the Methodist Church and is also in need of a loving home. The 3rd is a female black lab mix about 1 year old that the owner is unable to keep any more. She is very good with kids but has been known to escape from the backyard from time to time but with lots of attention that could be easily corrected.

Is there any Fairfield Neighbors that can donate their web skills to help develop a website for lost and found animals that might be more user friendly than yahoo groups to encourage more members?

Every week, in every state of the U.S. and in 85 countries around the world, thousands of mothers meet to pray for their children and their schools. Many people have wondered: Do they really swim in the cold??! Yes, we do. Here a r esome of the reasons why... Swimming is a total mind and body sport. You use muscles

for swimming that you don't use for other sports or daily activities. If trying to get better at it, you will also be using your mind more than with other sports and in a different way. Swimming is a multi-plane activity.

You go as fast as you can, horizontally, head first, to a concrete wall. Therefore, you need to build up these different muscles, know where the wall is without looking up, and have a different kind of balance. All of this is stimulating your mind to think in different ways. Studies have proven that swimmers make the best grades amongst athletes. Part of that is that swimmers can spend more time in the water without risking injury, therefore they need to do a better job of getting things done (like homework) to fit it into their lives. Swimming well means swimming with a rhythm. That steady beat in your head makes it easier to think logically, mathematically, and of course, rhythmically.

Swimming builds up your immune system. Because you are using more muscles and more lung power you are helping your body to defend itself. Studies with very young children (under age 4) have shown that swimming regularly can help children remain well and heal faster when they do get sick. Children that swim with a cold do tend to get better faster (do not allow your child to swim if they have a fever, or if they are taking cold medicine). Swimmers blow out their air through their nose and while that's not very pretty, it is very effective!

Coaches of other sports love swimming. It's the best cross-trainer out there. Swimmers have more coordination, stamina and lung power - all very important in other sports. Our swimmers are continually learning more about swimming, safety and other life skills. The Terrapins are dedicated to their sport and their teammates. 





Kiwanis, International is a worldwide service organization with "Children, Priority One" as its primary focus. Kiwanians work



Did You Know? In Mark 11:23-23 Jesus said, "*Truly I say, if one says* to this mountain, Be lifted up and thrown into the sea, and does not doubt in his heart but believes that what he says will happen, it will be done for him. 24 For this reason I tell you, whatever you pray and ask for, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours. 25 When you stand praying, if you have anything against anyone, forgive him, so that your Father in heaven may also forgive you your sins."

Jesus told his disciples that pure faith, without doubt, could actually move mountains! Now its important to note that this actual feat *can* be accomplished through faithful prayer, but "moving mountains" was an idiom used in the first century for overcoming great difficulties. It shouldnt be viewed here as literal per se, but great faith *can* actually move mountains its just evident that no one has that kind of faith. Furthermore, God has put the mountains where He wants them, and if He wanted them moved Hed move them! By the same token, Christians sometimes want things done that God has not ordained, and our requests are at times denied because theyre selfish and are not in accordance with Gods perfect plan. Our requests must reflect Gods will and be accompanied by faith.

But there is another condition for prayer to be effectual as given in v. 25. *Gods children must forgive each other when they have been of-fended*. No one can effectively pray in the name of Jesus and yet hold a grudge against another person. Those who do can expect a denial of their prayers. The passage teaches that Gods forgiveness is released when the person praying has forgiven those he needs to forgive. This too is a fruit that is manifest only in Gods true children who pray with faith according to His will, and the only thing that prevents their every request is Gods

sovereignty. In the same way that we as parents deny their own childrens requests for their own good at times, so too does our loving God when our requests are contrary to His plan.

C.S. Lewis said, "It seems to me that such promises about prayer with faith refer to a degree or kind of faith which most believers never experience. A far inferior degree is, I hope, acceptable to God. Even the kind that says, Help thou my unbelief! may make way for a miracle. Again, the absence of such faith as insures the granting of the prayer is not even necessarily a sin; for our Lord had no such assurance when he prayed in Gethsemane... There are, no doubt, passages in the New Testament which may seem at first sight to promise an invariable granting of our prayers. But that cannot be what they really mean. For in the very heart of the story we meet a glaring instance to the contrary. In Gethsemane the holiest of all petitioners prayed three times that a certain cup might pass from him. It did not. After that, the idea that prayer is recommended to us as a sort of infallible gimmick may be dismissed."





BCM Studies New Treatments To Unclog Blocked Arteries In The Legs

Baylor College of Medicine

HOUSTON – (Dec. 21, 2004) – Atherosclerosis can cause serious problems in the legs, as well as the heart, say experts at Baylor College of Medicine (BCM) in Houston.

As people age, the normal flow of blood through the legs and feet can be affected by the build up of plaque inside the leg's arteries and having pain while walking is the first sign of leg artery disease, or peripheral arterial disease (PAD).

Two current treatments for leg atherosclerosis include exercise programs and medication, and BCM is currently studying two new forms of treatment, an aggressive new combination of lipid management drugs for patients with less severe PAD and a gene therapy option for patients with advanced leg ischemia.

"We hope the new combination of medications consisting of three lipid-lowering drugs, compared to just one in standard medication therapy, will work to lower bad cholesterol and raise good cholesterol," says Dr. Alan Lumsden, a professor and chief of the division of vascular surgery and endovascular therapy at the Michael E. DeBakey Department of Surgery at BCM. "This new combination will work to reduce the chance of atherosclerosis in the heart and other arteries."

The gene therapy study for patients with severe leg blockage involves injecting a growth factor, a substance that the body produces naturally in the liver and other organs of the body, into the leg. The growth factor will have the ability to cause new blood vessels to grow from existing blood vessels.

"Only patients with severely reduced blood flow caused by blocked

arteries in the leg will be considered for the gene therapy study," says Lumsden.

A person's risk of developing peripheral arterial disease increases with age, with people over age 50 being at greatest risk of developing the disease. It effects 20 percent of people over 70 years of age in the United States and can be life-threatening if not treated properly.

"PAD refers to a partial or complete blockage of the circulation to the legs or the feet, and the first sign is cramping while walking because of blockage in the femoral artery," says Lumsden.

As the disease progresses, it starts involving blood vessels below the knee and patients may then have limb-threatening atherosclerosis in the legs.

"It is very common for someone with atherosclerosis in the leg to have it in the heart," says Lumsden. "More than 40 percent of patients with PAD will have coronary disease."

Factors that contribute to the risk of developing leg artery disease are:

- · Smoking
- Hypertension, or high blood pressure
- · Diabetes mellitus
- · High levels of cholesterol or triglycerides in the blood
- · Being more than 30 percent over one's ideal weight


