



Melting the Chocolate Myth

HOUSTON — If you have acne, don't put away the candy this Valentine's Day. Have your chocolate and eat it, too.

"Despite the belief that chocolate causes acne, there is no scientific basis that proves this theory," said Dr. John Wolf, chairman and professor in the department of dermatology at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. "Follow a 'common sense diet.' If a particular food affects your complexion, don't eat it."

Acne is a skin condition primarily affecting teenagers and nearly half of all adults. It is most often found on the face, neck, shoulders, upper back and chest in the forms of whiteheads, blackheads and pimples.

Acne is not caused by poor hygiene but rather results from a combination of factors including heredity, hormones, natural bacteria, excess oil production and clogged pores. Other factors that can trigger acne include stress, fatigue and menstruation.

"There is a natural tendency to associate acne flare-ups with something that you ingest, such as a candy bar. It is important to understand, however, that acne goes through a continuous cycle of ups and downs caused by factors often beyond our control," Wolf said.

Not All Fats are Created Equal

HOUSTON – Dietary fat might have a bad reputation among many health-conscious eaters, but certain types of fat are essential to a well-balanced, heart-healthy diet.

"There are some fatty acids that the body does not make that we must get from the foods we eat," said Dr. Rebecca Reeves, a registered dietitian with Baylor College of Medicine's Behavioral Medicine Research Center.

Basically, there are three types of fat monounsaturated, polyunsaturated and saturated.

Monounsaturated fat has been found to actually lower the levels of LDL, or bad cholesterol, when substituted for saturated fat in the diet. An added benefit is that some studies suggest it does not decrease the level of HDL, or good cholesterol. It can be found in olive and canola oil, avocados and nuts.

"While there is good scientific evidence of the benefits of monounsaturated fat, moderation is still the key," Reeves said.

Math Helps Unravel DNA Tangle

HOUSTON – Collaboration between a mathematician who specializes in knot theory and a Baylor College of Medicine virology and microbiology researcher may have solved a mystery at the heart of cancer and infection: how tangled DNA unravels into two single strands in the process of cell reproduction.

"Think about untangling your garden hose in the spring," said Dr. Lynn Zechiedrich, BCM assistant professor of virology and microbiology. "It has been packed away in a small space and everything's all tangled together. It's the same with DNA."

Understanding how cells keep their DNA untangled is important in developing new treatments for cancer and infectious diseases, she says. In both, fast-growing cells that are quite different from the normal cells of the human body threaten to outgrow and overwhelm us. Drugs that interfere with the untangling of DNA attack all rapidly dividing cells, including healthy ones. The rapidly growing cells must have their DNA untangled quickly. The DNA untangling enzymes, which are the targets for many anticancer and antibiotic drugs, are a prime focus of Zechiedrich's work.



Fire Extinguisher Guide

s your home equipped with a fire extinguisher? In the event of a fire would you know how and when to use it? You and your family should review the following tips.

There are several classes of fire extinguishers that are specifically designed to extinguish different types of fires. To ensure maximum safety, be sure your home has an A-B-C extinguisher that can be used for all fire types.

- ✓ Class A combustible fires such as wood and paper
- ✓ Class B flammable liquid fires such as gasoline, oil, grease and paint
- ✓ Class C electrical fires such as fuse boxes, wiring and appliances

Should a fire occur, remember the P.A.S.S. system. Proper technique is important to properly contain and put out a fire.

- Pull the pin that locks the operating lever
- ✓ Aim the nozzle or hose at the base of the fire
- ✓ Squeeze the lever above the handle to discharge the extinguisher
- ✓ Sweep the nozzle or hose from side to side moving carefully toward the flames.

Chicken Handling Tips

hicken has become one of the most popular and nutritious meals around; however, proper handling is essential. Using common sense and these simple guidelines will ensure your meal is as safe as it is delicious.

Always keep raw chicken refrigerated. If you are not going to cook your chicken within a day, freeze it.

- Discard liquids used to marinate. If you intend to make a sauce from the marinade, boil it for five minute before serving.
 - Wash hands, utensils and equipment thoroughly. Carefully clean anything that comes in contact with raw chicken in hot soapy water to avoid cross contamination with other foods.
 - Cook chicken until the juices run clear. A properly cooked chicken should have an internal temperature of 160°
 F for boneless pieces and 180°
 F for whole birds.

Dangerous Liaisons: Prescription Drugs, Some Fruits and Veggies Don't Mix

HOUSTON – (Feb. 1, 2005) – Taking prescription drugs? Some over-the-counter remedies, herbal therapies--even vegetables and fruit juices may clash with your doctor's prescription if you're not careful.

"Patients are often unaware that complications can arise when prescription medications are combined with other drugs and certain foods," said Dr. Addison Taylor, professor of medicine, pharmacology, and molecular physiology and biophysics at Baylor College of Medicine (BCM). "It is important for these individuals to alert their health care provider of their dietary patterns and of any additional medications they are taking."

According to Taylor, also chief of the section of hypertension and clinical pharmacology at BCM, complications generally occur for two reasons:

- * The combination of drugs interferes with the body's protective mechanisms, therefore offsetting one of the drug's beneficial effects.
- * Certain substances impede the body's ability to metabolize a drug, causing the medication to rise to potentially toxic levels, or decrease to the point where it is no longer beneficial.

The fact that foods can cause adverse effects may be surprising to some, but Taylor says that these complications are a serious reality. For example, the body's ability to metabolize certain antidepressant medications can be impaired by drinking too much grapefruit juice. Furthermore, the vitamin K in spinach and other leafy vegetables can offset the effects of certain blood thinning medications.

To prevent dangerous drug interactions, Taylor recommends the following:

- * Do not keep medications past their expiration date. Drugs can lose their potency or become toxic after a certain period of time.
- * Read the label and patient information brochures that accompany prescription drugs.
- * Inform your healthcare provider of any additional medications, herbal or nutritional supplements that you are taking, as well as your dietary patterns.
- "Pharmacists have at their disposal programs that allow them to view potential interactions between drugs," said Taylor. "However, if they do not know what medications you are taking, they can't advise you appropriately."
