### **TEXAS TERRAPINS SWIM TEAM** Caution / Danger! The Problem with Flotation Devices

"Caution: This is not a lifesaving device. Do not leave child unattended while in use. Use only under competent adult supervision. Not a life preserver."

"WARNING! Only to be used in water in which the child is within its depth and under adult supervision." (The standard warning on floaties.)"

We are getting to the time of year when we will be seeing more and more articles about senseless drownings. What does this have to do with flotation devices? More and more children are wearing these devices in their swimming suits, on their arms and around their waist. Parents feel more secure when their little one's head is held above water when they are not holding them.

There are times when floatation devices are a must, like ANY TIME the child is on a boat, or around the water (lake, river, beach, or pool – when you are not holding them). Always use a Coast Guard approved life jacket. The ONLY time a child should not use these is when they are swimming. What is the harm? It is threefold.

- 1. They give a false sense of security to the child. When a child swims with a flotation device, they do not have to work, or even get proper body position, to get to the surface. Usually, a favorite pastime at the pool for children is to repeatedly jump in. It's so much fun. When a child does this over and over with a flotation device, they learn to just "hang" in the water and wait to be popped up to the surface. Many times, accidents happen when the device is taken off (to get a snack, or go to the bathroom) and the child gets back in the water without being noticed. Since the child doesn't have the maturity to understand that they won't "pop up" without their flotation device, they will continue with the same behavior (jumping in and just "hang-ing", waiting to be popped to the surface).
- 2. They give parents a false sense of security. Parents feel that they are being safe by putting these devices on their children. Many times, you can see youngsters walking to the pool with mom or dad, wearing their arm floaties. These children will be allowed to play in the pool, even where they can't stand up, while mom or dad lies at the side, reading a book, or something. Arm floaties are dangerous in that they don't always work. They can have a leak that is hard to detect, they can slip off easily (especially after sunscreen is put on), and very young children bite them and put holes in them. Other devices include the inflatable rings that go around the waist. They are really dangerous, in that many times, children end up upside down and they can't right themselves. This is very common. The only devices that should be allowed to keep children at the surface are coast guard approved life jackets. Parents DON'T TRUST ANYTHING ELSE!
- 3. They put the body in the wrong position for swimming. I have seen children that already know how to swim, that wore floaties over the weekend and came back to me with a non-productive stroke. In other words, they went from being balanced in the water in a horizontal position, to being unbalanced vertically. This can even scare a youngster into not wanting to learn to swim. Most devices keep the child in an upright position, so they never learn that they have to lie down on the water to stay at the top. Children that paddle around the pool in arm floaties are learning to swim in an upright manner, usually bicycling their legs for a kick, and rarely, if at all, put their face in the water. Try this yourself without floation and see how long you last.

I have always told parents to stay away from floaties and rings, and just get in the water with your child. Make sure that you always have them within an arms distance, and ALWAYS have your eyes on them. Train your children to ask permission to leave the steps (or whatever their boundaries are), and wait for your response. Teach them to sit at the edge and wait for you to call them into the water. When you have to get out for a break and your child wishes to stay in, then put the lifejacket on them. BUT, also have them follow the **same guidelines**, and stay within the same boundaries. They do not understand that the life jacket is holding them up and making it OK for them to paddle around the pool, so don't give them permission to do that with a life jacket on.

Young children need to learn a respect for water early. Parents and instructors must try to instill a sense of respect at the same time as encouraging a love for this environment. Train young children early to follow your rules around the water and always enforce them, never slack off. It could mean the difference between life and death.

### To-Do or Not To-Do

Do you find yourself striving to "do" for God? Is your calendar full of things you are doing for the Lord, but lacking in time spent *with* Him?

My schedule has been particularly busy the last few months and one morning when I turned the page of my day planner, I could feel stress grip me as I glanced at the long list of "To-do's." I then dialed my voicemail, only to be greeted with the words, "*You have ten un-played messages.*" My throat tightened, my eyes watered, and I wondered how I could possibly get everything completed on time. Overwhelmed, I whispered a quick prayer under my breath, "Lord, show me what to do!" In my spirit, I sensed God say, "Be still." But how could I be still with phones ringing, deadlines lurking, and papers piling up around me?

I went into time management mode and began assessing which tasks could be postponed. I opened my mail, put aside anything that wasn't urgent (adding to my piles!), and emailed responses to some of my phone messages to save time. I tackled my "To-do's" with determination, ate lunch at my desk, and raced out the door just in time to pick up my kids and make it to my son's orthodontist appointment. As I collapsed in the waiting room chair, I once again sensed God say, "Be still."

After a few days of similar chaos, I recognized that my quiet times had grown shorter as my schedule had grown tighter. A very wise man told me, "You are so busy ministering that you aren't taking the time to hear from God." Everything on my schedule was "for God," but that didn't mean everything in my planner was God directed. I took a morning and simply sat before the Lord, reminding myself of His faithfulness and asking Him for guidance with my schedule. I walked away from that morning with a much shorter "To-do" list and far greater sense of peace that I would find the right balance in my ministry.

At one point in King David's life, he too became focused on "doing" for God. He looked around his palace and shared with the prophet

Nathan that he wanted to build a house for the Lord. After all, David was living in royal luxury while the ark of God was housed in a mere tent. Nathan quickly agreed that David's plan was good and told him "Whatever you have in mind, go ahead and do it, for the Lord is with you." (2 Samuel 7:3). Turns out, this was not what God had in mind at all.

The Lord made it clear David would not be the one to build a house for him. God said, "I have not dwelt in a house from the day I brought the Israelites up out of Egypt to this day. I have been moving from place to place with a tent as my dwelling. Wherever I have moved with all the Israelites, did I ever say to any of their rulers whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?" Then King David went in and sat before the Lord. (2 Samuel 7:6-7, 18) David's heart was right, but the Temple was not his to build. That work would be left to David's son Solomon.

Like David, we can get excited about "doing" for God. The tasks on my calendar were all related to ministry, but some of those good works were intended for another of God's servants to perform.

Jesus said, *Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest (Matthew 11:28).* The Greek word "weary" in this verse indicates one who is fatigued from too much work. I was overloaded and worn out from pushing myself too hard. Once I took the time to "be still" before my Lord, I was able to make the corrections to my schedule that would bring my life back into balance.

How much time are *you* spending sitting before the Lord in prayer? Are there some ministry "To-do's" on your calendar that might need to be done by someone else in the Body of Christ? Do you feel weary and burdened by the load you carry?

Take time to sit before the Lord. You just may find that some of your "To-do's" are not for you to do.

## **Harvest Bible Church**

Did You Know? During his time on the cross Jesus was not completely abandoned. At least four women were there including his mother Mary and his disciple John. John refers to himself throughout his Gospel account as "the disciple whom Jesus loved." Given that his Gospel was written about 50 years after Christ's death and resurrection he most likely grew more and more in the awesome realization that Jesus loved him. As such, he called himself the "disciple whom Jesus loved."

The price Jesus paid at the cross for sin never stopped teaching John about how much Jesus loved him. In John 19:28, Jesus while suffering on the cross, cried out saying he was thirsty. So the Roman soldiers offered him soured wine, thus fulfilling the prophecy of Psalm 69:21. That the wine was there shows that it was used for the crucified victims, for it acted as a drug to deaden the pain of crucifixion and allow the victim to suffer longer. After Jesus tasted the wine he cried out with the shout of victory, "It is finished!" Jesus didn't die like some feeble old man who had been beaten to within an inch of his life; he died with the loud cry of victory on his lips, and it must have startled all who were present. It was the victorious and triumphant cry from the God-man who had fully accomplished everything he came to do. He then bowed his head and willingly gave up his spirit. No one took it from him, he gave it up - all in his perfect time.

When Jesus yelled "It is finished" he meant just that. That term is a monetary term used in ancient Greek to mean "paid in full." That's



what the death of Christ did: it paid our sin-debt to God IN FULL! That means we owe nothing. Believers are saved by God's grace, through faith in Christ, unto good works prepared for us before we were born (Ephesians 2:8-10). We can do nothing to add to what Christ has already done for us. To attempt to do so is a slap in the face to God the Father who gave us the free gift. When Christ yelled "It is finished" what else could he have meant except that nothing could be added to his perfect sacrifice. Jesus fulfilled everything that the OT scriptures said he would - right down to the request for a drink right before he died. But the salvation granted is only for those who call out to Jesus in faith for eternal salvation.

### Tantrums May Be A Cry For Help

Kids who act up may be having trouble fitting in, say experts at Baylor College of Medicine (BCM).

"Behavior problems are often the first sign of an underlying developmental problem," said Dr. Sherry Vinson, an assistant professor of pediatrics at BCM. "Before they blame it on behavior, parents should check out other possible concerns."

Behaviors that can signify developmental problems include tantrums, self-aggression, aggression toward others, destructiveness, hyperactivity, inattention, immaturity, food refusal and withdrawal.

The subtleties of learning disabilities are difficult to distinguish, said Vinson, also a developmental pediatrician at Texas Children's Hospital and a former elementary and middle school teacher.

Developmental problems range from difficulty in one area, such as mathematics or reading, to attention deficit hyperactivity disorder or autism.

When behavioral problems appear, parents should see their pediatrician and arrange for psychoeducational testing. This testing can be done for children 3 years old and above through the local school district and for children under 3 through the Early Childhood Intervention Program, found at www.nectas.unc.edu.

#### **Toddler Is The Boss At Potty Time**

Persistent parents do more harm than good when it comes to toilet training.

"Children should have complete control during toilet training," said Dr. Teri Turner, assistant professor of pediatrics at Baylor College of Medicine. "Problems can arise when parents forget who's in charge."

Toilet training can begin when the child is able to stay dry for several hours and can communicate the need to use the toilet. At this point, the child will be looking for independence and will want to please.

"The most common reason for resisting toilet training is that the child has been lectured or reminded too much," she said. "To the child, the reminders are pressure."

Turner, also an attending physician at Texas Children's Hospital, offered these suggestions for successful toilet training:

- Teach a boy to sit to urinate before standing.
- Keep the child in loose, easy-to-remove clothing.
- Read age-appropriate books with your child about toilet training.
- Don't punish or criticize for accidents.

"Parents should not be overly concerned about when a child is able to use the potty and should not expect perfection," Turner said. "Setbacks are to be expected."
