

Obviously, dogs can be forced to live outside, alone and away from their families. But to force this kind of life on a dog is one of the worst things you can do to him. Such a life goes against a dog's two most basic instincts: the "pack" and the "den". If you have any doubts about these ideas, think of all the whining, barking, clawing dogs you have seen from dogs tied up alone outside. Dogs trying desperately to get their human families' attention, and then just giving up to become hyperactive, listless, fearful, or vicious when the stress of **enforced solitude** becomes too much to cope with.


The rationale given by people who permanently keep their dogs outside is that they will spend time with the pet outside. Even the most well-meaning pet owner does not spend significant time outside, particularly when it is raining or cold (or hot). Consequently, under the best of circumstances for the outside dog, a bowl of food and water hastily shoved before him, a quick pat given, and his owner, his WORLD is gone, leaving the animal to spend another 22 or 23 hours alone.

A dog brings you the gifts of steadfast devotion, abiding love, and joyful companionship. Unless you can responsibly accept a dog's offer of these great gifts, please do <u>not</u> get a dog. If you already have a dog, perhaps this article will help you to see things from his point of view, and possibly motivate you to change your relationship with him. A sad, lonely, bewildered dog, kept outside, wondering why he cannot be with his family, brings only sadness and unhappiness to the world.

Lamkin Elementary Students and Staff unveil "Wall of 1,000 Plus" self-portraits to celebrate the school's 50th Anniversary ...

Cypress, Texas – A massive tile wall decorated with more than 1,200 self-portraits of Lamkin Elementary students, teachers and staff will be unveiled in a special ceremony to commemorate the school's 50th anniversary.

Art teacher Donna Ganster conceived the idea to invite current students and staff, as well as former teachers and administrators, to create self-portraits on tile as a gift to commemorate Lamkin's anniversary. Partnering with Original Words, a school fundraising organization, the ceramic tile wall will be exhibited at Lamkin for years to come.

The school will host a sock hop complete with coke floats to celebrate the occasion, according to principal Gale Parker. "The students are so excited about this historic event and the opportunity to become part of Lamkin's heritage," she said.

The school, part of the Cypress-Fairbanks (Cy-Fair) ISD northwest of Houston, traces its roots back to 1884 when a small one-room schoolhouse, known as Big Cypress Schoolhouse No.2, Dist. 6, was built. Over the years, elementary and high school students were provided separate facilities, and in 1955 the elementary was renamed Lamkin in honor of G.A. Lamkin, Jr., who served nine years as principal of Fairbanks Elementary prior to his appointment as district superintendent in 1947.

Cy-Fair, the third largest school district in Texas, has been named a "recognized" district by the Texas Education Agency.







ADULT SWIMMING IN FAIRFIELD

Lately, there have been lots of adults using the pool for exercise. Not only is swimming fun, it's very good for the mind and body. Here are some points to keep in mind:

- 1. Be safe (never swim alone, and learn about personal water safety).
- 2. Improve your stroke technique so swimming is easier (faster) and you can gain more benefits from this great sport. The Texas Terrapins coaches can help you with this.
- 3. Swim to help you get into shape after an injury from another sport or condition (swimming is the sport that most doctors recommend for back trouble, asthma, any bone or joint injury, etc.).



WATER SAFETY - A TOPIC REVISITED

By Barbara Harold, Head Coach for the Texas Terrapins Swim Team and FAST in Fairfield

Although I have addressed this in a previous article, the subject is so important that it warrants repetition.

Flotation devices on young children must be used sparingly or not at all (except when a young child is on a boat or in and around water that you cannot see the bottom). When a child is put in a flotation device and set free to roam the pool, the child learns three things:

- They can go anywhere in the water without help or supervision
- When they jump in, they simply need to hang there and they will pop up
- 3. Swimming is a vertical movement, powered by "bicycling" the legs. So many young children that have been introduced to the water this way have extreme difficulty with:
- 1. Knowing their true limits and boundaries in the pool
- 2. How to swim back to the side after jumping or falling in
- 3. Getting their body to balance horizontally

Many are terrified to be in the water without flotation, and others (most) will act the same way without flotation and will put themselves in extremely risky situations. They have not developed a respect for the water or simple movements that could save their life. The <u>BEST</u> way to protect your child in and around the water is to get into the water with them and teach them where they go independently and when they need to have parents' attention to "swim."

ALWAYS KEEP YOUR CHILD IN DIRECT EYESIGHT AND WITHIN

AN ARMS REACH.

If they accidentally fall off the steps, gently turn them back and place their hands on the top step or side. Hold their forearm when you do this as it's best for the child to not grab onto you, but the side or steps. Also, teach them to get your attention before swimming to you from the steps and to follow your commands instantly.

ALWAYS PUT YOUR CHILD AND YOURSELF IN COAST GUARD APPROVED LIFE JACKETS WHEN ON A BOAT.

Wearing a lifejacket in a boat is just like wearing a seat belt in your car – it can save your life if you get in a wreck. It doesn't matter how good of a swimmer you are if you get knocked unconscious. Many good swimmers have died this way and a few children have actually watched as their parents drown after falling off the boat without a lifejacket.

Parent/Child classes are being taught in Fairfield this summer, so check the front desk for openings.



Did You Know? In Jesus Christ we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace 8 that He lavished on us in all wisdom and insight. 9 He did this when He revealed to us the mystery of His will, according to His good pleasure that He set forth in Christ, 10 toward the administration of the fullness of the times, to head up all things in Christ—the things in heaven and the things on earth (Ephesians 1:7-10).

Ephesians 1:4 says that God the Father chose some for salvation, and He did it before the foundation of the world. He did this in love for the purpose of having a holy and blameless people to worship Him. He also predestined those who would believe in Jesus Christ, in Eph. 1:5, to be His adopted sons through Christ.

Now in the same way that God the Father chose some for salvation, it was God the Son who redeemed those whom the Father chose. The second member of the Trinity, Jesus Christ, redeemed God's chosen elect *through his blood*. The term *redemption* in v. 7 concerns slavery. Slaves were bought and sold on a slave block. Those who purchased them would pay the required price, and the slave would enter into service. Jesus *redeemed* those whom God chose through his death on the cross. Jesus purchased sinners, not with money, but with his blood – with his death. This brought about the forgiveness of sins – the one thing that separates man from God. Jesus Christ the Son accomplished this in accordance with the riches of God's grace


which was *lavished on us in all wisdom and insight* (v. 8). In other words, God poured out His grace on us through Jesus Christ's death. This act was both wise and full of insight because God knew that no one would seek Him or come to Him without His grace which draws them.

God's ultimate salvation was given to His chosen children when He revealed Jesus Christ who is *the mystery of His will*. Jesus revealed the mystery of God's will by making known what was once a secret. His death and resurrection were the means by which God the Father would bring those whom He chose at the foundation of the world to eternal salvation. And it proved Jesus Christ to be the *head* over all things – the King of kings.

Salvation first comes through God the Father's *choosing* and through God the Son's *redeeming*. It's all done as part of God's perfect plan to ultimately fulfill what He has ordained to occur. Since man cannot go a day without sinning God graciously sent Jesus to save all those who would place their faith in Him alone for salvation.

A Touch of Kindness! It seems so natural, nannies playing with babies. But in China, reports CBS News Correspondent Barry Petersen, it's not the norm. In huge orphanages, with too many babies and too few staff, babies can get virtually no attention; left in a crib all day long, almost never talked to – or touched. Now that's changing, thanks to one woman: Jenny Bowen, of Berkeley, California.

"What we give to the children is the gift of nurture, individual care," says Bowen. What inspired her crusade was Maya. Bowen adopted Maya from China six years ago; she was expressionless, dull-eyed, locked in solitude. Bowen worried that Maya might be mentally ill. But after lots of caring and caresses, she realized she was wrong. Bowen thought that what worked for Maya could work across China. She started raising money to train and pay special nannies in a program called Half the Sky to help all the little abandoned babies who may never have parents of their own. "Once it started happening and the results were so successful, it swallowed up my life," Bowen says. "Once you start there's thousands of kids out there you can reach and whose lives you can really change."

In three years they've expanded to 13 orphanages – a drop in the bucket here, but 2,000 tiny lives changed so far. Maybe it seems obvious that touching and holding a child is a good thing, but scientific researchers have discovered that touching a child actually helps release the hormones that help a baby both mentally and physically. As one researcher put it, it's as important to touch a child as it is to

feed it. The older kids are the obvious success stories, children who got the nanny touch as babies and now seem completely engaged and playful. So maybe it's true, it is the simple things that count; as simple as a touch that can change a life forever. —copied



Keeping Swimmer's Ear At Bay

If you've ever had swimmer's ear, chances are you've wanted to pull the plug on the pain.

"When water is trapped in the ear canal for a long time, the skin barrier is weakened," said Dr. Jeffrey Vrabec, an associate professor of otorhinolaryngology at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. "Bacteria can then enter the skin, causing an infection that can become very painful."

Swimmer's ear, or otitis externa, is an inflammation of the outer ear that is most often caused by the accumulation of excess moisture from swimming or daily showering. Symptoms of swimmer's ear include swelling, redness, itching, muffled hearing and/or discharge from the ear. Antibiotic drops are used to treat the condition, and pain can be lessened by applying a warm cloth to the ear or by using a heating pad.




