Board Notes April 2005

The board of directors of Lakes on Eldridge Community Association met on April 18, 2005. The following is a summary of what was discussed.

The Board reviewed the financial statements for the month ended March 31, 2005. The Association had cash balances of \$448,975 in the Operating Fund and \$131,559 in the Replacement Fund. For the three months ended March 31, 2005 the Association had Total Income of \$212,091, Total Expenses of \$217,320 and an Operating Deficit in the amount of \$5,229. The financial statements were accepted. The managing agent was asked to investigate why landscape charges in March were over budget.

On a motion duly made the Board accepted the insurance appraisal from Fisher-Smoucha and instructed the managing agent to have the insurance agent increase coverage from \$1,000,000 to \$2,000,000. The additional premium was \$4,000 annually for the increased coverage.

MUD 341 denied the request for the removal of the no fishing/no swimming/no boating signs around the lakes due to liability concerns.

The managing agent reported on the completion of action items from the March meeting and reported that the mirrors in the outside restrooms were being replaced with superior mirrors at a total cost of \$580. Exterior Options was power washing the breezeway and outside area of the Beach Club in preparation for the swim season.

The managing agent reported there were 261 active service requests and that 77 had been closed and 130 new items opened during the month of March 2005.

Board meetings are generally held on the third Monday of the month at 6:30pm at the Beach Club. It is recommended that homeowners who wish to attend confirm the dates with AMI since they change occasionally. In addition, homeowners are welcome to bring business before the Board but are required to inform AMI of their intension to do so in order to be placed on the agenda.

Do You Have A Multi-colored Awning Or Cover?

Several years ago, the LOE Board decided that only earth-tone colors would be allowed for awnings or other fabric outdoor covers (i.e.; tan, brown or green). Accordingly, no non-compliant awnings were approved anywhere within LOE, and existing violations were expected to be phased out by attrition. There are, however, still some homes that have rainbow or other bright multi-colored ones. The Board discussed this at a recent meeting and decided that a reasonable phase-out period was the best approach. All rainbow or multi-colored awnings or other fabric outdoor covers must be changed to earth-tone colors by the end of 2006. If you have a multi-colored awning or cover, please plan to change it to earth-tone by that time.

Gate Repair Group Report

The Gate Repair Group, which operates under the Crime Awareness Committee, has been in operation for about a year in Lakes on Eldridge. The main objective of the Gate Repair Group is to keep the entrance/exit gates at Eldridge Parkway and the two Tanner Road gates operational as much of the time as possible. A second objective is to minimize the need to call for professional maintenance to keep our gates functioning and thus reduce costs. We reasoned that there should be a number of residents in LOE with the necessary knowledge and skills to make minor repairs on the gates who would be willing to volunteer their time and expertise for this cause. There are currently several residents providing this valuable service to the residents of LOE, helping to improve gate reliability and reducing expensive maintenance call-outs.

There are two types of gates in use in LOE. The "swing" type which is employed

at the entrance from Eldridge Parkway, and the "draw" type which rolls on track and is used at the Eldridge Parkway exit and the two Tanner Road locations. A major maintenance problem with the gates results when careless or impatient motorists hit the gates with their vehicles and damage the mechanism or knock the wheels off the track. Please drive slowly and carefully to avoid damaging the gates or scratching your vehicle. When trucks, RVs or heavy SUVs speed across the tracks, the tracks are subjected to excessive wear and tear with resulting downtime and increased maintenance costs. We hope it will not be necessary to install additional "speed bumps" to control this problem.

High traffic volume during summer rush hours often causes the electric motors to overheat and shut down, resulting in the gates becoming stuck partially open or closed. If you observe this condition, please notify the gate attendant (713-937-8825) or AMI

(713-932-1122). The Gate Repair group will investigate and attempt to make repairs, or if necessary, call for professional maintenance. If you have trouble getting the gates to open using your remote "clicker", check your battery before calling AMI to arrange to reprogram or replace your clicker.

The entrance side of the Tanner Road/ Ginger Ponds gate has recently been upgraded to a new two-motor system. Each of the other gates employ a single ½ hp motor to both open and close the gate. We believe that the two-motor system will provide better service and reliability, especially during afternoon rush hours.

We ask for your continuing cooperation and patience as we continue our efforts to make our community safer through good gate maintenance.



Lampe Berger suffered during WWII. Falliot died in October 1940. His son, Gilbert, succeeded him. To further the company's problems, raw materials became almost unobtainable, and then bombing in

1943 damaged the factory. Following the war, production began gradually since raw materials were still difficult to find. The war resulted in a lower standard of living, therefore production of luxury crystal models were abandoned and the porcelain and earthenware models were created.

By 1973, Lampe Berger was producing 80,000 lamps per year and the company was sold to the retired industrialist, Marcel Auvery. His son Phillippe took over in 1989 and in 1992 he set up the first Lampe Berger subsidiary in New York. In 1998, Lampe Berger began the prestigious signature line of lamps by famous designers. They also began using new materials such as enamel, pewter and opaline.

Over the years, Lampe Berger pieces have become highly sought after and collectible. While new styles are introduced each year others are retired making them much more valuable and

much more difficult to obtain. There is

I contacted the distributor in New York and sought after a product that would bring my customers back to me month after month. After reviewing the Houston market I found that no-one in Houston was carrying these little beauties, I was willing and able to give them a chance when no one else wanted to invest. I did!!! Now after 10 years it's the latest craze. My philosophy about Lampe Berger is: "If they didn't

do what they were designed to do, they would not still be on the market after 100 years."







Need To Post A Sign??

Every now and then you need to get information to the community in a quick manner. You type up your sign and tape it to the gates. It usually rolls or folds back because it is not very secure. Then when

you are done, more than likely, there is tape residue left on the gate. Not a very pretty sight.

So here is a somewhat better solution. There will be black magnetic clips, and small poster board donated at the guardhouse. Type up your sign as usual, drop by the guardhouse, tape your sign to the poster board, and pick up 4 clips for each sign that needs to be posted. Use the clips at each corner of your sign and magnetically adhere to the gates. It's less messy, looks prettier and gives us a uniform style of posting information. When you are finished, please return all clips to the guardhouse.

If you need help typing up a sign, you can contact Michelle at 832-731-0943. If you would like to donate some clips or poster board, drop off at the guardhouse. (clips should be the black magnetic kind)
