OPEN LETTER FROM THE FAIRFIELD SPORT'S CHAIRMAN

As all of you know, we, as a youth sport's organization are struggling with our lack of facilities. Our growth has been phenomenal and the projected growth is just as exciting.

It was made very clear to me (as FSA Chairman) and you (as Homeowners and FSA Participants) at the annual homeowner's association meeting held recently that Friendswood Development has no intention of giving us any additional land to expand our sport's programs. Tim Fitzpatrick (of Friendswood Development) went on to say that we, as a sports association, will have to find alternatives to our growing facilities problems. He stated that we must accept the fact that we are going to have to start playing our games (and practices) outside of Fairfield to accommodate our growth. How he expects us to accomplish this was not apparent at this meeting. What was eye-opening and apparent was that our tremendous and rapid growth is something Mr. Fitzpatrick never truly anticipated.

When my turn came to speak (on behalf of the FSA), I pointed out to all in attendance that we are exhausting all of our alternatives. We play basketball at several school gyms as well as our recreation center and Good Shepherd Methodist Church. In baseball and softball, we play and practice on every available field we can get our kids on. We know the golf center, where we currently conduct the majority of our baseball and soccer practices, will go commercial someday, and Heaven help us when that happens! We ship our 13-14 year old Boy's baseball team to Waller for every one of their games because we need our current baseball fields for the younger age groups. Soccer plays all over Fairfield! I wish we had one centralized Soccer facility that we could call our own. We have seeded a 12-acre site (future elementary school site), but I do not think it will be ready by this fall so Soccer will have to be prepared to play at multiple venues once again. Volleyball will again make due with the Rec Center's gym but will have to vacate once Basketball kicks in!

During the homeowner's meeting, I went on to ask for someone to explain to me — with all the acreage that comprises Fairfield and the fact that we are owned (and controlled) by Exxon, the second largest corporation in the world — why can't we find 20 acres to carve out for Fairfield sports? Give us 20 acres and we will build a sports park that will accommodate virtually all of our sports programs. Give us 20 acres and we will build a sports park that Friendswood can market for years to come throughout Houston, which will inevitably lead to increased home sales!

The rub, of course, is this is not Tim Fitzpatrick's decision to make. Tim has always supported FSA's needs as best he can in his limited role. In fact, he recently stepped up and committed to pay for the irrigation at the 12-acre Soccer site. This is a hugely, generous gesture from Friendswood and will save FSA a tremendous amount of money. Granting FSA 20 acres, or more, within Fairfield is an Exxon decision. Exxon needs to be made aware of the marketing value that a centralized sports complex would bring to our community. Can you imagine the increase in home sales (not to mention retail businesses clamoring for our business) if each homebuilder could point to this amenity as something exclusive to Fairfield? A youth sports facility that no other neighborhood surrounding Fairfield has ... are you listening Exxon?



FALL BASEBALL & SOFTBALL NEWS:

Again this fall, the FSA will be offering an off-season baseball and softball league for those wishing to play in a participatory setting in order to keep their skills honed or ready themselves for next spring in a new age division.

In previous years, due to limited field space and practice space availability, only Boy's AA (7-8 yr) and AAA (9-10 yr) divisions were offered. While the field space is still limited, and the number of sign-ups that can be accommodated, the opportunity provides itself this year to expand our offering to include a Boy's Majors division (11-12 yr), as well as Softball (7-9 yr coach pitch & 10-12 yr kid pitch).

A catch .22 exists with these new divisional offerings that enough kids must sign up in order to field a minimum of (4) teams to create the new divisions. If you sign up and not enough kids register for these divisions, your registration fee will of course be returned and not deposited.

Please monitor the website (www.fairfield-sports.com) during the month of July for the registration day, as there will be a *one-day registration* (typically on a Saturday) the second half of the month. As a general guide for the season, the tryouts and practices will take place in August and the season should start soon after Labor Day and look to end by the close of October (approximately a 10 game schedule over 8 weeks).

Educational Foundation awards more than \$180,000 to CFISD students

Thirty-three graduates of Cypress Fairbanks ISD high schools were awarded \$183,500 in scholarships from the Cypress Fairbanks Educational Foundation at graduation-related ceremonies this May. The Adam Jackson Skinner Memorial scholarship was extra special, as it was awarded to a young man who had been a "We went to elementary school together," said recipient Nikolas Haidamous. "He was a fun-loving kid and always had a smile on his face, said Nikolas. "Adam was a great friend, and I will never forget him.

Adam Skinner would have graduated from Cy-Fair High this year, had he not died in a car accident six years ago. Nikolas recalled being entertained by Adam, citing an elementary school talent show and end-of-year

Nikolas received a \$7,000 scholarship, which will be awarded over a two-year period. "I was overjoyed, really happy and very appreciative," said Nikolas about receiving the scholarship. "It was really awesome.

Nikolas is enrolled at the University of Texas in Austin and plans for a career in the medical field, as a pharmacist or anesthesiologist.

This year the \$100,000 goal was reached in the Cypress-Fairbanks Educational Foundation (CFEF) Adam Jackson Skinner Memorial Scholarship account, which will make it possible to award the scholarship in Adam's name for years to come. Foundation funds are raised from individual and corporate donations, the B.F. Adam golf tournament each May and the Salute to the Stars Gala held each October. Since 1970, when the Cypress-Fairbanks Educational Foundation was established, more than \$2 million in scholarships has been awarded to more than 680 CFISD graduates. 





Harvest Bible Church

Can a person lose his/her salvation? Consider Ephesians 1:13-14... And when you heard the word of truth (the gospel of your salvation), when you believed in Christ, you were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit, 14 who is the down payment of our inheritance, until the redemption of God's own possession to the praise of his glory.

The three members of the Trinity each have a part in man's eternal salvation according to Ephesians 1:3-14: God the Father *chose* some for salvation before the foundation of the world (v. 4); God the Son *redeemed* the Father's chosen ones through his death on the cross (7); and in vv. 13-14 God the Holy Spirit *sealed* them for eternity guaranteeing their future redemption.

Even though God's chosen ones were given salvation at the foundation of the world, they still have to come to faith in Jesus Christ before they are adopted by God as His children. They do this when they place their faith in Jesus for salvation. They do so after hearing God's word preached, and at that moment they are *marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit*. This is a once and for all event that cannot be undone. The word *seal* indicates security (Matt. 27:66), validation (John 6:27), genuineness (John 3:33), and identification of ownership (2 Cor. 1:22; Rev. 7:2; 9:4). God's seal on His chosen ones proves that they can never lose their salvation.

The Holy Spirit's sealing is called "Spirit baptism" – the baptism that the Apostle Paul says is given to all those who believe in Christ (1 Cor. 12:13), and this baptism comes at the moment someone gives their life to Jesus Christ. This sealing is done by the Holy Spirit who is the down payment of our inheritance, until the redemption of God's own possession... In other words, like a sum of money put down on a home as a pledge of commitment to buy that home, God has given those who call upon Jesus Christ for

salvation His Spirit as a down payment guaranteeing that person's eternity in heaven. Now certainly God's guarantee in this passage ought to convince all Christians that their salvation is eternal and unable to be lost.

So can salvation be lost? Certainly not! To teach so is to teach heresy. To believe so is to not understand God's grace and lose out on the peace of knowing God personally. What about those who punt the Christian faith? The Apostle John said that those who depart from the faith never really had true faith in Christ (1 John 2:19). And we all know someone like that.

Do Your 'Homework' Early Before Traveling Abroad

Baylor College of Medicine

HOUSTON – (June 17, 2005) – Headed to a tropical resort or for an exotic safari? Learn about possible health risks before skipping town, say physicians at Baylor College of Medicine (BCM) in Houston.

"There are many differences in terms of health risks based on what part of the world you are visiting, how long you will be gone, and what types of activities you are doing," said Dr. James Kelaher, assistant professor of medicine and director of occupational health at BCM. "Even within a small region, there can be big differences regarding health safety risks between cities and rural areas."

International travelers should consult their primary care physician or a local clinic with a travel center. Kelaher also recommends doing research about health safety in the region of interest.

"There can be outbreaks like polio or malaria in some parts of the world that vary in intensity at different times the year, so you need to get the latest information," Kelaher said.

In addition to reading up on infectious disease, travelers must prepare for injuries they could sustain from motor vehicle accidents and other health and safety hazard risks. Some health services may not be available at hospitals or clinics where they are heading.

Kelaher recommends that the following steps be taken before departing:

- Consult the Center for Disease Control (http://www.cdc.gov/travel), which offers detailed resources that assess varying health risks in different parts of the world.
- Check in advance on visa and admission requirements of the country you plan to visit. Some vaccines and health services may be required for entry.
- Consider getting health insurance for traveling abroad. Many health services overseas are expensive and available on a cash-only basis.
 Also, insurance companies are often limited to reimbursement of out-of-pocket expenses after the fact rather than direct correspondence with foreign hospitals.
- Assemble a "traveler's pack" with medical supplies such as additives that can purify water. While overseas, drink bottled water, and find out how your food is washed and handled.

Above all else, Kelaher recommends that travelers not wait until the last minute to get immunized.


"Some vaccines are hard to find, and others can be a multi-shot series that may take months to be fully immunized," said Kelaher. "As soon as you know where and when you are going, get your vaccine records together and contact your doctor. Good planning helps."

Back pain is one of the most common medical problems in the United States. The cause is often poor posture and body mechanics in the workplace. A supervised program of back protection and exercise may be the key to alleviating and even preventing such problems.





is aggravated by incorrect posture and body mechanics. At the same time, when your posture is good and you move your body correctly, you reduce the strain on your back.

SITTING DOWN ON THE JOB

Sitting is often the greatest cause of back pain. When sitting either in a relaxed position, driving, or while at work, support your lower back. Use a rolled towel, small pillow, or a specially designed seat support, available at medical supply stores. Remove this low back support every half hour for five minutes to give your lower back a change of position. Your head should be positioned so that your ear is in a line with your shoulder and your chin is parallel with the floor.

Avoid leaning to one side when you are sitting, and avoid overstuffed furniture as it does not offer adequate support.

When working at a desk, your chair should be pulled close to the desk. An office chair with short arm rests will allow this. Office chairs should also have adjustable height, back rests and seats. The back rest spring should be adjusted so that the back rest moves with you. A seat that tilts forward is a particularly useful feature.

Use a swivel chair to enable you to work without twisting your back. Place objects such as adding machines and computers as close to you as possible to minimize the amount of twisting and turning you need to do.

When you lean forward at your desk, bend forward at the hips instead of rounding your lower back. This will allow you to keep your back straight and in good alignment.

TALKING ON THE PHONE CAN BE A PAIN IN THE NECK

Holding the phone between your ear and shoulder is a common cause of neck pain. Use a clipboard to hold your papers down so that your hands are free. Special phone adapters also are available.

After sitting for a prolonged period, it is helpful to straighten your back to an upright position and, if possible, stand and walk for awhile.

DON'T FORGET EXERCISE

Appropriate exercise, done regularly, will provide the strength and flexibility in the muscles of your legs and back that you need to help avoid excessive strain and possible injury. Some forms of exercise, such as yoga and tai chi, may help relieve or prevent back pain by increasing flexibility and reducing tension. These exercises should not be done, however, if they are uncomfortable or place a strain on the back. And don't neglect strength training; strong abdominal, back and leg muscles play a vital role in helping you maintain good posture and body mechanics.

Stem cell summit promotes better understanding of research, applications: Genetics Policy Institute to launch global Pro Cures Coalition

Baylor College of Medicine

HOUSTON – (June 10, 2005) – This weekend's stem cell summit at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston aims to advance the national stem cell debate by expanding public awareness and stimulating funding for research.

The Genetics Policy Institute's two-day gathering will feature internationally renowned medical experts that include heart surgery innovator Dr. Michael E. DeBakey, chancellor emeritus of BCM, and stem cell research pioneers Dr. Woo Suk Hwang and Dr. Gerald Schatten. Patients and other advocates of seeking cures through research will also address the conference.

The summit is co-hosted by BCM, the James A. Baker Institute for Public Policy at Rice University and the Texas A&M Health Science Center.

"Many of us in medical science feel that the stem cell issue is one of the most important issues in 21st century medicine and biology in terms of its potential to cure some of the world's worst diseases," said summit co-organizer Dr. William Brinkley, senior vice president of graduate sciences and dean of the Graduate School of Biomedical Science at BCM. "We want to educate the public on the technology used in stem cell research to clarify the fundamental science behind it."

Bernard Siegel, executive director of GPI, said he will announce the launch of the Pro Cures Coalition at the conference.

"Pro Cures is a global initiative that includes patients, scientist and caregivers from around the world who want to advance research for cures," he said. "This conference is the beginning of an effort to unify all those who support this important cause."

Siegel said holding the conference in Houston is significant.

"This summit puts the spotlight on Texas, a state critical to the advancement of stem cell research," he said. "Baylor has always been a leader in advancing medicine, and we are at a point in history that we can see research breakthroughs that can cure diseases of all types."

Sabrina Cohen, co-director of GPI and a quadriplegic since the age of 14, will present a special achievement award to Hwang, who has spearheaded therapeutic cloning efforts in recent months.

"His work is an inspiration for all the victims of spinal cord injuries and offers the promise that one day I may be able to stand up out of this wheelchair," she said.

Kids And Canines: What Every Child Should Know

(NAPSA)-A dog's wagging tail and soft, fluffy ears can be as irresistible as the forbidden cookie jar to a child. But while the family pet is tolerant and patient with your child, other dogs may not be. So it's important to teach your child how to behave safely around all dogs.

"Most of the time dogs and kids make great companions," says canine behavior expert Dr. Mary Burch. "However, sometimes dogs can view a child as 'one of the pack' and play rough, or misinterpret a child's actions as threatening."

The American Kennel Club advises parents to teach their young children how to treat all animals with care and consideration, and how to steer clear of potentially dangerous situations. **What Kids Need To Know:**

- Always ask a dog's owner if you may pet the dog. Some dogs shouldn't be touched. He may be "on duty" as a service dog or he may be ill or afraid of children.
- Approach a dog from the front or side-not from behind. Hold your hands low and speak softly. Do not surprise a dog, force him into a corner, wave your hands or scream at him.



Children should always ask the owner's permission before touching a dog.


- Dogs may get defensive at the food dish. Don't interfere when a dog is eating and never put your hands between a dog's mouth and his bowl.
- Some dogs are very protective of their balls or chew toys. Never take a bone or toy from a dog's mouth unless he's trained to drop it or give it to you.
- Avoid teasing, rough wrestling, or tug-of-war games. Dogs may get too enthusiastic and forget you are not a dog. Fetch, frisbee and agility are better outlets for your dog's energy.

- Respect a dog's space. Dogs naturally defend their territories. Do not stick your hand inside a strange dog's crate or car window.
- Never try to break up a dogfight. Trying to separate fighting dogs may make them more excited, and they might turn on you or accidentally bite you. Call an adult for help.
- Observe canine body language. Beware of a dog that is barking, growling or showing his teeth. Stay away if his ears are back or his hair is standing up on his back. Say "NO" firmly and slowly walk away with your arms by your side. Do not scream, stare into his eyes or run away.






