

What is I.C.E.?

Many paramedics can tell you that when they respond to an accident all too many times the injured person they are attending to carries no information about next of kin or emergency contacts. This makes it very difficult for paramedics because they don't know the patient's medical history or allergies.

A British paramedic came up with the idea of asking cell phone users to input an entry into their cellular phonebook called ICE for "in case of emergency." The ICE campaign was launched in Britain in April, but people really started paying attention after the July terrorist bombings in London that killed 56 and injured hundreds.

It's so simple that everyone can do it. Simply store the word ICE in your cell phone address book, and against it enter the number(s) of the person you would want to be contacted "In Case of Emergency." In an emergency situation ambulance and hospital staff with then be able to quickly look at your cell phone and find out who your first contact should be and be able to contact them. For more than one contact name use: ICE1, ICE2, ICE2, etc.

Do You Have CINCH BUGS?

One of our residents here in Fairfield was kind enough to send in her concerns over the many yards she has witnessed in Fairfield turning brown and sympathizing with those homes because the same has happened to her yard.

Is it CINCH BUGS or some other gnarly little creature causing havoc with our yards? The experts have this to say:

The Southern Chinch Bug (Blissus insularis Barber) is nearly 3/16 of an inch long with a narrow black body and frosty white wings. Immature chinch bugs are red or orange and do not have wings. It takes a chinch bug approximately 6 weeks or longer to develop from egg to adult, depending on temperature. Higher temperatures will shorten this developmental time.

Chinch bugs feed primarily on St. Augustine grasses with bermuda, centipede, and zoysia grasses also in their list of favorites. Chinch bugs damage the grass by sucking sap from the grass near the base of the plant. Signs of damage on the grass are yellowing, wilting, thinning, and slowly expanding affected areas. Chinch bugs feed in large groups, or aggregations. This accounts for the expansion of damage in a radiating area away from the initial infestation. Chinch bugs usually attack grass that is in the sunniest areas of the lawn. They are not usually found feeding on grasses in the shade. One way to test for chinch bugs is to obtain a sturdy can with both ends removed. Push one end of the can into the ground at the edge of an affected area so that there is healthy grass and unhealthy grass inside of the can. Fill the can half full of soapy water. Chinch bugs will float upward in the water. If you see chinch bugs, they can be successfully spot treated with some sort of liquid insecticide that lists chinch bugs on its label. Treatment of the entire lawn is not always necessary because the chinch bugs feed in groups. Be sure the lawn does not contain high amounts of thatch. Excessive thatch can provide perfect conditions for chinch bugs to develop. Under- or over watering can also stress the grass and make it vulnerable to chinch bugs. Water enough to wet the soil to a depth of 6 inches and allow it to dry between waterings. In San Antonio, deep lawn watering once every 7 days should accomplish this.

A few words of caution: there are other conditions in the lawn that resemble chinch bug damage. White grubs will eat the roots of the grass, causing brown areas (if your dead grass rolls up like a carpet, it has been attacked by white grubs). Reflections of sunlight from windows onto the grass can cause brown patches where the grass is burned from overheating. Fungal diseases like Brown Patch and Take-All Patch can also cause similar symptoms. If you cannot find chinch bugs in your unhealthy grass, take a sample to your local nursery or the Extension Office for further examination.

PETS

Now that Fall is upon us and the weather will become pleasant, many of us will be outside more often and taking our pets walking with us. To most of us, our pets are members of our family. Sometimes we forget that our best friend won't snap at us but may snap at an unfamiliar face or another dog. Harris County law and your Governing Documents state that when your pet (dog or cat) is outside the confines of your property, that pet must be leashed and under the direct supervision of a responsible person.

It has been brought to our attention by many residents of Fairfield, that there has been an increase in the amount of dogs (and cats) running loose (being left outside of backyards and homes) and unusually prolonged and noisy barking. Again, some of us forget out pets are strangers to others and just letting them out for a few minutes or longer can lead to dangerous situations for many (especially children) and for your pet itself. As stated above, the Harris County Animal control Ordinance governs all pets within Harris County, which includes the Fairfield Community. Please adhere to these laws as they have been put in place for the safety and well being of everyone in the community (especially the children)

Harris County Animal Control has been notified of this problem and will consider any roaming animal a stray. Your pet could be picked up by Animal Control, taken to the Harris County Animal Control facility and, if your pet is not claimed within three days, it will be destroyed. (To claim a pet from this facility can be expensive and very sad and frustrating). The Harris County Deputies and Constables are also aware of this problem and may, at their discretion, issue citations to owners whose pets are roaming loose in the community or being walked without a leash. Ownership of animals is fairly quickly ascertained by talking with neighbors and the children who play outside.

Also, should your pet need to relieve itself, please be prepared to immediately clean up after your pet.

Congregation Jewish Community North, located at 5400 Fellowship Lane in Spring, has appointed Rabbi Seymour Rossel as its interim Rabbi. Rabbi Rossel joined the congregation on July 1, 2005. He will be available for consultation and special events through the summer and will lead congregational worship services beginning September 2.

In taking up his new duties, Rabbi Rossel stated that "Congregation Jewish Community North deserves a rabbi who possesses insight and warmth—one who can lead the membership as a friend and counselor, meeting the diverse needs of a growing congregation. I am honored to be called to serve as interim Rabbi, while the congregation and its leadership concentrate on finding the kind of spiritual leader who will meet these criteria."

Rabbi Seymour Rossel is best known throughout the Jewish world as the author of more than thirty books, including *Bible Dreams: The Spiritual Quest, A Child's Bible, When a Jew Prays, When a Jew Seeks Wisdom, A Thousand and One Chickens, Managing the Jewish Classroom*, and *A Congregation of Learners*. In addition, he has edited nearly 300 books, having worked with nearly every distinguished Jewish author of our times.

Rabbi Rossel had previously been serving as Director of Pathways Foundation, an advocacy program for Jewish teens and Jewish dreams. Before moving to Houston, he served the American Reform movement on the national scene: as Director of the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ) Press, Director of the URJ Department of Education, Director of the Joint Commission on Reform Jewish Education, and Academic Coordinator of the School of Education of Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, NY. He served as an officer and board member for the Coalition for the Advancement of Jewish Education (CAJE) and the National Association of Temple Educators; and on the board of the Jewish Book Council. Rabbi Rossel is a founding member of CAJE and served as Chair for its two international conferences, CAJE 13 and CAJE 21, both held at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem.

As speaker, author, and editor, Rabbi Rossel is listed in *Who's Who in the Eastern States, Contemporary Authors, The International Authors and Writers Who's Who,* as well as *Who's Who in World Jewry*. He holds the *Bonei HaNegev* award for excellence in Jewish Education and served as an ex-officio member of the Central Conference of American Rabbis. He lectures widely on dreams, Bible, Jewish history, education, and values; and conducts teacher, board, and congregational workshops and retreats in communities throughout North America.

Dr. Norman Weiss, president of the congregation said, "We are pleased that our member families will be able to develop a relationship with Rabbi Seymour Rossel and to continue their educational and spiritual Jewish journey with him as our interim Rabbi."

Congregation Jewish Community North has also named Jodi Buck to be their Director of Education at the synagogue's Jacques C. Shure religious school. Ms. Buck has 20 years of experience in communal and educational environments involving staff supervision and training, as well as planning child-oriented programs and teaching in the classroom. Ms. Buck says, "I look forward to providing the children who attend religious school at CJCN with a positive and productive Jewish learning environment."

Prior to accepting the position at Congregation Jewish Community North she was the Assistant Director of Education, grades 3rd through 7th at Congregation Beth Israel, in Houston, Texas. She has also previously held numerous teaching positions both overseas and locally. She was also associated with the Houston Jewish Community Center as a Children's Program Coordinator. Ms. Buck is a graduate of the University of Texas at Austin, with a Bachelor of Science in Education and has a Texas Teacher Certificate in provisional elementary with a concentration in English.

Harvest Bible Church

Did You Know?... Scripture never contradicts itself, so in light of the fact that Ephesians 1:13-14 guarantees that Christians can never lose their salvation 1 Corinthians 9:27 (as suggested by one reader last month) cannot say otherwise. The full context is as follows: Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may win. And everyone who competes in the games exercises self-control in all things. They then do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. Therefore I run in such a way, as not without aim; I box in such a way, as not beating the air; but I buffet my body and make it my slave, lest possibly, after I have preached to others, I myself should be disqualified (vv. 24-27).

The Olympic games and the Isthmian games were major sports events in the first century. Those involved in the games had to complete a ten-month rigorous training program to compete. Now the races at these games represent the Christian life in 1 Corinthians 9. In the same way that athletes trained rigorously to win the prize, Christians must also train to win their prize, but the prize Christians "win" isn't salvation – it's converts to Christ. He tells the Corinthians, run in such a way that you may win. The believer's race is about overcoming worldly obstacles that hinder our walk and keep us from bringing others to Jesus Christ with our witness. So Christians are constantly to be on the lookout for things that might trip them up. Today the pedophile priests and adulterous pastors are illustrations of those who have lost the prize because their witness has been compromised. They didn't lose their salvation (though they might never have truly had it).


Now the athlete in the passage (v. 25) exercises self-control in all things – things like eating and sleeping habits. They discipline themselves and deny themselves certain pleasures so as *to receive a perishable wreath*. This was a pine wreath, a trophy, that signified their achievement and their victory, but for all the work they put into their prize it was *perishable*.

Now the Christian race is parallel to this. It takes great discipline to steer clear of obstacles that keep us from hindering our witness for Christ. Sexual sins and financial scandals disqualify many Christians from an impeccable witness, but those sins don't keep us from eternal life with Christ. And the prize the Christian receives is "imperishable." This was why Paul ran his race to save the lost in such a way that had an ultimate goal. He "boxed" not as one beating the air but as one fighting a real fight. Because of this he said, "I buffet my body and make it my slave..." Buffet means to "blacken one's eye," so Paul is saying that he would go to great lengths to train his body to be a slave to God's will. For in the same way that an athlete would be disqualified for not meeting the training requirements, Paul did not want to spend his life preaching the requirements to others only to be disqualified for not meeting them himself.

There are many half-hearted, out-of-shape Christians who do almost nothing to prepare themselves to witness to the lost. Most just refuse to read their Bibles to understand the will of God and be able to avoid the many pitfalls that lurk. Consequently, many Christians are disqualified from having a good witness. But to say they lose their salvation is preposterous, for nothing can separate us from the love of Christ!

The sanctuary echoed with hundreds of voices singing, "His love endures forever... His love endures forever... His love endures forever." A deep voice thundered the words from the pew behind me. A well trained soprano harmonized from across the room. The words were hardly audible from the heartfelt whispers of the frail, elderly woman standing beside me. As I listened to the praises of the young, the old, the broken and the joyful, I was overwhelmed by God's faithfulness to mercifully inhabit our unworthy hearts.

There was another sanctuary, thousands of years ago, filled with similar praises from the lips of God's servants. After seven years of diligent and meticulous labor, Solomon's workers completed the construction of the Lord's temple. With joyous expectation, the elders and priests gathered together to give thanks and dedicate the magnificent structure.

The trumpeters and singers joined in unison, as with one voice, to give praise and thanks to the Lord. Accompanied by trumpets, cymbals and other instruments, they raised their voices in praise to the Lord and sang: "He is good; his love endures forever." Then the temple of the Lord was filled with a cloud, and the priests could not perform their service because of the cloud, for the glory of the Lord filled the temple of God. –2 Chronicles 5:13-14 (NIV)

The presence of God descended and His glory filled every crevice of that temple. The instruments were silenced. The praises ceased. The Spirit of the Living God so overwhelmed His servants they were unable

to stand in His presence (vs.14 NASB). What was simply a spectacular building was instantly transformed into a sacred temple.

It is not our worthiness or our praise that woos our heavenly Father to the temples of our hearts. It is His mercy. The Hebrew word translated *love* in 2 Chronicles 5:13 refers to the mercy and kindness God faithfully bestows on His covenant people. As Christians, we come before a holy and righteous God only by the covenant blood of His beloved Son. It is God's mercy that brought His Son to earth. It is His mercy that sustained our Lord on the cross. It is God's mercy that makes a temple worthy of His presence.

Beloved, regardless how common or jaded your past, by the cleansing blood of Jesus Christ and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, you have been mercifully transformed into a sacred temple reflecting the glory of the Lord. Give thanks to the Lord. His *mercy* endures forever.

Take a moment to praise and thank our Lord for his mercy and kindness. He delights to show you mercy! (Micah 7:18)

Kent, Wa. boy lets hair grow 20 months for charity. By Erik Lacitis Seattle Times staff reporter.

After letting his hair grow for 20 months, enduring teasing and being mistaken for a girl, Dominic Bizak, a Kent 11-year-old, several days ago got a haircut in the name of charity. The idea to grow his hair long started when Dominic was in fourth grade. He read a news story about Locks of Love, a nonprofit Lake Worth, Fla., group founded in 1998. The organization provides free wigs to children who, for a variety of medical reasons, have suffered hair loss. Since its beginning, the group has given out 1,400 wigs to kids under the age of 18. The wigs cost about \$1,000 to put together and use 140,000 strands of hair, which is injected into skull caps. The caps fit onto the child's head with a vacuum seal so the wigs stay on even when swimming. Susan Stone, executive director of the group, said she receives between 2,000 and 3,000 ponytails a week from donors, 80 to 90 percent of whom are females. So a donor like Dominic is valued. "I knew I was doing a good deed and helping someone," Dominic said. But he couldn't wait to get a buzz cut — a popular style for boys these days. For the nearly two years it took to grow 12 inches of hair, Dominic put up with teasing, classmates' curiosity and adults' stinging comments. Once, he was playing in a soccer game and the referee addressed the all-male team as, "All you boys and girl," noting Dominic's long hair. When Dominic's family moved from Elma to Kent because of his dad's work with computers, he spent the last six weeks of fourth grade at a new school. When you look different, at that age you're an easy target. "I'd get harassed, get called 'girlie boy;' I was easy prey, easy kill. I got threatened to get hit," he said. Dominic's mom, Sheryl Small, remembered how her son frequently was mistaken for a girl. "Just last month, camping with the Boy Scouts, others tried to stop him from entering the boy's bathroom," she said. "He just grits his teeth, says, 'I'm a boy,' and goes on." Dominic Bizak got a buzz cut after letting his hair grow for nearly two years. At one point, Dominic thought about getting his hair cut and forgetting about his mission. "My mom helped me get through it," he said. Small said she told her son he was doing a good thing by helping other kids. Jonnica Royal, 6, of Seattle, is one

of the children helped by the organization. Her mother, Toni Royal, said her daughter has a hereditary skin disorder in which one of the symptoms is never getting beyond baby hair. Jonnica, she said, wears the wig "on special occasions, like to parties or to church." Small said all of Dominic's life, "people have told him "what pretty hair he has, nice and thick, with a bit of wave. He decided someone else needed it more than he did. "I'm very proud of him," she said.

What an amazing story of personal sacrifice to make someone's life better. This young man truly is a living example for all of us to consider how wonderful it is when we reach out to bless others. That is exactly why Jesus came to earth. He knew His personal sacrifice for our sins was what we needed so desperately. Do you know Him today as your savior? He is waiting to bless your life in amazing ways.
