
SENIOR CITIZENS GROUP



SIGNS

Keep Steeplechase Beautiful!

Did you know that signs are not permitted in our community? Our deed restrictions are very clear about signage. The only signs allowed within the community are approved Association Community Signs and one realtor sign during the sale of a home (specific dimensions are listed in deed restrictions).

Many concerns have been raised by residents about signs in the middle of plant beds, esplanades, parks, taped on traffic signs etc. Unattractive signs have been placed in the middle of new flowers planted at our entry sign at Jones Road. Making matters even worse, folks and businesses who leave them there.

Unapproved signs are usually removed by our landscapers, the county or homeowners.

If businesses are using bandit signs in our neighborhood, please call them and ask them not to solicit in our community or post signs. You can also invite them to advertise in our community newsletter.
