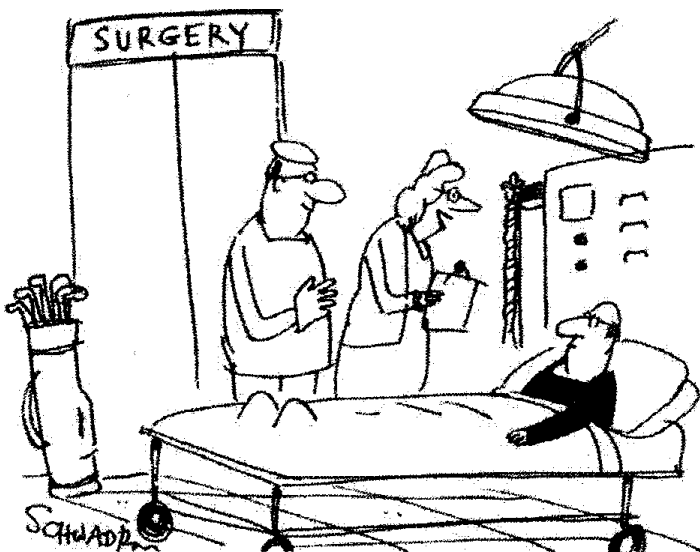
Recipe of the Month

Mix into wet mixture slowly with a mixer. Beat well for at least 5 minutes. Grease & flour a Bundt cake pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour 15 minutes. Check after 1 hour. Enjoy!

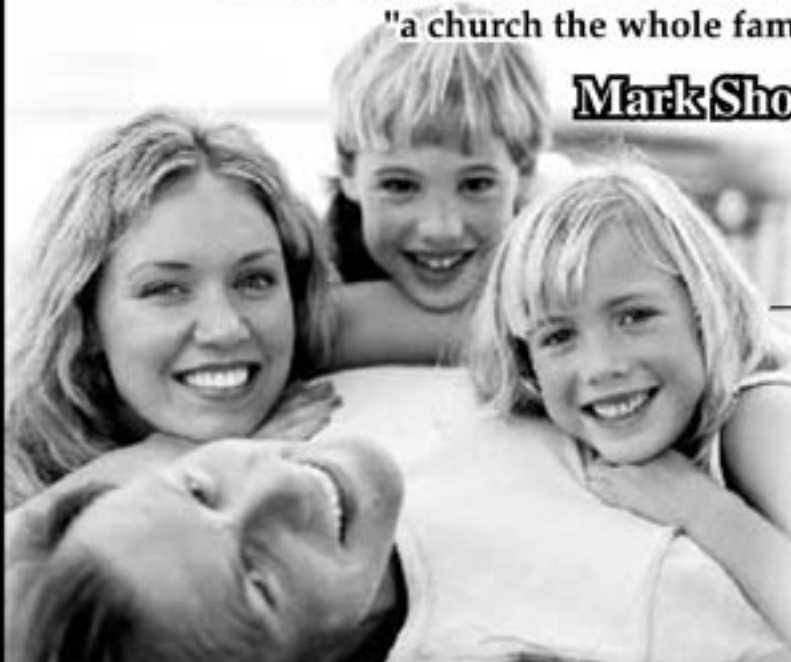
