## Holiday Tips

### Tip: How to Care for Live Christmas Trees

Here's a simple tip. When you buy a cut Christmas tree for your Christmas celebrations, you need to check it for firmness. Gently grab a handful of needles and see if any fall off. If they do, then you need to water the tree. Cut off an inch or so from the bottom and make sure that the tree is suspended in a suitable container of water. Also, when the season is over, take it to a recycling center, cut it up for firewood, or find another way to dispose of it properly.

### Tip: Shopping for an Artificial Pre-Lit Christmas Tree

Here are a few tips when considering your tree:

Number of lights

Number of tips

Pole and branch system—the weight of the branches is distributed to the strongest part of the tree, the support pole.

Pole- the interior pole locking system is designed for superior stability increasing the ease of storage and installation.

Foliage- lifelike foliage, made of fake and crush resistant PVC needles, the dense foliage appears fresh cut.

Safety- the tree should be made from flame retardant materials

### Tip: Keep Wrap from Unrolling

To keep wrap from unrolling and getting crumpled, save empty toilet paper or paper towel rolls. Cut it open with scissors and slide this around the tube of wrapping paper. The paper won't unroll anymore and you just slide the cardboard toilet paper cuff off when it is time to use the wrapping paper.

### Tip: What to do with the "broken ornaments"

Tree ornaments that are missing hooks or caps can be put together in a glass bowl and used for a center piece.

### Tip: How to store little ornaments

Use egg cartons to store your small ornaments safely.

### Tip: Gourmet Coffee

Make your own gourmet coffee by adding a few drops of almond, mint, chocolate, cinnamon, or other tasty flavoring to the coffee grounds.

## Christmas Facts

**Mistletoe** - Mistletoe has long been a symbol of love, peace and goodwill. In the ancient Druid society, warring clans would stop their battles and claim a temporary truce when they would chance upon mistletoe. It may be that this embrace of goodwill among enemies may have eventually led to the traditional kiss under the mistletoe. Some cultures say that if a man kisses a woman while she is standing under mistletoe, it is a proposal of marriage! Most cultures around the world however, now just view a person standing under mistletoe as being available for a kiss!

**Christmas Carols** - Christmas caroling began as an old English custom called Wassailing, toasting neighbors to a long and healthy life.

**Yule Log** - During the ancient 12-day Christmas celebration, the log burned was called the "Yule log." Sometimes a piece of the Yule log would be kept to kindle the fire the following winter, to ensure that the good luck carried on from year to year. The Yule log custom was handed down from the Druids.

**Yuletide** - Yuletide-named towns in the United States include Santa Claus, located in Arizona and Indiana, Noel in Missouri, and Christmas in both Arizona and Florida.

**Christmas Stocking** - The Dutch introduced the Christmas Stocking to America. During the 16th Century children in Holland would leave their clogs by the hearth. They would fill them with straw for the reindeer

or "donkey" as the reindeer were called. A treat for Santa was left in the house near the warm fire. In return "Sinterclass" would leave the children treats. Later the clogs would become stockings and the Saint known to all as Santa Claus.

**Christmas Cards** - In 1843, the first Christmas card was printed in England for Sir Henry Cole. He was busy man who wanted to save time on his own Christmas letters, but was also interested in encouraging the expansion of the postal system. 1000 copies of the card were sold at one shilling each. It was not until the 1860s that the production of cards accelerated, with cheaper printing methods. Then in 1870, the Post Office introduced a half penny stamp for sending cards.

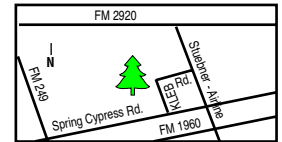
