

Neighborhood Recreational Facilities Corner

I hope to make this a monthly or quarterly article to provide the residents an update of what is going on with the recreational facilities we have in Wortham Villages. These facilities include the pool, clubhouse, tennis courts and playground areas. We are planning several things to be accomplished over the fall/winter/spring months in the facilities.

The pool area items include repainting of the pool area fences, including the gates at the pool entrance and for the equipment areas and the window bars and light pole within pool area. This work should happen early next year and is included in the budget for 2006.

The clubhouse will be undergoing major interior renovations as we update the interiors. These renovations will include new flooring, countertops, paint, making the restroom ADA compliant, ceiling fans and new lighting. This work will be done in January of 2006 and should last no more than 30 days. The clubhouse will not be available during that time, so please make arrangements for your meeting or functions during that time to

happen at another location temporarily. We will be obtaining bids from contractor before year-end and once we have a definite schedule for the construction work, we will inform the residents. We think you will be pleased with the results of this work. This work is also included in the budget for 2006. Furniture for the clubhouse will be addressed in the future.

The tennis courts will be receiving a facelift as well with a new court surface topping, painting of the practice boards and light poles. new nets and miscellaneous equipment. This work is ongoing and should be completed following the end of the current tennis team season into early next year. Part of this work is being completed under the 2005 budget and the rest under the 2006 budget. We are please with the heavy use of the tennis courts by the tennis teams and residents. In an effort to insure usage of the courts by our residents we are going to be implementing some changes. We will be handing out new tennis court keys sometime early next year. One key will be allowed per household and we will set up a time at the clubhouse for people to turn in their current key and/or pick up a new key much like we do for our pool tags distribution. Each household's key status will be documented and the fee for a replacement key will be established. Additionally, the Board of Directors has determined that a tennis team usage policy should be established. This policy is that for a tennis team to use the tennis courts, the make up of the team must include at least 75% Wortham Villages' residents.

Finally, we are looking for new members of the Recreational Facilities committee (formerly pool committee) to help us as we continue to look at ways we can effectively maintain and upgrade our facilities. Randall Reinhart has worked hard over the last several years heading up this committee and is stepping down. We need others in the neighborhood to step up to help. 


