Fairfield Residents,

Most people believe that the exterior appearance of a home speaks volumes about the people who live in it. When you see a well maintained and attractive home there is an automatic assumption that the interior is also well maintained and attractive. Failure to maintain a home properly affects its value and the overall value of homes in the neighborhood.

As a part of our contractual agreement with the Association, AMI visits the community monthly noting deed restriction violations. Deed restriction violations are noted by property address and records maintained via AMI's service request system. On each visit, the AMI representative has a copy of the most recent report. Previous violations are reviewed and either noted as having been brought into compliance or a second letter is issued. Should a third letter be required, it is generally a demand letter. If the property remains in violation following the third letter, the Board of Directors then makes the decision as to whether the violation is turned over to an attorney for legal pursuit or, in some cases, a certificate of non-compliance is filed of record, except for lawn maintenance matters (see below). If a certificate of non-compliance is filed, it means that when the homeowner goes to sell or refinance their home, the title company will require the violation to be brought into compliance before issuing a clear title on the property.

No one likes to receive a letter from the Association noting a violation. Should you receive a letter; you may want to first look at

the date of the letter. Perhaps the AMI representative was in the community the day before you mowed your lawn or returned your boat to storage. In that case, simply dispose of the letter. The remedy of the violation will be noted on the next community visit. If the violation noted is still in place, please contact AMI with any questions you may have regarding the noted violation.

One of the most frequent violations noted in Fairfield Village is yard maintenance. It is also the source of the most complaints received from homeowners. Regular mowing, edging and weeding of beds, mulching, fertilization and watering is critical in providing curb appeal for your home and in promoting a community that all homeowners are proud to live in. Your Governing Documents permit your Association to enter upon your property to perform the necessary lawn maintenance, if the homeowner is neglectful. In addition, when you purchased your home, you agreed to properly maintain your property by agreeing to the deed restrictions that run with your property.

Don't particularly enjoy yard work? There are a number of companies available who will provide that service at a nominal price. Don't know how to maintain your yard? Sometimes neighbors helping neighbors can resolve the problem. Get creative!

Fairfield Village is a beautiful, young community. But remember, being a good neighbor is more than just maintaining a house and lawn. Respect for all community rules, residents and community assets are what make Fairfield Village a great community in which to live.



Speeding In Fairfield And Parking On The Street

Most homeowners have some space in their garage reserved for storage – in some cases most of the garage, thereby not leaving enough room for their vehicles. Consequently, many owners park their vehicles on the street making it difficult for others to pass and creating hazardous conditions for the neighborhood children.

Letter to the Community,

It's hard to believe that it is 2006. It seems just like yesterday we were all preparing for Y2K meltdowns! As we prepare for another full year of sports for our kids, the Fairfield Sports Association would like to point out some recent capital improvements (some completed ... some underway ... some still to come) that will continue to insure our kids will be able to practice and play on some of the best facilities in the area. Some of the improvements that you are sure to notice are:

BASKETBALL: The gym floor at the Rec Center has been refurbished. It was stripped and refinished over the Holidays. New lines were painted (for basketball and volleyball) and these improvements should last a couple of years before we have to do it again. We are looking into various sound proofing materials to possibly help with noise reduction, and if we can find something at a reasonable cost, we may try to install it over the summer in advance of the 06/07 seasons.

VOLLEYBALL: New standards and nets have been ordered and should be in prior to the start of the spring season. If properly stored, assembled and care for, this equipment should last our volleyball program for years to come. FYI: Below is the schedule for the upcoming 2006 spring season:

2006 Spring Volleyball Season

Age Divisions 7 year olds -2^{nd} graders (Instructional League) 8-9 year olds -3^{rd} & 4th graders 10-11 year olds -5^{th} & 6th graders 12-13 year olds -7^{th} & 8th graders 14 & up -9^{th} -12th graders (Please note: The 14 & up league must have enough participants to form at least four (4) teams. The 7 year old division will be an Instructional League)

Registration Dates: January 7 / January 14 / January 21 11:00 am – 3:00 pm at Lakeside Trails Clubhouse

> Coaches Meeting: February 16th Tryouts: February 18th Practices Start: February 20th Games: March 18th – May 20th

The spring program will include two tournaments in which fees are included with registration. Due to court space limitations, the league can only accept the first 240 girls registered. Volunteer coaches and assistant coaches will be needed in all age divisions. Coaching clinics are provided. Shirts and Shorts will be provided. Participants must provide own knee pads.

BASEBALL: A fourth baseball field is under construction. This field

will serve our AA and below divisions as this is where the real growth of the program is coming from. The grass may not be as plush on it in this, our inaugural season, but within a year it will be as nice as anything else we currently have.

SOCCER: There is good news on the horizon for soccer. Unfortunately, short term, we will be suspending our spring soccer season in Fairfield due to lack of field space. All soccer coaches from the fall season were e-mailed a notice regarding playing soccer in the Cy-Fair Sports Association for the spring. Hopefully, these details were forwarded to all parties interested in playing this spring. The good news? We have a new 10-acre site being made available to us by Friendswood/Lennar in June that we have earmarked for multiple soccer fields. We also are working on another 10-acre site that could also be available for our use by June/July that also will be designated for soccer only. We cannot promise this additional 10 acres, but we are confident that it will happen.

FSA PRACTICE CENTER: Formerly the Golf Center – this acreage will now be referred to as the **FSA Practice Center** as it will never be a golf driving range again. We are in the process of leveling this piece of property with the idea of creating additional practice space for baseball/ softball in the spring and for soccer in the fall. A special thank you needs to go out to Ken Payne and Mustang Cat for providing the equipment and to Jerry Wizig and Pace Services for providing the labor.

ELECTRICAL WARNING SYSTEMS: We will be installing two electrical warning systems – at the ball fields and at the practice center. These systems will sound an alarm when atmospheric conditions are such that an electrical strike could happen. All coaches and umpires/referees will be instructed that in the event the warning system sounds, all activities on the fields (and in the batting cages) must cease immediately. We hope to have these systems installed and functioning by February 1, 2006.

SKYHAWKS: There will be summer camps (all sports) conducted through the Skyhawks organization. We were contemplating severing our relationship with this group, but a new regional director has convinced us to give it one more year. All the camps will take place in Fairfield and details will be forthcoming over the next few months.

Please get involved in some capacity or another with our organization. Everything we do we try to do in the best interest of our kids. Your participation and involvement is essential as we continue to grow.



Harvest Bible Church

Acts 15:5-18... Some believers who belonged to the party of the Pharisees rose up and said, "It is necessary to circumcise them and to order them to keep the law of Moses." ⁶ The apostles and the elders were gathered together to consider this matter. ⁷ And after there had been much debate, Peter stood up and said to them, "Brothers, you know that in the early days God made a choice among you, that by my mouth the Gentiles should hear the word of the gospel and believe. ⁸ And God, who knows the heart, bore witness to them, by giving them the Holy Spirit just as he did to us, ⁹ and he made no distinction between us and them, having cleansed their hearts by faith. ¹⁰ Now, therefore, why are you putting God to the test by placing a yoke on the neck of the disciples that neither our fathers nor we have been able to bear? ¹¹ But we believe that we will be saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus, just as they will."

In the first century, just like the modern day, there were some who stood up to proclaim their belief that circumcision was necessary for Gentiles (all non-Jews) to be saved. They apparently did not understand grace and were requiring Gentiles to become Jewish (through circumcision) in order to be truly saved by Jesus Christ.

These legalists, called Pharisees, had a history of forcing the Jews to obey the letter of the Mosaic Law while they themselves missed the spirit of that Law. Therefore it isn't surprising to find them foisting their legalism upon the Gentile church. This apparently growing belief among Jewish converts led to the first church council which met to discuss this problem.

The gathering together of the church leaders that day was intense. One side was pushing for works in addition to God's grace for obtaining true salvation while the other was about salvation by God's grace alone through faith in Christ alone – the same debate that exists between denominations today.

The Apostle Peter stood up in the midst of the debate and humbly asserted his own influence and spiritual calling among the brothers. He reminded the gathering that day that he had been appointed to preach to the Gentiles and bring them to belief in Christ. This he had done, and he witnessed, along with other Jews, the phenomenon of Gentiles receiving the Holy Spirit and afterward speaking in tongues (Acts 10:44-48) as a result of their conversion to Christ for salvation. And at no time did these Spirit-indwelt Gentiles become circumcised! Peter reminded them that God had made no distinction between Jews and Gentiles, giving both groups the Holy Spirit and making them one.

So Peter's question in v. 10 solved the issue. Why would the Jews tell the Gentiles that they also had to keep the Mosaic Law in order to be saved – a burden that no Jew from Moses to John the Baptist was able to keep? This made no sense, and Peter told them that in doing so they were putting God to the test – they were slandering God's gift of salvation by grace alone.

Peter summarized the Christian faith in Acts 15:11: "we" (Jews) are saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus in the same way "they" (Gentiles) also are. Peter himself taught that God's grace alone saves a man apart from works. Today, some still claim that God gives grace but only to those who work for it by abstaining from certain food, drink, and activities. Don't believe it! Good works follow salvation; *they don't merit it.* Faith is the root of salvation; works are the fruit (Ephesians 2:8-10).

The Door of Hope

Over the Thanksgiving holidays, my family was blessed to join a group of people from Fairfield Baptist Church on a mission trip to Acuna, Mexico. Our visit included a Bible study and landscaping work at a home for unwed pregnant girls. The name of the home is *Puerta de Esperanza*, which means "Door of Hope". The meagerly furnished stucco home has been a place of refuge for many young girls in Acuna who were lured into prostitution or a sexual relationship by the neglect of their families or by the hopelessness of their circumstances. Pregnant and rejected, the girls (between the ages of twelve and sixteen) are left to fend for themselves.

Perhaps you've never been pregnant, alone, and penniless. Maybe you've never felt the sting of a family's rejection. However, most of us can relate with making mistakes or choosing paths that shroud us in shame or limit our options. Regardless how far away we stray, our heavenly Father relentlessly and passionately pursues a relationship with us.

In the parable of the prodigal son, Jesus told of a young boy who rejected his father and squandered his inheritance on wild parties and self indulgence. When the money was exhausted, the humiliated, hungry young man returned home hoping he would be accepted as a hired servant. Yet as soon as the young man's silhouette appeared on the horizon, his father ran toward him, threw his arms around him, and kissed him. The wayward child was welcomed back, not as a servant, but as a son (Luke 15:11-32).

The girls we met in Acuna had wandered away from their faith and from their God. Like the prodigal son, the valley these girls stumbled into during their seasons of rebellion brought them heartache and trouble. Interestingly, throughout history God's people have often allowed their hearts to wander far from Him. But look at what the Lord said He would do for Israel when the nation had turned away and forgotten Him:

So I am going to attract her; I will lead her into the desert and speak tenderly to her. There I will give her back her vineyards, and I will make the Valley of Trouble a door of hope. (Hosea 2:14-15b NCV)

Regardless the circumstances that bring the girls to Puerta de Esperanza, God takes what appears to be inescapable trouble and transforms it into a gateway to a better life. The girls are given the opportunity to complete their educations, they are taught to care for their children, and are given job training. Inside *The Door of Hope*, the girls find safety, support, and most importantly they find salvation through Jesus Christ.

Seasons of rebellion often land us in the "Valley of Trouble." But God can use our greatest mistakes to woo us to a place where He tenderly convicts us, gently cleanses us, and lovingly restores us. Our God can transform even the deepest Valley of Trouble into a Door of Hope.

How To Choose The Right Personal Trainer

Certification is the first thing to look for

A personal trainer should be certified because that's your assurance you're working with a trainer who has the knowledge to provide you with a safe and effective workout. Not just any certification will do. You want a personal trainer who has been certified by a nationally recognized certifying organization, like ACE, which happens to be the largest non-profit fitness-certifying organization in the world.

Certification is more than a piece of paper. For example, to qualify for ACE certification, a personal trainer has to pass an intensive three hour, 150-question exam and written simulation that covers exercise science and programming knowledge, including anatomy, kinesiology, health screening, basic nutrition and instructional methods.

After checking certification, there are a few other things you should take into consideration when hiring a personal trainer. Many require asking direct questions.

A checklist to help you hire the right personal trainer:

· Ask for references

Ask the trainer for the names and phone numbers of other clients with goals similar to yours. Call to see if they were pleased with their workouts, if the trainer was punctual and prepared, and if they felt their individual needs were addressed. The best personal trainer to hire is the one others give high marks to.

• Make sure the trainer has liability insurance and provides business policies in writing Many personal trainers operate as independent contractors and are not employees of a fitness



facility. You should find out if the trainer you want to hire carries professional liability insurance.

- A reputable personal trainer should also make sure you understand the cancellation policy and billing procedure. The best way to avoid confusion and to protect your rights is to have those policies in writing.
- Look for a trainer who is able to assist you with your special needs

A personal trainer should always have you fill out a health history questionnaire to determine your needs or limitations. If you have a medical condition or a past injury, a personal trainer should design a session that takes these into account. If you're under a doctor's care, a personal trainer should discuss any exercise concerns with your doctor, and should ask for a health screening or release from your doctor.

- Find out what the trainer charges Rates vary, depending on the trainer's experience, and the length and location of the workout session. For example, a personal trainer who works in a fitness club will probably charge less per hour than one who works independently and needs to come to your home or office.
- Decide if this is someone you can work with Some people like to exercise in the morning, some in the evening. Will the personal trainer you're talking to accommodate your schedule? What about the trainer's gender? Some people do better working with a trainer of the same sex; others prefer the opposite sex.

The personal trainer you select should motivate you by positive, not negative, reinforcement. Even more important, that trainer should be someone you like.

Ask yourself if you think you could get along well with the trainer. Ask yourself, too, if you think the trainer is genuinely interested in helping you.

The personal trainer who best measures up is the one to hire. Because that's the professional who will help you get the best results.
