Community

Community: "a: a unified body of individuals: b: people with common interests living in a particular area; c: joint ownership or participation" —Webster Online Dictionary

We, in Winchester Country are supposed to be members of a Community. But, as defined above, I question how long it has been since there has been much evidence of any 'unified participation'. Yes, we are a group of individuals living in a common location holding joint ownership in property and amenities, but we do not jointly participate in the caring and maintenance of our area. Some specific areas of concern are:

Deed Restriction Compliance - Some residents complain about the condition of particular homes in the area because of their owner's disregard to maintenance and general appearance. The Board of Directors does everything they are empowered to do by law to get homeowners to rectify the problems. Some homeowners continue to disregard Deed Restrictions which they had agreed to as part of buying or renting a home here.

Community events and Volunteerism - This amenity is something that is requested, but for a long time participation has consisted primarily of the coordinating Board members and one or two residents, if we are lucky. Planning and preparing for events requires a time commitment from those volunteering. When events are planned for the community and the community doesn't participate, you can only conclude that homeowners aren't truly interested in community events. Some areas where residents can step up to participate are as simple as helping with flower selections for our neighborhood entrances, serving popcorn and cookies for seasonal events, or volunteering to coordinate volunteers for an event.

Communication - We have requested that residents contribute articles to be published in The Repeater. It is a rare event that anyone does this, so the publisher must use general area filler articles. If you want our newsletter to reflect more specific information pertinent (Continued on page 3)

to our community, then contribute to this publication. There have been complaints about the mailing of and timely receipt of the newsletter. We as a community do not pay for our newsletter. It is paid for by local area advertising. Therefore, we cannot dictate when the publisher should mail it each month. When there are community events scheduled, we can only request that the publisher mail in time to reach residents prior to the event, but this does not always occur. There are other methods of communicating that also publicize events. Event information is listed on our website, it is posted on the reader boards located at the West Road entrances and the newsletter itself is available online prior to the monthly mass mailing. Upcoming events are usually listed over a two month period of time. Even with all this, some still say that they are not informed.

Current concerns of community interest - We are experiencing an increased level of vandalism that stem from a small sector of our youth and others. We are actively looking at what can be done in the short term and long term as well. We have instructed our patrolling deputies to enforce zero tolerance of any type of vandalism. To share with you some of the occurrences we have been experiencing recently:

Tearing up of playground equipment and picnic tables, Pulling up and stealing play area retaining walls, Pulling out security lock wiring at the tennis court gate, Ripping out the water fountain, Ripping out of the ground Handicap Parking and No Skateboarding signs, Breaking

our new tennis court brooms, squeegees, trashcans, Christmas lights being broken - this was observed on one occasion of someone riding a bicycle down the sidewalk and kicking the lights, Allowing pets to relieve themselves in the parks and people's yards and not cleaning up after them, Leaving trash in playground area and inside the tennis courts, Tearing off playground gate, Graffiti from the expressions of love for someone to the expressions of hate for others

The Board of Directors is concerned with eliminating these types of occurrences. We would also like to see more individual involvement in maintaining the common areas of our community. If you are using the common areas, please insure that you take care of the items that you brought with you. In the event that you see where others have disregarded this, please make the effort to throw away that can or bottle. Continue to report any items in need of repair or attention. If you see someone misusing one of our common areas, report it to the appropriate authority and don't just look away. Our children learn community involvement and responsibility from our example. Talk to your kids. If they respect our community, then they may influence their peers to respect it as well.

We can all be a part of a solution that will make Winchester Country reflect the true definition of 'Community'.

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A Better Sense of Taste and Smell

When you taste something, you perceive its aroma, taste, texture, temperature, and spiciness. However, nearly 75% of the overall flavor actually comes through your sense of smell. How do these senses work together, and what can you do if problems arise?


Sense of taste

Most people can recite 4 basic tastes: sweet, salty, sour, and bitter. Scientists are also debating whether to add 2 other taste "chemicals" to the list:

Umami (oo-MAH-mee): Identified by Dr. Kikunae Ikeda

in 1908, umami is the savory, hard-to-define taste for amino acids. Umami adds a denser flavor to foods as diverse as tomatoes, cheese, mushrooms, fish, seafood, cured meat, miso, and chicken soup.

Fat: The November 2005 Journal for Clinical Investigation reported that a protein called CD36 or fatty acid transporter (FAT) can be detected in taste buds. A heightened



Thousands of taste buds are located on and around the tiny bumps on your tongue and throughout your mouth. Taste buds trigger the release of saliva and several digestive juices that analyze and categorize the food chemicals. Taste buds also help you determine how good something tastes, how good it makes you feel, and how full you feel.

Sense of smell

Your amazing sense of smell can recognize as many as 10,000 different scents. Also, your sense of smell can influence your moods and hormones, emotions and memories, choice of mates, and immune system. For example, "the smell of fear" is no exaggeration!

The roof of each of your nostrils contains the olfactory receptors, tissues, and nerves that process the smells that you breathe into your nose. Nerve endings in the linings of your nose and mouth also transmit a warning message about hazardous tastes and smells (such as poison, smoke, gas, or ammonia).

Winning the Nobel Prize for Medicine in 2004, Professor Richard Axel of Columbia University and Professor Linda Buck of Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center in Seattle, together discovered the gene family that controls the receptors in the upper nose. These gene cells send highly specialized signals that form the patterns that you can recognize as a distinct scent or odor.

Potential problems

Your ability to taste and smell may change due to:

- Aging (approximately 50% of people who are 65 years or older experience decreasing abilities to smell)
- Allergies
- Environmental factors, such as chemicals and dust
- Illness, such as colds, flu, hypertension, or diabetes
- Medications, such as antibiotics or antidepressants
- Metal from braces and dentures, lip and tongue piercings
- Periodontal disease or oral lesions
- Polyps in the nose or sinuses
- Smoking

Recommendations

To help restore your sense of taste and smell, we may recommend:

- Using a tongue brush or scraper
- Drinking plenty of liquids to keep your body hydrated and your mouth rinsed
- Opening up your sinuses with a saline solution or hot shower
- Experimenting with herbs and spices instead of adding salt to foods
- Combining different textures (smooth yogurt, crunchy nuts), temperatures (chilled salads, grilled fish), and spices (hot and sour soup) as part of the entire meal
- Slowing down when you eat or drink to savor all of the senses involved with each food's taste, texture, color, and smell
- Exercising as you are able (working up a sweat may help open up your sinuses)
- Not smoking or piercing your lip or tongue
- For serious complications of the mouth or nose, we may also recommend that you consult your physician.

Please Help!! With Our Neighborhood Easements

In an effort to maintain our neighborhood and avoid issues with cleanliness and fire hazards, Winchester Country elected last year to begin mowing the pipeline easements on a regular basis. By keeping the grass and weeds at a reasonable level we hope to avoid pests and the accumulation of discarded items such as cut grass, shrubbery clippings, tree limbs and garbage. We would like to ask the residents who live along these easements to help us with this project. Please do not discard any items into the easements. These obstacles make it impossible for the landscape service to cut the grass evenly and regular. If you have discarded such items in these easements please help out by removing them. Please do not park trailers in the easements. This also makes it impractical to mow these areas. In the future the landscape service will begin to remove the debris that remain in these easements. When and if this happens the neighborhood will be billed an additional fee for this service. This additional fee "Will" be passed on to the homeowner. We again are asking that you help us out by doing your part. Help us to avoid any additional costs and help us to keep our neighborhood clean and neat. - · Plastic shampoo bottles, etc., must have the recycle symbol on the bottom of the plastic bottles


Please note: Sorry, they will not pick up glass.

- Replace garage doors.
- 10. Add a room addition.
- 11. Add a pool.
- 12. Add a deck.
- 13. Add a basketball goal.
- 14. Add solar/screen windows of doors.
- 15. Replace your mailbox.
- 16. Add burglar bars.
- 17. Add landscaping.
- 18. Add sidewalks.
- 19. Add exterior lighting.




