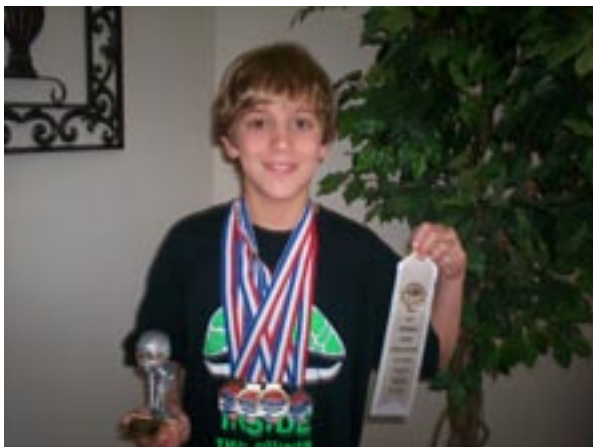

Happy Spring, Ya'll

With the weather we have been having it is great to be outdoors! Many of you will be repainting, landscaping, or doing general improvements and updates to the interior and exterior of our homes. Living in Houston, mildew removal from siding or brick needs to be a part of this annual or semi-annual clean-up. Left untreated, mildew can result in costly damages to the structural integrity of a home.

WHAT TO DO?

- Frequently inspect the exterior of your home.
- Keep exterior walls clean by spraying them down regularly to remove dirt or grime.
- When mildew first appears, spray the affected area(s) with a quality mildicide. (Your contractor or a hardware

or do-it-yourself store like Lowe's or Home Depot can advise you on the types and applications available.)

- When deciding to paint, be sure to use a high quality exterior paint that includes mildicide and that the surface is properly prepared. (Your contractor or paint store can assist you in this area) Of course if painting apply for approval of the paint color. www.FairfieldVillage.org has the application on the website for your convenience.

There's not that much to it! It's simple maintenance we must all perform to protect our homes and maintain the aesthetic quality desired for our community. Don't forget to screen those trash containers! It's an ongoing problem that detracts from the overall appearance and quality of the community....leads to the expense of deed restriction letters to those who forget to screen.

Remember, being a good neighbor is more than just maintaining a house and lawn. Respect for all community residents is what helps to build a community!

Harvest Bible Church

Mark 15:33-37... *At the sixth hour came, darkness covered the land until the ninth hour. In the ninth hour Jesus cried out, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" ...37 Then Jesus cried out with a loud voice and breathed his last.*

The "sixth hour" in Mark 15:33 was noon because the Jewish day began at sunrise (6:00 a.m.). So the third hour was 9:00 a.m. (Mark 15:25) when Jesus was taken from Pilate's palace to be crucified. John 19:14, however, says that Jesus was sentenced by Pilate at "the sixth hour." But John was using Roman time, writing much later than Mark, at the close of the century when Jewish time reckoning was no longer in vogue. So John's "sixth hour" (6:00 a.m.) fits with Mark's – early in the morning. Jesus was likely delivered to Pilate circa 5:00 a.m., and at 6:00 he sentenced him to crucifixion which commenced at 9:00 a.m.

Just prior to his death Jesus cried out, "*My God, why have you forsaken me?*" The reason Jesus felt abandoned by God is given in the prophet Habakkuk's words: "Your eyes are too pure to approve evil, and You cannot look upon iniquity with favor" (1:13). So Jesus' cry reveals that he indeed *became sin* as he stood in man's place that day. God forsook His Son because of the sin he bore, and for a moment in time the members of the Trinity were separated! Now Jesus didn't cease to be God in that painful moment, but he did cease to have fellowship with the Father. This is the only time where Jesus addressed God as anything but *Father*. Truly Jesus became sin on man's behalf and took man's curse – the sin which God abhors in His creation.

Now God should not be viewed, as He sometimes is portrayed, as some decrepit holy man who can't look evil in the face. That would make evil

more powerful than Him. On the contrary, He looks at evil every day when He sees us! God the Father forsook Jesus at the cross because He couldn't look at sin in *His own Son*. Jesus was carrying the wretchedness of all mankind, so God forsook him until His justice was satisfied. God doesn't have His back turned to His children today simply because His wrath was satisfied fully at the cross of Jesus.

The Gospel of John (19:28) says that when Jesus died he cried out with the victorious shout, "It is finished!" It was the conquering and triumphant cry from the God-man who had fully accomplished everything he came to do. He then bowed his head and willingly gave up his spirit. No one took it from him, but he willingly gave it up for us. The phrase "it is finished" is what Christianity is all about. It is one word in Greek, and it's a monetary term meaning "*paid in full*." That's what the death of Jesus did: **it paid our sin-debt to God in full**. Nothing more is owed because Jesus paid for it in full. That's salvation! And it is for everyone who calls upon the name of Jesus Christ to save them – no matter how wretchedly sinful you have been.

This Easter remember the death of Jesus Christ. His death and resurrection opened the door for life for all who trust in Him. Congregation Jewish Community North will hold a series of Lunch and Learn sessions. The community is invited to attend. Please bring your own lunch. Sessions will take place from noon to 1:30 p.m. on the first Wednesday of every month, starting in March and the discussions will be led by Rabbi Seymour Rossel.

March 1, 2006 session will address *The Politics of Purity and the Poetry of Piety*: How can we respond to a world that seems overpowering, a world that holds forces we do not comprehend? How can we reconcile the truth of the One God with a world that seems inhabited by evil and devastation? These were the issues that faced the Jews of twelfth- and thirteenth-century Europe. It was here that entire Jewish communities tried to forge an answer through mysticism. But what happens when mysticism ceases to be a secret doctrine shared by a few teachers and a handful of disciples and suddenly becomes a Jewish movement?

April 5, 2006 session will be devoted to *The Book of Splendor: The Zohar*: One very successful attempt to read the secrets hidden in the Bible resulted in the thirteenth-century's greatest contribution to Jewish life and literature, the Zohar. Like the great encyclopedias of the dark ages, this work was intended to give *all*

the answers to *all* the questions of life, philosophy, and religion. Over the course of time, it was extended and appended with even more answers (which also means, even more questions). Everyone has heard of the Zohar, but what exactly does it teach? We will look at its basic teachings by discussing selections from the text itself. You can judge for yourself how it became the third most influential work in Jewish history (after the Bible and the Talmud) and whether its reputation is earned or undeserved.

The final session in the Spring series will be on May 3, 2006 and is entitled *Clinging to God*: Once upon a time, "Jewish literacy" became a burden. Becoming a devout Jew was so fraught with text learning that the average Jew felt entirely dispossessed and estranged. Most Jews "left it up to the rabbis." Suddenly, there was a breakthrough—or, in the eyes of the rabbis, a "break out"—and a new movement seized the Jewish people. It was called Hasidism, but in the teachings of its founder, Rabbi Israel the Baal Shem Tov, it was nothing like the Hasidism of today. Indeed, it was a major step toward the development of all modern Judaism—especially Reform. Come and see, hear, and feel how we have embraced the mystic teachings of the Baal Shem Tov and early Hasidism.

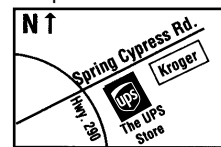



Flexible Benefits

We take part in aerobic activity to improve our cardiovascular endurance and burn fat. We weight-train to maintain lean muscle tissue and build strength. Those are the two most important elements of a fitness program, right?

Actually, there are three important elements. Often neglected is flexibility training. That neglect is regrettable, because flexibility training:

- Allows greater freedom of movement and improved posture
- Increases physical and mental relaxation
- Releases muscle tension and soreness
- Reduces risk of injury

Some people are naturally more flexible. Flexibility is primarily due to one's genetics, gender, age and level of physical activity. As we grow older, we tend to lose flexibility, usually as a result of inactivity rather than the aging process itself.

The less active we are, the less flexible we are likely to be. As with cardiovascular endurance and muscle strength, flexibility will improve with regular training.

Stretch for success

Before stretching, take a few minutes to warm up as stretching cold muscles can cause injury. Begin with a simple, low-intensity warm-up, such as easy walking while swinging the arms in a wide circle. Spend at least 5 to 10 minutes warming up prior to stretching.

When performing any stretch:

- Start each stretch slowly, exhaling as you gently stretch the muscle.
- Try to hold each stretch for at least 10 to 30 seconds.

Avoid these stretching mistakes:

- Don't bounce a stretch. Holding a stretch is more effective and there is less risk of injury.
- Don't stretch a muscle that is not warmed up.
- Don't strain or push a muscle too far. If a stretch hurts, ease up.
- Don't hold your breath.



Fitting Stretching into a Compressed Schedule

Time constraints keep many people from stretching. Some complain they just don't have time to stretch; others hurry out of their fitness classes before the cool-down exercises are completed. Ideally, at least 30 minutes, three times per week, should be spent on flex-

ibility training. But even a mere five minutes of stretching at the end of an exercise session is better than nothing. And all aerobic activity should be followed by at least a few minutes of stretching.

Here are some tips for fitting stretching into an overstuffed schedule:

1. If you don't have time to sufficiently warm up before stretching, try doing a few stretches immediately after a shower or while soaking in a hot tub. The hot water elevates muscle temperature enough to make them more pliable and receptive to stretching.
2. Try a few simple stretches before getting out of bed in the morning. Wake yourself up with a few full-body stretches by pointing the toes and reaching the arms above your head. This can clear your mind and help jump-start your morning.
3. Take a stretching class such as yoga or tai chi. Scheduling a class will help you to stick with a regular stretching program.

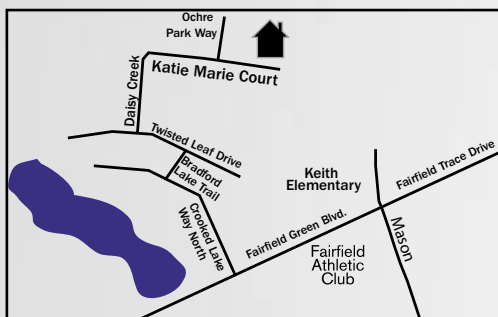
