Roan Park Playground

A new play unit was installed at Roan Park in January. Many thanks to <u>Erinn Flowers</u> for volunteering to coordinate this project! The lights at both playgrounds have been repaired with new globes installed, the fall surface areas at Saddlebough Park were topped off with playground mulch and new sand will be added to the fall surface areas at Roan Park.

Low Income Apartments

A San Antonio developer has submitted a "pre-application" for tax credits with the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs to build a low-income apartment complex at Steepleway Boulevard and Steeplepark Drive.

The Steeplechase Board is opposing this project and has been in communication with the developer, TDHCA, Commissioner Eversole, Harris County Community & Economic Development and nearby homeowner associations.

The developer has not completed a full application as of the writing of this newsletter and given the strength of our opposition to a similar project two years, we hope they will not move forward. The Board has stressed that any such project will face significant community opposition. Watch for notices posted on the club bulletin board and marquee and the website @ steeplechasetx.com.


