Willowbridge Polar Bears! - For second year, our community swimming pool will be open an extra two weekends in the spring and an extra two weekends in the fall. The pool will be open the weekends of April 22/23, April 29/30, May weekends, Tue-Sun starting May 31 thru August 8, weekends thereafter thru October 14/15. Pool Tags can be picked Sat 10-12 or Sun 12-2 on the first two weekeds in May: May 6/7 or May 13/14. Recycling – Just Do It!!

Recycling is a convenient service offered weekly in our neighborhoods. If you don't have a recycle bin assigned to you, just buy a cheap plastic bin, trashcan or laundry bin to use. Most plastic containers have a triangular shape on the bottom with a number inside. Any plastic that has a 1 or 2 on it is recyclable. This includes plastic milk cartons, detergent containers and bags from Kroger, WalMart, etc. They also take soda cans and tin cans (canned vegetables, soup) as long as they are rinsed out. Recycling pick up is every Friday, same as trash day.

Although our neighborhood recycling company does not take paper or cardboard, the nearby schools and churches have recycle bins in their back parking lots. Why not keep a bag in your laundry room or garage for clean cardboard boxes, empty food boxes, newspaper and trash mail. You can even add old homework papers your kids throw out. When the bag is full, put it in your trunk and drop it off. The schools and churches earn extra money based on the pounds of paper recycle they collect. Old phone books and magazines are great!!

It's an easy way to do something small for the environment. Why not??!!

Texas' Curfew

Spring is rapidly approaching and now is a good time to refresh our memory about the Texas Curfew.

The curfew includes all areas located in unincorporated Harris County. Juveniles under the age of 17 are subject to the Juvenile Curfew order. The curfew is enforced seven days a week. The hours of enforcement are 12 midnight to 6 a.m. in the morning.

If the Juvenile is taken into custody he/she is transported to the processing center. While there, the juvenile's parents, guardian or custodian <u>can not</u> pick up the juvenile. They will be transported to the Chimney Rock Center operated by Children's Protective Service.

The parent of guardian or custodian may also be issued a citation if they knowingly allow the juvenile to violate curfew.

The fine listed by the county ranges between \$155 and \$500.

The following are exceptions to curfew law:

- Accompanied by a parent, guardian or custodian
- Engaged in lawful employment or traveling to and from employment.
- Participating or traveling to or from school or church affiliated

activities, recreational activities supervised by adults and sponsored by non-profit organization or similar entity that takes responsibility for the juveniles.

- On sidewalks of juvenile's residence or sidewalk of next door neighbor as long as neighbor does not complain.
- Involved in an emergency situation.

This ordinance is in place as a means to deter juvenile crime, reduce the number of juvenile crime victims, reduce injury from accidents involving juveniles and assists parts in the supervision of their children.




