News from the HOA Board

The April HOA board meeting will be held on March 28th at 11:00 a.m. at 17206 Cobble Shores. Please e-mail a board member if you wish to attend, so you may be placed on the agenda.

Many changes are happening within the Homeowners Association (HOA). The HOA is finally able to function as a board without Friendswood Development involvement. In the past, meetings were cancelled last minute, because Friendswood couldn't attend, and this caused frustration among the two resident board members. The by-laws require a quorum of 3 board members in order to hold a meeting. With Scott Porto serving as President, Jimm Lubenow as Secretary/Treasurer and the addition of Diana Christopher in February, non-meetings will be a thing of the past.

The Board has recently taken action on some high priority items for our neighborhood. They are as follows.

- Terminated Association Management Inc.'s contract with Village Creek effective April 6, 2006
- Information on the new management for Village Creek will be presented at the annual meeting and/or May newsletter
- Approved new pool contract with Greater Houston Pool Management, Inc. for summer 2006 with lifeguards and weekly cleaning of spray park
- Approved the replacement of the white community fences with white three rail vinyl fences-scheduled for mid-April
- Renewed Cypress Creek Pest Control, Inc. contract to spray for mosquito's during the evening hours
- Approved for 142 trees to receive injections of fertilizer and 10 trees to be removed and <u>replaced</u> once the soil has been retested.
 All work to be done by a local tree service
- Requesting reimbursement from Friendswood Development to pay for all costs relating to trees
- Working with Spencer Landscaping to rectify the drainage problems
- Approved for monthly HOA meetings to be held during the evening hours. See your May newsletter for details and new location.

While there are a lot of changes taking place, it's only natural to have some bumps along the way. Your HOA board members appreciate your patience, and if you have any questions please e-mail one of us and we will be glad to answer your questions.

Deed Restriction of the Month

Basketball Goals & Hoops- Basketball goals are allowed to be pole mounted in the driveway of homes with detached garages. The goal must be behind the center line of the home. No goals may be mounted on the garage or home structure. Goals may be placed in rear (back) yards subject to setback and easement restrictions. Portable basketball goals will not be allowed in the unfenced portion of the yard.

To the greatest extent possible, basketball goals, posts, backboards, nets and hoops will be colors that are not offensive to the landscaping of the neighborhood. Bright, florescent, colors (particularly nets) will not be allowed.

Attention Parents of Skateboarders/Rollerbladers

There has been an on going problem of children who skateboard and/ or rollerblade in our neighborhood using the park benches, playground equipment and splash park to play. This equipment is being destroyed at the Homeowner Associations expense. They are also using some of the new home builder's materials to make their ramps. If your child is skateboarding or rollerblading, please ensure that they are not abusing the common area facilities or taking materials from builder job sites. Some of the children have been warned by Board Members and the Constables office. Action will be taken if this continues and those in violation will be responsible for any expenses incurred.

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Garden Tips

It's time to fertilize the lawn with "Bonus S/Weed and Feed". To save time and if ants are a problem in your lawn, granule ant killer can be mixed in with your fertilizer and broadcast all in one dose.

If you haven't trimmed your trees or raised the canopy in awhile, it's still not too late to do so before the summer heat arrives. Also, check the stake supports and bands around the trunk; it may be time to remove them. Trees gain strength thru movement.

A common mistake gardeners make is suffocating a tree with "mulch volcanoes". This is done by mounding too much mulch around the base of the tree. Trees need to breathe. Mulch should not exceed more than 4 inches in depth. It should not touch the trunk or crown, but be 4-6 inches away and can be placed as far out as the drip line (outer edge of branches). Deep mulching can lead to excess moisture in the root zone, which can stress the tree and cause root rot.

The website has downloadable forms for "Vacation Watch", as well as a document library covering such pertinent topics such as how to protect yourself from identity theft and how to promote personal safety. There is also a direct link to the fraud hotline and an interactive quiz that will help you reduce your home insurance premiums.
