

Message from the Chairman

There are three topics I would like to touch on [briefly] this month: 1.) Capital Improvements 2.) Fall Soccer 3.) Long-term Planning.

Capital Improvements:

All of our fundraising efforts, including team sponsorship dollars for baseball, coupled with a portion of your registration fees, are what pay for the improvements you see at the various facilities we utilize for our programs. Without going into all the details — we save that for the monthly board meetings — some of the improvements you are sure to notice are: A new baseball field (soon to be formally dedicated in honor of Weston Smith); new scoreboards; new bleachers; new volleyball standards and nets; refurbishing of the gym floor in the Rec Center (although the vendor still has to come back and finish what he started) and really classy-looking uniforms for all of our sports. Some things you may not notice are the new irrigation and sprinkler systems we've added; new Thorguard Electrical Warning Systems; the increase in electrical power and the re-routing of our electrical system to eliminate blackouts; new concession stand equipment; various fertilizers and soil enhancers; and a whole host of little things (too numerous to list here ... including several things on the way!). We do this for the betterment of all of our sport's programs. It's all for the kids, folks, and we all know they don't appreciate it now, but way too quickly they will be adults with kids of their own and these are the days ... playing sports within our programs that will bring back some of their fondest memories.

Fall Soccer:

Consider this a shout-out to all soccer parents of Fairfield! The FSA board would very much like to see soccer thrive and grow into a strong program within FSA. We are hoping that with some recently added field space for this fall, the promise of an additional ten acres in 2007 and a small but dedicated soccer committee that fall soccer in Fairfield can be revitalized. But the handful – and I do mean handful – of committee members that I have seen at recent soccer meetings is not going to cut it! That is why on **Sunday, May 21, at 2:00 PM**, we will have a "soccer town hall meeting" to discuss where our program is headed. We will meet in the clubhouse at the FSA Practice Center (formerly the Golf Center). If the same handful of volunteers show up, and only those 6-7 people, then that will tell me (and the Board) all we need to know about the future of our soccer program. How much of FSA resources (dollars) we put into the soccer program will be directly attributed to how well-attended this meeting is and more importantly, how passionate you are about the future of our soccer program. I encourage you to arrange your schedule to be there – not just to listen, but to join in – volunteer and get involved! Please see below for Brian Roberts' *Soccer News*. Brian is the new Commissioner of Fairfield Soccer and his *News* serves as a precursor to the meeting on May 21.

Long-term Planning

As most of you know, the current FSA Practice Center (formerly the Golf Center) is ours for the using, only on a temporary basis. We lease this property from the new owner and the only groups allowed to use this property, as stipulated in the lease, are FSA sanctioned teams. We do not know for certain how long we will be able to continue to lease this property. The current lease expires in December and we are hoping to extend/renew it through 2007, but again, we are uncertain at this point if that is going to happen.

To that end, we will be conducting a series of meetings to begin the process of long-term planning for our sport's programs. Anyone may attend, and all points-of-view will be encouraged. FSA will have land needs and when those needs actually come due, I will no longer be Chairman (14 more months, but who's counting). I want very much to begin this process so that you who will be inheriting this Association – particularly you parents of 4, 5 and 6 year olds! – will have as clear of a plan as possible of what to do as the needs arise. Be looking on our website – a website that will have a new, fresh look and feel by June 30, by the way – for meeting times and dates.

In the meantime, as always, all of our future board meeting dates are posted on the website (www.fairfield-sports.com), and I hope to see many of you at a future meeting or two.

Soccer News

Attention Soccer Fans in Fairfield!

As you all know, the Fairfield soccer commissioners made a decision late last year to forgo the spring season due to the lack of playing space. We wanted to deliver a well-rounded sport and that just wasn't possible. Rather than deliver a sub-standard product, we decided to skip one off-season to prepare for the fall of 2006. For those kids that still wanted to play soccer, we invited the Cy-Fair Youth Soccer Association to hold registration in Fairfield for the first time. We felt that we should put forth our best effort to make sure that any child that wanted to play soccer would have that opportunity.

We held our first soccer committee meeting April 6th and discussed several issues regarding the upcoming fall season. We decided to make the switch to small-sided soccer this fall. After watching several 4 vs. 4 games at Dyess Park, we are convinced this is the way to go if we really want to teach our kids the passing, dribbling, and shooting skills necessary to play soccer and have fun at the same time. We also have three separate areas to play soccer for the fall: the old golf center, the large field in front of the Baptist Church, and another area in the new section where a pool is currently being built. We also discussed the possibility of affiliating with Cy-Fair, joining STYSA (South Texas Youth Soccer Association), or staying independent at least another year. Much more information will be required before any decision is made on this subject. I think we should have a great fall season, especially with the change to small-sided soccer. It is much more fun to watch, especially the 4,5, and 6 year olds.

On a bit more of a somber note, Fairfield Sports Association is holding a long-term meeting on May 21st, 2:00pm where the future plans of Fairfield soccer will be discussed at great length. We have been allocated three parcels of field space for 2006 and have been told we will have a 1—acre site that will be available by June 2007 as a possible permanent site for soccer. We have discussed bathrooms, concessions, and even the possibility of lights! I say "possible" permanent site because FSA needs to see just how passionate Fairfield folks are about soccer before committing the funds to complete a project like this.

I have heard the complaints that soccer has been treated badly in the past, but let me emphasize to ALL those that love soccer or have children that love it... NOW is the time to step up and attend this meeting. It is a Sunday afternoon, so there are no scheduled sports that would interfere with it. My feeling is that if there is not a sufficient number of "soccer fanatics" at this meeting, the future of Fairfield soccer will be in serious jeopardy. If you have children that enjoy soccer; then I implore you to be at this meeting. Otherwise, soccer will probably cease to exist as a Fairfield Sports program.

On March 18, 2006 the Cub Scout's of Pack #1533 experienced what it was like to "Live Aboard" the WWII aircraft carrier USS Lexington. Nicknamed "The Blue Ghost" by the infamous Tokyo Rose, is a true living legend. Commissioned in 1943, she served the United States longer and set more records than any other carrier in the history of naval aviation. The Japanese reported the "Lex" sunk no less than four times, yet each time she came back to fight again, leading to her famous nickname. Decommissioned in 1991, this 910- foot, 16-deck, 33,000-ton aircraft carrier is now berthed in Corpus Christi Bay.

The day included tours of the ship, viewing a large format movie *Fighter Pilot*, lunch, dinner and evening colors. Just before "lights out", the Scout's learned about the ghosts that haunt the ship. 

Harvest Bible Church

Now when the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. 2 Suddenly a sound like a violent wind blowing came from heaven and filled the entire house where they were sitting. 3 And tongues spreading out like a fire appeared to them and came to rest on each one of them. 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit, and they began to speak in other languages as the Spirit enabled them (Acts 2:1-4).

The Jewish feasts of the OT (cf. Leviticus 23) find their ultimate fulfillment in Jesus Christ. Whereas the Passover required the death of a lamb, Jesus Christ was the perfect Lamb (1 Cor. 5:7) sacrificed once for all to atone for the sins of those who believe, and he died on the Jewish Passover! Immediately following the Passover Jews would celebrate the Feast of Unleavened Bread for seven days, and the first day of that celebration was called the Feast of First-fruits. The first-fruits were what the Jews would bring to the priest from their fields at the beginning of the harvest. They signified God's provision, and the one offering them gave to God the first of his harvest. This OT feast also pointed to Jesus' redemptive work in that his resurrection is called "the first fruits of those who fall asleep" (1 Cor. 15:20). Christians celebrate Jesus Christ as the fulfillment of the Law – and as the first-fruits of the great harvest of believers who will be revealed at his second coming.

On the Day of Pentecost in Acts 1 there were 120 believers in the church. Acts 2:2 says that a violent sound like wind came from heaven and filled the place where they were. This was then followed by the appearance of tongues (languages) which spread out like fire and came to rest on each one of them causing all to understand the message. The "fire-like appearance" presented itself initially as a single language, then it broke up into different parts coming to rest on each one of the disciples. The appearance of this phenomenon was one of fire which had been the symbol for God's presence in the OT. So it's no coincidence that the presence of God as the Holy Spirit came in the form of fire in the NT on Pentecost. This fulfilled John the Baptist's prediction that the

Messiah would baptize with the Holy Spirit and with fire (Matt. 3:11).

As soon as these tongues rested upon the disciples they began to speak in other languages "as the Spirit enabled them." These languages were known dialects to the thousands who were gathered that day, for Acts 2:8 reveals that there were many foreigners present who spoke different languages and who heard the disciples speaking in their own native languages.

The world changed drastically on the day of Pentecost ten days after Christ ascended into heaven. Jesus had said that power would come upon the disciples once the Spirit came upon them, and when it did they began to preach. Their audience included people groups from all over the world. All of them heard the words, and many of them took the message to their homeland and shared it resulting in many conversions. That's why there are Christians today in America - because those in Israel spread the word. And this continues to be the church's mission.





Increased Antioxidant Capacity Reverse Some Effects Of Aging

Baylor College of Medicine

HOUSTON — (April 13, 2006) – Decreasing oxidant levels by increasing the amount of an antioxidant enzyme can reverse declining memory skills and other pathological effects of old age, say researchers at Baylor College of Medicine (BCM) in Houston. The findings are reported in the current issue of Journal of Neuroscience.

"This is one of the first studies showing that a genetically engineered mouse that overexpresses an antioxidant enzyme actually performs better when they age with respect to memory," said Dr. Eric Klann, principal investigator of the study and professor of molecular physiology at BCM.

The study is one of the first to assess memory performance among aging mice genetically engineered with an abundance of an anti-oxidant enzyme called extracellular superoxide dismutase. As this group of mice aged, they performed better on memory tasks and demonstrated cellular improvements in the hippocampus, a part of the brain required for memory.

Conversely, the same experiments in younger mice showed that high levels of the antioxidant were detrimental to memory function.

Previous studies have concluded that oxidative stress contributes to aging and aging-related impairments in memory. Klann conjectures

that high antioxidant levels, within reason, could promote longevity and reduce the risk of dementia associated with normal aging and neurodegenerative disorders such as Alzheimer's disease.

Klann's study advances the debate over the utility of antioxidant supplements, which some claim eliminate hazardous free radicals from the body and reduce the risk of cancer, among other disorders. On the other hand, recent reports claim that excessive intake of vitamin and mineral supplements pose no benefit and can even do harm in some cases.

"The balance of oxidants is very important," said Klann. "In animal studies, it's bad to have too much or too little. That could be part of the reason for conflicting findings on antioxidant supplements in humans."

Klann says further research in mice will be necessary to approximate ideal antioxidant levels and whether antioxidant enzymes can prevent dementia and other aging-related impairments.

Daoying Hu and Dr. Faridis Serrano at BCM and Dr. Tim D. Oury at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center also contributed to this paper. The study was funded by the National Institutes of Health and the Cynthia and George Mitchell Foundation.

1 tsp. vanilla


1 egg



Kids In Motion

By the time they reach high school, 63 percent of children are no longer physically active. Why?

If your kids fall within this group, you don't have to shake your head sadly. You can set a good example, be a role model and do the right things so your kids will, too.

Get off the couch and on a bike with your kids. Introduce them to exercise that's fun. Eat healthy. Instead of high-calorie foods and snacks, turn to fruits and low- or non-fat foods. And once you get kids moving in the direction of fitness, chances are they'll keep going for the rest of their lives.

Start 'em voung

Did you know that physically active children have fewer chronic health problems than kids who are sedentary?

Children who are fit have other statistics in their favor, too. They're better able to meet the demands of daily physical activity. They do better in physical-performance tests. They have a stronger self-image and more self-confidence, and they demonstrate greater improvement in skill- and health-related fitness.


