Would you like to learn some new crafts? Are you willing to share your crafting skills?



Dental Tip of the Month.

Is Overwhitening a Concern? By: Dr. Asim Sundrani

Many folks that are teeth whitening are aiming for an unnaturally white shade by overusing the products. Excessive use of bleaching products can damage tooth structure and gums. Some overly enthusiastic patients experience tooth sensitivity, blisters and discoloration on teeth and gums.

Custom-fitted trays are used to hold the gel, reducing risk of hydrogen peroxide leakage; with over-the-counter products, the trays are usually not form-fitting. But even under ideal conditions, studies show that often less than 50% of the whitener is still in the trays one hour after application, indicating a lot of leakage.

I do caution against buying tooth whitening products over the counter. The ingredients may be correct but the balance of the ingredients may be improper, resulting in a low pH, thus damaging the enamel of the teeth.

Make sure whatever whitening product you get, it has an ADA (American Dental Association) seal of acceptance. Most over the counter products do not have that seal, thus may cause an unknown harm.

Storm Water Pollution

Have you ever seen someone pour motor oil into a storm sewer? Use the nearest storm drain to dispose of grass clippings with the leaf blower? Did you ever wonder where it all ends up? Our bayous and Galveston Bay - that's where. Virtually anything that touches the ground can make its way into the storm water drainage system and flow directly into our bayous, streams and ultimately, into the bay. If storm water is contaminated by contact with pollutants, it stays contaminated because storm water is not treated at a treatment plant.

Urban storm water runoff is a serious concern because storm water runoff may be contaminated with pesticides, fertilizers, animal droppings, trash, food wastes, automotive by-products and other toxic substances, as well as floatable trash that are all part of the urban environment. Storm water runoff that flows over streets, parking lots, construction sites and industrial facilities can carry these pollutants through the storm water drainage system directly into local rivers, bayous, channels and ditches.

The contaminated storm water may affect commercial fisheries, restrict swimming areas or affect the navigability of the regional waters.

The sole purpose of a storm water drainage system is to transport storm water to the nearest waterway. Dumping trash, pollutants and debris into the storm drain is illegal and is a violation of the Clean Water Act. Van Arsdale Presents Overview Of Special Session, School Finance Reform

HOUSTON (June 23, 2006) – Texas House District 130 Representative Corbin Van Arsdale can finally get back to his routine at home – at least until early next year when the 80th Legislature convenes.

Van Arsdale, who spoke at the June 20 general membership luncheon of the Cy-Fair Houston Chamber of Commerce at Raveneaux Country Club, joked that when people ask the two-term legislator how long he has served in the House, he tells them nine sessions – two regular sessions and seven called sessions.

At the Chamber luncheon, he presented an overview on the recently concluded special session at which legislators finally hammered out school funding laws to replace the so-called "Robin Hood" plan.

"The problem with Robin Hood is that over the years more and more of the burden of financing schools has fallen to the local level," Van Arsdale said. "As long as the local portion is going up and up, you're going to have more redistribution. The only way to fix this is to push more from the local level to the state level. When you start pushing things to the state level, the state can't tax property or income."

Van Arsdale noted that the governor's school finance panel, headed by former state comptroller John Sharp, did in-depth studies and hired economists to examine the issue. The final result, adopted by the House and Senate and signed into law by Gov. Rick Perry on May 31, was a mixture of consumption taxes, revamping of the franchise tax and use of budget surplus to reduce school property taxes for

property owners.

The consumption tax increases affect cigarettes and smokeless tobacco but not cigars, Van Arsdale said. Because private-party automobile transaction prices are virtually impossible to document, all used car sales taxes will now be based on a vehicle's so-called "blue book" value.

The franchise tax, which only about 6 percent of Texas businesses paid because they found loopholes, was scrapped in favor of a "margin" tax. However, the margin tax will not apply to sole proprietorships, charities, general partnerships or companies that earn less than \$300,000 in gross revenue, Van Arsdale said. The tax will not be payable until 2008.

According to Van Arsdale, all the new revenue will be channeled into a special fund that is separate from the regular budget. The school finance fund will reduce property taxes 11 percent this year and another 22 percent by 2007. The bill signed by Perry also included a \$2,000 raise for teachers.

The legislation also included incentive pay for teachers, a mandatory four years of math and science courses for high school students, a mandatory late-August start date for schools, sanctions for low-performing charter schools, a provision that school elections must be held on the same day as city or county elections, and a requirement that districts post their financial information on their Web sites.
