Dental Tip of the Month.

Is Overwhitening a Concern? By: Dr. Asim Sundrani

Many folks that are teeth whitening are aiming for an unnaturally white shade by overusing the products. Excessive use of bleaching products can damage tooth structure and gums. Some overly enthusiastic patients experience tooth sensitivity, blisters and discoloration on teeth and gums.

Custom-fitted trays are used to hold the gel, reducing risk of hydrogen peroxide leakage; with over-the-counter products, the trays are usually not form-fitting. But even under ideal conditions, studies show that often less than 50% of the whitener is still in the trays one hour after application, indicating a lot of leakage.

I do caution against buying tooth whitening products over the counter. The ingredients may be correct but the balance of the ingredients may be improper, resulting in a low pH, thus damaging the enamel of the teeth.

Make sure whatever whitening product you get, it has an ADA (American Dental Association) seal of acceptance. Most over the counter products do not have that seal, thus may cause an unknown harm.

Worshipping the Lord is so much more than simply singing songs on Sundays. Jesus, in the book of Revelation told the spiritually dead church in Sardis: *Remember, then, what you received and heard. Keep it, and repent. If you will not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know the hour I will come against you* (3:3).

After commanding the sleeping church in Sardis to "wake up" from their spiritual slumber (Rev. 3:2), Jesus gave them a sharp command and warned them that if they failed to wake up he would come suddenly and rise up against them. His name was a stake, and he would never allow sin to continue without severe consequences – both then and in the present-day.

There are five noteworthy verbs in Rev. 3:3 that call believers to worship. First, the command to "remember." This present-imperative Greek verb tense implies an urgent *continual* remembrance whereby the church gathers together repeatedly to recall God's past, present, and future works. The second verb to note is the verb "received" ("remember what you received"). This perfect-indicative verb tense denotes a present state of being based on past action. In other words, since the church had "received" the free gift of salvation as a once-and-for-all-time event, their present state of being was to reflect that. Like a wide-receiver who had caught the football down field (one-time event) he's supposed to run toward the end-zone (present state of being). The Sardis church caught the ball, as it were, but they were sitting on the ball without advancing it. They needed to run!

The third verb in v. 3 is "heard" ("remember what you received and heard"). This aorist-indicative Greek verb refers to a snapshot of past action. All it

means is that the church at one time heard the gospel, but it seems clear that what they heard they indeed believed because they had "received" it, for they had converted to Christ. Now they just needed to remember it all so as to wake up from their slumber. The fourth verb is "keep it" ("remember what you received and heard... keep it"). This is another present-imperative like "remember." The church was to remember who Christ was to them, recall his commands, and continually "keep" them. Finally, they were commanded to "repent" ("remember what you received and heard... keep it, and repent"). This verb is an aorist imperative, and it signifies urgent and time-critical action (cf. Matt. 28:19-20). The church was in danger of Christ's discipline, and they had to the count of three, so to speak, to repent, or Christ would rise up against them.

Revelation 3:3 is a design for Christian worship. Remembering who God is comes from singing praises to Him and studying His word. Of course praise can only come from those who have heard and received God's unconditional grace. This leads to a revival of believers and then to repentance of sins. That's what worship is and what it accomplishes.



Beat The Heat Before It Beats You

Keeping cool when the weather is hot

It's summertime and you head out for a run. Before you even finish the first mile, your body feels as though it might ignite from the heat.

It's not your imagination. Fifteen minutes into your run and your body temperature could be as high as 5° F above normal. If you were to continue at this pace, fatigue and heat illness would no doubt take over.

Strategies to protect yourself from heat illness

The above scenario doesn't have to happen. Drinking enough fluid, whether it be water or a sports drink, is imperative for exercising in hot or humid weather.

Maintenance of body fluids is essential to maintaining proper body temperature. Sweat dispels heat through your skin. If you let your body become dehydrated, you'll find it much more difficult to perform even the lightest of workouts.

But don't wait until you're thirsty to start replenishing those fluids. Chances are, by the time you actually feel thirsty, your body is well on its way to becoming severely dehydrated.

The following strategies will help you protect yourself from the onset of heat illness: **1. Hydration**

Fluid replenishment before, during and after exercise is essential to avoid progressive dehydration. Always consume more fluids than you think you need before and after exercise, and strive to drink six to eight ounces of fluid every 15 to 20 minutes during exercise.

2. Exercise Intensity

You should probably reduce the intensity of your workout, particularly the first few times you are exposed to higher temperatures.

90° - 105° Possibility of heat cramps 105° - 130° Heat cramps or heat exhaustion likely. Heat stroke possible.

130°+ Heat stroke a definite risk.



3. Temperature

Use the heat stress index table to determine the risk of exercising at various combinations of temperature and humidity. While a 90° F outdoor temp is relatively safe at 10 percent humidity, the heat stress of 90° F at 50 percent humidity is the equivalent of 96° F. When the heat stress index rises above 90° F, you may want to consider postponing your exercise session until later in the day. Or, plan ahead, and beat the day's heat by working out early in the morning.

4. Fitness

Physical training and heat acclimation can increase your blood volume, helping to regulate body temperature more effectively.

Interestingly, the acclimatization process can be completed in 7 to 14 days of repeated heat exposure. However, you must always continue to drink fluids before, during and after exercise.

5. Clothing

Wear minimal clothing to provide greater skin surface area for heat dissipation. Your clothing should be lightweight, loose fitting, light colored to reflect the sun's rays, and of a material that absorbs water, such as cotton.

6. Rest

Know when to say 'no' to exercise. Using common sense is your best bet for preventing heat stress when Mother Nature turns up the heat.

Tomatoes-No Refrigeration Required

(NAPSA)-Did you know that one of the most popular vegetables in the United States is actually a fruit? Categorized by botanists as a fruit but eaten by consumers as a vegetable, tomatoes are appreciated for their combination of sweetness and acidity.

Any way you slice it, tomatoes are a delicious way to add nutrients to the diet. They are rich in vitamins A and C and are a good source of potassium. Tomatoes are also naturally low in sodium and contain no cholesterol.

Many people store tomatoes alongside other vegetables in their refrigerator's crisper drawer, but that's not the best place for them. Tomatoes should be stored at room temperature to maintain maximum flavor. Cool temperatures inside your refrigerator will stop the ripening process and begin to decrease the flavor and change the texture. Try storing your tomatoes in a decorative bowl on the counter.

Tomatoes and bananas help each other ripen quicker. Tomatoes and bananas emit a naturally occurring ripening gas called ethylene and when you store the two together they both ripen rapidly. If you need to ripen a



tomato quickly, store it in a closed paper bag on the counter. The ethylene gas speeds up the ripening process when confined around the fruit in a closed bag.

Although tomatoes are native to Central and South America, they are now eaten throughout the world and are an ingredient in countless recipes. Many people consider tomatoes an essential part of their vegetable gardens each summer and they are available at your local market year-round.

(NAPSA)-There are two kinds of travelers in the world: those who pack light and those who wish they had. The key is to include everything you need in as little space as possible.

Some of the most travel-savvy people in the world-travel agents-offer some helpful tips and techniques for efficient packing for all types of travel:

- Make a plan and stick to it. As an architect plans a building, so must you plan the contents of your suitcase. A packing list eliminates the panic of last-second packing, serves as a handy guide for repacking at the end of the trip and can be beneficial in the unfortunate event of lost or stolen luggage.
- Check the weather forecast of the destination and plan accordingly. Also, be sure to know the local traditions. Although many places have relaxed their dress codes, a T-shirt for dinner could be a serious blunder, or bare shoulders may bar your entrance into such places as St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City. Bare legs for men and women are strongly discouraged if not prohibited at holy sites in many religions. For

almost all outdoor activities, take pieces that can be layered.

- Lay out the items you intend to take and reexamine your list. If possible, weed out single-use items and extras.
- Travel kits are best for toiletries. Having a travel kit perpetually stocked in a waterproof case will save packing time before the trip and aggravation after arrival. Most personal toiletry items come in inexpensive travel sizes, so purchase these whenever you see them, so as not to arrive with a half-empty bottle of your favorite hair gel.
- Iron everything before packing. If it goes in crisp and clean, odds are more in its favor of coming out the same. Button all buttons and zip all zippers.
- Know when to fold 'em. Practice folding like it's done in clothing stores-that method is used for a reason. The better the fold, the fewer the creases.
- Try to think chronologically, placing the items to be worn first on the top. This will prevent rooting around the suitcase for a specific item






