Meadowlands Apartments

Nearly 200 residents of Steeplechase, Windermere Lakes, Crossroads, Winchester, Willowlakes and Willowbridge crowded into our community center on July 18 for a meeting with the developer seeking tax credits and bonds to build low-income housing on Steepleway Boulevard. Mr. Phil Owens of Representative Elkin's office was also present.

Following the meeting residents signed petitions opposing the project; the petition drive continued until the August 18th deadline for public comment. Petitions with signatures of nearly 1,000 residents were sent to the TDHCA on August 15th. Representative Elkins, Commissioner Eversole and Jersey Village Mayor Heathcott have sent letters of opposition to the TDHCA.

A steering committee of residents and directors from area associations met weekly to organize and coordinate opposition, focusing on:

. Challenging the application for tax credits using TDHCA rules

. Obtaining letters of opposition from elected officials and residents . Building grassroots community opposition

At the August 9th hearing before the TDHCA over 100 area residents attempted to crowd into a room that could only accommodate about 50 people. Following a protest by Representative Elkins, the TDHCA agreed to schedule another hearing on August 21st at 6pm at Houston Northwest Inn.

The decision on awarding housing tax credits will be made by the Board of the TDHCA at their meeting in Austin on August 30th. We are hoping to have representatives at that meeting – for continuing updates, log on to Steeplechasetx.com.
