What Has Killed My Pine Trees?

The answer to the above question, in most cases, is pine engraver beetles. (Pine Bark Beetles) East Texas has been in the grips of a drought for the past three or four years. Because of the drought, many pine and hardwood trees are under severe moisture stress. There are five different pine bark beetles in East Texas, and they all attack and kill pine trees. Cutting of dead looking limbs is not recommended.

Pine trees can be sprayed with a preventive insecticide registered of pine bark beetles. Unfortunately these insecticides may be difficult to obtain. Lindane had not been banned, but it is very difficult to find in a formulation for pine bark beetles. Dursban 4E is no longer registered. In yard situations prompt removal of visibly infested trees is about all that is practical.

Finding a service to treat Pine Bark Beetles, is extremely expensive, it also involves your surrounding neighbors with chemicals effecting dogs, cats, birds, etc. This can be extremely expensive to treat.

If I Have Pine Trees, How Can I Prevent This?

You can prevent the invasion of Pine Bark Beetles by properly watering. Watering your pine trees, slowly, letting the water soak to the roots.

If you feel your pine trees have been infected, contact a licensed tree service to determine if your pine trees have been infected. The best recommendation for homeowners is to have the pine tree(s) removed immediately to prevent spread.

Meadowlands Update


On August 30th the Board of the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs awarded tax-exempt bonds of \$13,500,000 and housing tax credits of \$967,760. to HT Seattle Slew LTD. for construction of low-income apartments on Steepleway Boulevard at Steeplepark Drive. Despite widespread community opposition, including from elected officials, the Board unanimously voted to follow the TDHCA staff recommendation to award the credits and bonds

Four Steeplechase residents-Ron Green, Kathy Dowling, Greg Fredericks and Betty Hattman- traveled to Austin and testified before the Board as did State Representative Gary Elkins. On August 15th an entire box of written comment was sent to the TDHCA including: petitions (over 1,100 signatures) opposing the project, a request for disqualification of the application, reports regarding the lack of municipal services and transportation as well as the negative impact on schools and area crime, and the abundance of available affordable apartments in the area. Fortyfive people wrote letters of opposition to the TDHCA as did U.S. Congressman Culberson, Representative Elkins, Commissioner Eversole, Sheriff Thomas and Jersey Village Mayor Heathcott. In addition two hundred area residents attended each of the two public hearings in August.

In the end, those opposing the project were dismissed as "not in my backyarders" and worse, labeled as racists. It was clear that the TDHCA was not interested in community input. Further, as we learned, all of the rules are written to benefit the developers, not the communities or the low- income households they are purported to serve. After such a disappointing defeat it would be easy to ask why even bother to fight if state officials don't listen and the rules are stacked against the neighborhoods. But we have to continue to fight as there will be more of these projects built in our area unless we work together to protect our communities. Our area elected officials support us and we need to work with them for legislation to change the rules and policies of these programs. We must collaborate with other neighborhood associations and groups, such as the Fairbanks Partnership, to send our message to Austin.

While our effort to defeat this project failed, we did form valuable working relationships with other nearby neighborhood associations-Windermere Lakes, Crossroads, Willowbridge and Willow Lake- and we will reach out to more. What can you do?

Kick Your Way to Fitness

Are you bored with your current fitness routine?

It may be time to kick your way to one of the hottest workouts around. Kickboxing, also referred to as boxing aerobics and cardio kickboxing, is a hybrid of boxing, martial arts and aerobics that offers an intense cross-training and total-body workout.

It blends a mixture of highpower exercise routines that strengthen the body and mind, decrease stress and hone reflexes while increasing endurance and cardiovascular power. While kickboxing's roots are in full-contact fighting, it has found a safe and very effective niche in the fitness community.

While some estimates of kickboxing's calorie-burning potential have reached as high as 500 to 800 calories per hour, ACE-sponsored research suggests that only very large individuals working out at exceptionally high intensities are like to burn that that many.

Instead, a 135-pound person is likely to burn 350 to 450 calories during a typical 50-minute class that consists of a warm-up, aerobic period and cool-down. There are, however, other important factors to consider

before taking the first kick.

What is your current fitness level?

Keep in mind that many clubs may not offer classes that are based on progression. Even if your current routine features a hearty combination of cross-training workouts, you may want to take it easy at first, then build as your body adapts.

For this reason, an hour-long session may not be the wisest choice for someone who isn't used to this level of concentrated activity.

Familiarize yourself with the basics

Remember, adequate warm-up and close attention to proper technique are paramount. Classes should begin with basic stretches and a light cardiovascular warm-up such as pushups and jumping jacks.

A typical aerobic kickboxing routine involves a series of repetitive punches alternating with hand strikes, kicks and then a combination of all three. The repetitions help participants focus on proper technique while engaging several muscles groups and getting a fierce cardiovascular workout.

After the main section of the routine, stretches and floor exercises are commonly performed as a cool-down.

Don't forget to wear loose clothing that allows freedom of movement during your kickboxing workout and drink plenty of water.

Beginner beware

When attending your first class, try to avoid these common mistakes:

- \cdot Wearing weights or holding dumbbells when throwing punches, which puts your joints in danger of injury
- · Locking your joints when throwing kicks or punches
- · Over-extending kicks (Beginners should avoid high kicks until they get used to the routine and become more flexible.)

- · Giving in to group peer pressure and exercising beyond fatigue
- · And of course, you should ask your instructor about their training. Cardio kickboxing is a combination of martial arts and aerobics, and employs different techniques from a "pure" martial arts class.

Many teachers may have boxing or martial arts training, but may not have the appropriate class experience or be properly certified by an organization such as ACE. Finally, once you understand the basics of this stress-relieving, total-body workout, you can kick your way to a new level of fitness.

Basic moves and equipment

It may seem awkward at first, but the basic moves in a kickboxing class can be mastered with time, patience and practice.

A prepared class will have mirrors, a punching or "heavy" bag and hit pads for participants to use. Here are two basic lower-body kickboxing moves that work the hamstrings, gluteals and quadriceps:

The roundhouse kick - Starting from a basic stance (side of body facing bag, knees slightly bent, shoulder-length apart), lift your right knee and point it just to the right of your target. Pivot on your left foot as you extend your right leg. Kick the target with the top of your foot.

The side kick - From the basic stance, pull your right knee toward your left shoulder. Pivot on your left foot as you snap your right leg into your target. Strike with either the outside edge of your foot or your heel.




