Dear Residents,

Here is a very sad story and a good reason why all pet owners should understand the importance of microchips for your animals. The cost is \$30-45 and vets and shelters will scan most animals for them when checking them in. There is still a great need for the residents of Fairfield to volunteer to foster animals that have lost their way. Please sign up at Yahoo Groups to get emails for lost and found animals to help match owners with their pets faster.

Sam, a Fairfield Dog

Last Monday during the bad storm our dog, Sam, got scared by the thunder and got under the fence and pulled off the tag from his collar. On Tuesday evening a "post" describing Sam was posted on the site. My husband tried the number posted Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and finally got a recording and left a message.

On Sunday we finally received a message back that they had brought our dog to the SPCA due to out of town requirements and that he had been adopted by a lady and her 7 year old daughter. They had bathed Sam and changed out his collar. It appears the roommate dropped him off and they stated they left our contact information at the SPCA and someone would be contacting us.

After speaking with the SPCA this morning and finding requirements for the waiting period before they would put up a dog for adoption that was lost, my husband went down to the SPCA to try and locate the information on our dog. The SPCA had no record of our dog ever coming through there.

I have phoned the individual again and now she states that her roommate brought the dog down on Friday at 4pm and just gave him to someone leaving the shelter that was looking for a dog and thought Sam was perfect. We have no record of the dog or who has him and our 5 year old daughter is devastated that her dog is missing. I would highly encourage that there be a posting on your web-site on the importance and responsibility of those rescuing a dog.

Number 1: Check your messages and make sure that messages can be left at the number you give.

Number 2: Never give the dog away to a stranger. If you cannot care for the dog you rescue and do bring him to the SPCA, drop him off and give all the information on where he was found, etc.

Do not remove the dogs collar and replace with another These are identifying characteristics.

If this procedure would have been followed we would have our dog back. Now ... we have no idea where he is and who has him.



FALL IS UPON US ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATIONS

Now that Fall is approaching, you'll probably be spending more time outside and may be considering making changes or additions to your home. Please be reminded that anything that alters the exterior aesthetic appearance of your home, i.e., basketball goal, pool, play equipment (including trampolines), patio cover, storage building, satellite dish, etc. must have your Association's approval prior to construction or installation. Fence staining/painting is not permitted (only clear stain with no color pigment is permitted and approval must be obtained before proceeding).

If you're building something that has a roof and/or sides, i.e., patio cover, storage building, you will need to include the following along with your application: materials including roofing, dimensions, height (measured from ground to peak), width and length, and a copy of your lot survey indicating the proposed location and a side view elevation drawing. Remember, metal, plastic, etc. are not permitted.

If you plan to install play equipment, please include a copy of your lot survey showing the proposed location, the dimensions of the equipment (height, width and length) and color of the tarp.

If you're painting your home, please include a sample of the color(s) you wish to use.

Basketball goals...include a copy of your recorded lot survey indicating the proposed location where you wish to keep the goal.

Keep in mind that installation/construction may not commence until you have received your Association's approval.

It's a real easy process and takes no time at all to adhere to your governing documents. You can apply by U.S. Mail, fax (713-932-6059) or email (ami@amitx.com)— whichever is easiest for you.

Why is ARC Approval Required?

The architectural review process is required by the Governing Documents of deed-restricted communities. But why should someone else have any say over what you do with your own home?

Everyone who buys a home in a deed-restricted community (whether it is a condominium, townhouse or single-family association) agrees to be bound by the governing documents of that association. That includes applying for architectural approval of just about anything that changes the exterior appearance of your home or your unit.

Architectural control for a condominium association tends to be more understandable by most owners because the exterior is generally owned, maintained and otherwise controlled by the association. You may not like the fact that you cannot paint your front door a different color or add distinctive decoration to the exterior – but you tend to understand the fact that it is not your individual property but is owned indivisibly by everyone in the community.

Single-family associations have similar architectural control over what owners may or may not do when it pertains to exterior painting, roofing, fences, fence staining, statues, additions, swimming pools, basketball goals, play structures and other things that affect the exterior appearance of a home. Some owners feel this is an intrusive burden that violates their property rights. This is not so. The association's architectural review authority is based in the community's governing documents and in the state's property code. The purpose of architectural review is to maintain or enhance your property's value by helping owners to use colors, materials and styles that coordinate with and compliment the rest of the community.

Remember that the members of the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) or Architectural Control Committee (ACC) are your neighbors and they understand your desire to improve your home and the importance of having you do so. They are, however, obligated by the governing documents to consistently and fairly enforce the community's architectural guidelines for your benefit and for the benefit of the entire community. By so doing the Committee helps better ensure that the community maintains a harmonious and consistent appearance.

When people select a deed restricted community in which to purchase a home they do so for a variety of reasons. Chief among them are:

- · Homes in deed restricted communities tend to be better maintained.
- · There is continuity, consistency and harmony (as well as variety) among the homes.
- Your next door neighbor cannot use garish colors and hence reduce the value of your home or your enjoyment of the neighborhood.
- · There is more of a sense of community and belonging.
- · Homes in deed restricted communities hold their values better.

The architectural review process in a well-managed community is simple and usually quick. Complete a simple application form and, depending on your plans, attach samples of the paint or roof materials or, if you are doing something more extensive like a patio cover or room addition, you will need to attach drawings, dimensions and lists of materials. Submit the completed application and it will be promptly reviewed. You will also be notified in writing of the Architectural Review Committee's decision in writing. Assuming your application is approved you may commence work without further ado. If your application is denied the Committee or your managing agent will tell you why it was denied and what you can do to get the work approved. Finally, if you feel your application was denied unfairly you have the right to appeal the decision. Your managing agent will help you through this process.

ARC approval does not apply to minor repairs to the exterior of your home such as replacing and repainting a piece of trim or patching a small area of shingles. Nor is it intended to get in the way of urgent things like the replacement of a badly leaking roof. If you tell your managing agent the urgent nature of the repair or replacement, the application can most often be walked through and approved in a day or two.


Dear Residents.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY


The driver should always pay special attention to the pedestrian and the bicyclist. However, there are certain safety rules which pedestrians and bicyclists should follow.

THE PEDESTRIAN (person on foot)

Laws and Other Safety Tips for Pedestrians

- Obey all traffic control signals unless you are otherwise directed by a pedestrian control signal.
- Do not cross the street between two intersections. It is dangerous to cross in the middle of the block.
- Use sidewalks when available, and do not walk/jog in the street.
- Walk/jog on the left side of the road if there are no sidewalks and step off the pavement when a car approaches.
- If you cross a street at any point other than within a crosswalk at an intersection, you (the pedestrian) must yield the right-of-way to all vehicles.
- If you cross a street without using a pedestrian tunnel or overhead pedestrian crossing which has been provided, you the pedestrian must yield the right-of-way to all vehicles.
- When crossing at a crosswalk, keep right if possible.
- Blind, partially blind, or disabled persons may carry a white cane while walking. Others must not display such a cane on any public street or highway.
- No person may stand in the roadway for the purpose of soliciting a ride, contributions, or business. A person may stand in a roadway to solicit a charitable contribution if authorized to do so by the local authority having jurisdiction over the roadway.
- Do not suddenly walk or run into the street in the path of a vehicle. These sudden actions may make it impossible for the vehicle operator to yield.
- Wait on the curb, not in the street, until the traffic signals change to green or read "Walk."
- Always wear white or light colored clothing, or carry a light or reflector when walking/jogging when dark.
- **Look both ways before crossing** the street and before stepping from behind parked cars.
- Be extra careful when getting off a streetcar or bus.
- Get in and out of cars on the curb side of the road when possible.
- Do not walk on a roadway when you are under the influence or consuming an alcoholic beverage. Alcohol is a contributing factor to pedestrian traffic crashes.
- If you see a pedestrian crossing or attempting to cross the street, slow down, use your horn if necessary, and be prepared to
- Be alert to a pedestrian guided by an assistance animal or carrying a white cane. A driver shall take the necessary precautions to avoid injuring or endangering a pedestrian crossing or attempting to cross the street. The driver shall bring the vehicle to a full stop if injury or danger can only be avoided by that action. Remember, the white cane indicates the person may be blind, partially blind, or disabled.
- Watch especially for blind persons at bus stops, intersections, business areas, and near schools for the blind.
- Pedestrians should be aware that local authorities (cities, counties) may have ordinances that require pedestrians to comply strictly with the directions of an official traffic control (signals, signs, etc.) and prohibit pedestrians from crossing a roadway in a business district or a designated highway except in a crosswalk

Did You Know? You can't call yourself a Christian and not love Jesus Christ. True believers are more than simply people with an intellectual understanding of God. True believers have outward marks of belief which reflect their belief in Christ as Lord and Savior. Their hearts have been regenerated (born again), and their lives are characterized by repentance from dead works. They now live lives of obedience to God seeking to worship Him through their obedience.

Now the change of heart that Christians experience when they believe in Christ is not one of their own doing. All true Christians, prior to being saved, were dead in sin, and it is God alone – not our human choice – who brings us to life spiritually (Eph. 2:4). Then God instills new desires within the new hearts of new believers. God enables them to love Him and to worship Him. Salvation is utterly, in every facet, the work of God. Believers in Christ are new creatures, and their old form of life has passed away (2 Cor. 5:17). The grace God shows them is all His work, and that's why their salvation is called "grace." Eternal salvation in Christ comes BY God's grace, THROUGH faith in Christ, and it is UNTO good works (Eph. 2:8-10). The ability to perform godly works comes as a result of the washing and renewing work of the Holy Spirit within us (Titus 3:5). That cleansing work (called regeneration) is also a work of renovation. And our inward transformation manifests itself outwardly through our service to Jesus Christ.

Consider what Jesus says in John 10:26-27: You do not believe because you are not of My sheep. My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me. First, those who reject Jesus Christ are not his children. Conversely, those who do believe are God's children. Second, God's children hear the voice of Jesus – the Shepherd of God's sheep. The idea of hearing Jesus' voice in John 10:27 is synonymous with following Jesus; it carries the idea of discipleship. And discipleship involves leaving everything to follow Jesus (Mark 10:28; cf. Luke 5:11). God's true children not only hear Christ's voice, they follow that voice leaving everything else behind.

On the other hand, those who do not follow Jesus are not God's children. They are God's *creation*, for all are part of His creation; they're just not His children. And if they are not His children, then they are children of the devil (1 John 3:10). Now this truth may not get much attention from atheists, agnostics, and other unbelievers, but when you consider that most professed Christians today don't know a thing about God's Word it becomes a great concern. Why? Because most professed Christians today know little to nothing about the Bible, so therefore they don't ever "hear" Christ's voice leading them. And because most preachers care little about preaching truth from the Bible church-goers are rarely ever lead by or to Christ.

There are simply too many people today who call themselves Christians who aren't. They know nothing about what saving faith really is, and they know little to nothing about true love for Jesus. The only way to love Jesus is to know Jesus, and the only way to know Jesus is to read the Bible and see what the eyewitnesses of his life recorded. Bible readers will soon learn that Jesus is God incarnate, and He is the creator of the universe and the giver of eternal salvation. He rebukes sinfulness and the people who live continually in it. He offered himself as a once-and-for-all sacrifice to atone for man's sinfulness, and those who truly believe this live for Christ – they love him! And their outward actions loudly proclaim their love for Him.

The Thing I Value Most — It had been some time since Jack had seen the old man. College, girls, career, and life itself got in the way. In fact, Jack moved clear across the country in pursuit of his dreams. There, in the rush of his busy life, Jack had little time to think about the past and often no time to spend with his wife and son. He was working on his future, and nothing could stop him. Over the phone, his mother told him, "Mr. Belser died last night. The funeral is Wednesday." Memories flashed through his mind like an old newsreel as he sat quietly remembering his childhood days. Gums Receding and Causing Sensitivity?

Dear Friends,

Why does gum recession happen? Have you ever had sensitivity at the root of the tooth where gums are receding? It is not difficult to fix, but you want your dentist to get to the cause of it. Lot of people come to my office and tell me that their previous dentist have told them that they brush too hard. From my experience, that is hardly ever the case.

Here are some of the reasons for gums receding which can cause sensitivity to cold or even worse, over time, damage the nerve for good.

Bite being a problem, as the bite may be putting too much force on certain teeth. Make sure your dentist checks your bite thoroughly at every visit since it changes frequently.

The gums around the teeth are very thin, thus easy to recede due to the above reason.

A crown that is put on a tooth is too thick at its edge, which goes down inside the gums, thus irritating the gums and making it recede. You will see continuous redness instead of pink, firm gums.

Bacterial infection from just not brushing and flossing well can also make the gums recede.

Treatments such as fillings, gum grafting, and just simple fluoride treatments are available. However, same thing will recur if the cause is not taken care of first.

Positive Thinking: Berries On The Brain

(NAPSA)-"Losing your mind" is the tongue-in-cheek term used to describe the loss in memory that we experience as we age. Although a decline in memory is a normal aging process, researchers are looking for ways to delay its onset or progression or, better yet, prevent it altogether. So far, the best strategies for preserving brain health appear to be the very same ones that may also protect against other chronic diseases such as heart disease and cancer: a healthy diet and exercise.

New research shows that eating delicious foods such as strawberries may help prevent the decline in learning and motor skills commonly seen with aging. In a new study out of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Human Nutrition Research Center on Aging at Tufts University, researchers sped up the may help keep the brain aging process in laboratory animals and then healthy as we age. added strawberries to their meals. ditions to their diet helped preserve the animals' ability to learn, remember and relearn different patterns in a maze.

There are several reasons why strawberries may be effective. Previous research has shown that damage to the brain by harmful substances called free radicals plays an important role in the decline of brain function. Strawberries are rich in anti-oxidants that destroy these free radicals; a study ranking the anti-oxidant content per serving of over 1,000 foods and beverages ranked strawberries third overall, behind only blackberries and walnuts.

Strawberries are an excellent source of vitamin C and other anti-oxidants that may help protect the brain as it ages. Strawberries are also a good source of folate, an important B vitamin that, along with vitamin B12, helps maintain normal levels of a protein called homocysteine. An analysis of older U.S. women in a 2004 Nurses' Health Study found that those women with the highest levels of folate and vitamin B12 were cognitively equivalent to being about five years younger.

It's easy to incorporate strawberries into meals and snacks. Strawberries are a terrific way to get your morning off to a great start. Top a whole-grain English muffin with low-fat cream cheese and sliced strawberries or make a smoothie with fresh berries. Strawberries can be a sweet addition to any salad. You can dress up entrŽes of grilled chicken, beef or broiled seafood with salsas or sauces made with strawberries. And they can be added to desserts or simply eaten whole or sliced for an end-of-meal treat or snack.

So add some anti-oxidant-rich fruits such as strawberries into your diet as often as you can. Your brain will thank you for it.





Successful Weight Control

It's not just cutting calories

Eating less, or cutting back on fat in your diet, won't keep the weight off. What you really need to do is strike a good balance between the number of calories you consume and the number you burn. And the only way to do that is to exercise.

Don't groan! By exercising, you can lose weight while you eat more calories than if you simply went on a diet. Regular physical activity is much more effective at keeping the weight off in the long run than any diet. **One choice is aerobic exercise**

With aerobic exercise, you can lose weight without drastically reducing the calories you consume or sacrificing important nutritional needs. One reason for this is because aerobic exercise not only elevates your metabolism while you're exercising, it can also keep it elevated even after you're done, depending of course on how long and how strong you exercise.

You've probably heard about exercise programs that actually turn your body into a ''fat-burning machine." Aerobics can do that. An aerobic program you stick with can help you lose weight easier because it can stimulate your body and make it burn calories.

If weight control is your goal, some types of aerobic activity will work better than others. Low-impact aerobics, like walking, step aerobics and low-impact aerobic dance are your best bets. Some good no-impact aerobic activities you can benefit from include swimming, bicycling and rowing.

If you're just getting started, begin with as

little as 15 minutes of low-impact aerobics three times a week. Gradually increase to 30 minutes of moderate aerobic activity four times a week.

Strength training = weight management



Your muscles burn calories during physical activity. What you may not know is your muscles also burn calories when your body is at rest. Increase your muscle mass, and you'll be increasing your body's capacity to burn calories both during activity and at rest.

Add to that the research that shows diets that restrict calories substantially can cause the loss of lean muscle mass, along with the loss of fat. By incorporating strength training into your activity program, as well as following a moderate diet, you'll be able to maintain lean muscle mass while you lose fat.

Start any strength-training program with one set of exercises and a weight that allows you to complete eight to 12 repetitions. Your program should exercise your legs, arms, chest and upper back. If you want to strengthen your stomach and lower back, increase the number of repetitions with weights that offer less resistance.

Success means good eating and good exercise

Follow a moderate low-fat diet and an exercise program that combines aerobic activity and strength training. That's the key to losing weight - and keeping it off.

Begin slowly with exercises you find comfortable and build as your body becomes accustomed to the activity level. Don't start out too hard or too fast. Chances are you may injure yourself or quit before you've done yourself much good.

And remember, you can't lose weight overnight. Set a realistic weight-loss goal for yourself-like one to two pounds a week - eat healthy, get going on a program of regular physical activity, and you'll be delighted by what you accomplish.

Maintaining a lower, healthier body weight is something you can accomplish. So start now and keep on going!



Resistant Bacteria Increasing Source Of Muscle Infection

Baylor College of Medicine

An antibiotic-resistant bacteria called methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA) is increasingly a cause of muscle infections in children, said Baylor College of Medicine (BCM) researchers in a report in the journal Clinical Infectious Diseases.

The report appears online at http://www.journals.uchicago.edu/CID/journal/contents/v43n8.html in the October 15, 2006, issue.

"We had noticed an increase in the number of muscle infections," said Dr. Pia Pannaraj, a post-doctoral fellow in the department of pediatrics' section of infectious diseases at BCM. She said that in recent years, she and her colleagues at Texas Children's Hospital had started to see a case of the MRSA muscle infection every month. In the cases she studied, the infection was acquired in the community, she said.

"I think it is important for parents to be aware that this bacterial infection can exist," she said. "They should seek care from their child's primary physician if there are symptoms of such an infection, such as a child limping or if there is redness or swelling in an extremity."

Houston, in particular, has a high rate of MRSA infections. More than 75 percent of community-acquired staphylococcal infections treated at Texas Children's Hospital are MRSA (resistant to the antibiotics commonly used to treat these infections in the past), she said. The rate of such infections is increasing nationwide.

In surveying patient records, Pannaraj and her colleagues found that in 60 percent of the 45 previously healthy children with the muscle infections called myositis and pyomyositis, the cause was a form of bacteria - either Staphylococcus aureus or Streptococcus pyogenes. The infections occurred between 2000 and 2005. Fifteen of the 26 S. aureus infections tested were methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA) forms of the bacteria that were circulating in the community. The other infections were forms of staphylococcal bacteria that were not resistant to methicillin, an antibiotic.

It is important the doctors treating patients for skin infections such as cellulitis to use antibiotics that will cure the resistant forms of the bacteria, said Pannarai.

"Be aware that this is out there," she said. "When someone comes in, doctors should be aware that this could be a muscle abscess."

Antibiotics that successfully treat MRSA include oral clindamycin and trimethoprim-sulfamethoxazole, which are usually used out of the hospital, and vancomycin or clindamycin, which is given intravenously, usually to hospitalized patients.

The form of MRSA that is acquired in the community spreads more easily than that usually caught in the hospital, said Pannaraj.

"That's why I am seeing it in otherwise healthy children," she said.

She and her colleagues are trying to find out why this particular form of the bacteria spreads so easily. Her studies are focusing on specific genes. One, pvl, permits holes to be poked into the cells, damaging them irreparably.

"There seems to be an association between bacteria carrying the pvl gene and the severity of disease," she said. However, she said, they have not yet determined whether the problem is this specific gene or another that is close
