Letter from the Board of Directors

As we approach the end of the year the Board is happy to report significant progress on several projects on our **priority list** created at the Annual Board Retreat (see complete list below). The baby pool task force committee has written a full report including a conceptual drawing of the new Baby Pool design. The Amenities committee is moving forward with the Wildflower Park playscape and park addition. The board has approved the 2007 budget which will be published along with the Annual Report in the January 2007 Newsletter edition. We have recently reviewed the association's insurance policies and are making a few changes which will result in over ten thousand dollars in savings.

The board hosted the first **Board of Directors Town Hall** on October 19th at 6:30pm at the Circle C Child Development Center and there were about a dozen residents in attendance. The next meeting will be held on Thursday, December 21st at the Circle C Child Development Center. The board will host a Town Hall the third Thursday of the month in order to increase communications with residents and allow for a more informal setting for residents to address the board. The meeting will be held from 6:30pm to 8:00pm and homeowners can sign up beginning at 6:15pm. Residents will be asked to limit their comments to 5 minutes each. Board Members will be allowed to respond and/or ask questions for an additional 5 minutes after each resident. At the end of the 10 minutes the meeting will move on to the next resident. The Model Code will be followed by all attendees (Model Code printed in this newsletter).

We are also gearing up for our **Annual Holiday Events** including the Kid's and Adult Holiday Parties, and the Holiday Lighting Contest (see inside for further details). Hopefully you are already enjoying the wonderful lights on display in our common areas. We wish you a safe and happy holiday season!

Deed Restriction Review

Deed Restriction Review - In December we will be driving sections (17) seventeen and (18) eighteen (please see map). We are looking for turf with excessive weeds, turf that is not mowed or edged, lack of maintenance on the exterior of your home, unauthorized vehicles such as boats, trailers and RV's just to name a few. *Due to the extreme temperatures this summer there are many yards that have suffered considerably and it is difficult to determine at this point whether grass will come back or has died completely. Due to this, we will be driving the entire neighborhood at the beginning of March 2007 to look at turf conditions only. If at that time we find yards that have areas of dead turf we will require that these area of turf be replaced.

We are required by Texas State Law to notify owners in writing via certified mail of a deed restriction violation. We also send correspondence via regular mail to ensure that you receive. If you receive a notice and have questions, please contact the HOA office at 288-8663 or via email at info@circelcranch.info to discuss. 

The Dedication Ceremony for Nan Clayton Elementary School took place on Sunday, November 5, 2006 and was well attended by students, their families, faculty, CCHOA neighbors, AISD Trustees and elected officials. Nan Clayton and her family were also in attendance at the ceremony. The Kiker Elementary School eight classroom addition is nearing completion, with substantial construction to be completed by November 24, 2006. Mills Elementary School will be receiving a play slab cover, which was also scheduled for completion during the month of November.

The SW Middle School, to be located at the corner of 1826 and Slaughter Lane has been moved to Phase III of the 2004 Bond Program, which moves the completion up to the fall of 2009. 



Child Safety - Speeding Cars

On a recent Sunday afternoon, my husband and I sat in our front yard watching our children and our neighbors' children playing and riding bikes. What I saw in the course of fewer than 30 minutes appalled and saddened me. We live on Gorham Glen Lane, known as "The Speedway." It is common to see the ignorant kids in cars flying down the street, but this particular afternoon the offenders were adults, many with children in the car. A ball rolled out into the street and an adult male driver with an adult woman seated next to him, and at least one child seated behind him, swerved around the ball without slowing. It's a good thing one of the children didn't get in the way and delay them in reaching their destination! At one point, a child was in the street trying to get started on her bike after having to stop for a car when a small pick up truck came careening down the street. The driver did slow the vehicle, however, when my husband and I mouthed, "Slow down, please," the adult female in the passenger seat shared an unfriendly hand gesture. The most shocking incident was when a black convertible driven by a girl in her late teens/early twenties sped down the street, screeched its tires to make an abrupt turn, screeched again into a neighbor's driveway, backed out without looking behind her, and turned around. As a child was trying to cross

the street, we yelled at the child to stop and then at the driver to go since she was behaving recklessly. As if this isn't bad enough, the woman seated next to the girl, either her mother, or a woman old enough to be her mother, gave us a dirty look and threw her hands in the air as they sped down the street. To everyone who is guilty of driving dangerously and selfishly on any neighborhood street, I raise the following questions – Are you setting the desired example for your child(ren)? Are you raising a responsible, considerate person? Are the few minutes you save by speeding down a neighborhood street worth risking the lives of children who have not done anything to you and who deserve a safe place to play? Finally, what if it was your child?

them several months ago. Back by popular demand, Park West HOA will install new cork bulletin boards in the same spot, for your personal use. Please note that Circle C Ranch Bulletin Board Guidelines will apply (a copy will be posted on each board). The closed bulletin boards at the front of the mail centers will continue to be utilized for official Park West information.

Preparing for next spring's lawn starts now. The landscaper has applied winter applications of pre-emergent weed killers and fertilizer. If Park West has no rainfall, you can help your lawn with a bi-weekly watering. Although the grass you see is dormant, since hard freezes are rare in Austin, grass roots are active year round and need water. If we don't receive winter rains, winter watering will help ensure a beautiful summer lawn.

Park West Rules, which were discussed in the PWHOA article in November's Circle C Newsletter, are in their final review and will be mailed to all home owners soon.

Two real estate companies illegally posted advertisements on our door knobs in November despite the "No Solicitation" notices posted at both gates. The companies were called and reminded of our "No Solicitation" policy, and they agreed heed the notices in the future.





Neither Rain Nor Gloom of Night- A Rough Guide to Keeping Happy When Cycling in the Winter Season

When the cooler months hit and temperatures drop, many cyclists hang up their bikes and wait until spring. For those keen enough, or wanting to get out on that new and shiny road bike or MTB this winter season, dressing for success will increase your enjoyment and safety.

To business- basic rules of thumb:

- 1. Dressing in layers permits you to adjust as the day, and your body, warms
- 2. Look for fabrics that breathe, they are the most comfortable
- 3. If you are comfortable for the first 15 minutes of the ride-you are probably overdressed!
- 4. A few high quality items are all you need
- 5. Take some extra clothing in your car, you or someone else might need it

NOTE: Overdressing can be as uncomfortable as under-dressing. Too many layers will cause you to sweat (even in cold weather), which will expose you to chills when you stop riding and as your body starts to cool down.

Layers, layers, layers and more layers.

To ride in the cooler weather, the best way is to clothe yourself in layers. As you ride, you will sweat- or glow, if female and layering allows you to peel off a layer or two as the weather (or you) warm up. Efficient and effective transportation of sweat away from your body is the key to being and staying comfortable. The layers closest to your skin should be made of a 'wicking' material such as Coolmax®, or polypropylene to transport, or wick, the moisture away from your body keeping the skin dry.

The middle layer adds warmth, if needed. Technical materials are less bulky and highly efficient and include synthetics such as fleece and heavier polypropylene, for that retro look a wool jersey would be de rigueur, conversely a long sleeved t-shirt or sweat shirt would suffice or really show your colours and wear the CCRCC jersey (available in Jan 07 and if interested, order now- book early to avoid disappointment!).

The outer layer should be windproof and breathable. A long zip front is more versatile than a pullover style and something light enough to fold into a pocket or seat pack is ideal.

Don not overheat. As a rule if you find yourself a little cold before you start, then you will probably be just right when you are riding.

This old Cotton T shirt will do, won't it?

Cotton is incredibly good at absorbing and retaining moisture, which is why towels are made of it- wearing wet cotton next to the skin will be like wearing that towel and will quickly chill you down causing discomfort and, potentially, hypothermia. Better to leave cotton T shirts, socks, under garments at home when cycling.

Head Start

For those hirsute males, you might be able to get away with just your helmet on those chilly days and a skull cap works well for the rest of us. Ear warmers can also be worn and are a plus if the wind gets up.

Arm Yourself

Arm warmers are just warm sleeves that can be added to a short sleeve jersey (such as the rather fetching CCRCC jerseys) for warmth.

They are highly versatile and can be pulled down as the temperature rises (and either worn as wrist cuffs or removed entirely and stowed) and should be in every cyclists winter wardrobe.

Knees and Toes

Muscles generate heat through exercise and the legs are the principal muscle groups working when cycling, keeping these muscles at optimal temperature is key to enjoyment. Cycling tights can be worn over the cycling shorts or a more versatile method is to use leg warmers. Before you pull out your fluorescent green 'Fame' leg warmers that you wore with pride all those years ago- you know the ones, look at cycling specific leg warmers. Similar in concept to arm warmers, these are really trouser legs designed to be added to cycling shorts to create long trousers that have the advantage of being able to peel off the legs as the weather improves. Some have windproof panels over the knees and are contoured to fit and should find their place next to the arm warmers in your list of desirable clothing.

If the weather degrades further, then neoprene booties go over your shoes and keep those toes toasty and dry- very useful.

Hands

Full-fingered cycling gloves are what you need. Mittens and the two-fingered gloves are probably warmer, but keeping control of your bike is more of a priority.

You are never fully dressed without a smile

All of these items make nice stocking stuffers for this time of the year and Bicycle Sport Shop has a great holiday sale on and has (very) knowledgeable staff and a super selection of gear.

Proper clothing will keep you smiling as the miles go by, no matter what the weather. So dress well and come out to join your neighbors of all cycling abilities at a CCRCC Saturday morning ride. Join us at Starbucks on Saturday mornings at 0900 or just come along at that time to meet us and talk. Conversely come to Satellite Café on 14 December at 6:00 PM for our monthly meeting, meet your neighbors, find out about cycling, enjoy the company and the discounted food, drink. See you there.
