



ARCHITECTURAL APPLICATIONS

Now that the Holiday season is approaching, you may be considering making changes or additions to your home. Please be reminded that anything that alters the exterior aesthetic appearance of your home, i.e., basketball goal, play equipment (including trampolines), patio cover, storage building, satellite dish, etc. must have your Association's approval prior to construction or installation.

If you're building something that has a roof and/or sides, i.e., patio cover, storage building, you will need to include the following along with your application: materials including roofing, dimensions, height (measured from ground to peak), width and length, and a copy of your lot survey indicating the proposed location and a side view elevation drawing. Remember, metal, plastic, etc. are not permitted.

If you plan to install play equipment, please include a copy of your lot survey showing the proposed location, the dimensions of the equipment (height, width and length) and color of the tarp.

If you're painting your home, please include a sample of the color(s) you wish to use.

Basketball goals....include a copy of your recorded lot survey indicating the proposed location where you wish to keep the goal.


Keep in mind that installation/construction may not commence until you have received your Association's approval.

It's a real easy process and takes no time at all to adhere to your governing documents. An application as well as your Governing Documents can be obtained on line.



STREET DRAINAGE

We've had some concerns raised about rain water not subsiding quickly enough and coming onto front lawns.

When storm sewers are planned, they are done so by Harris County standards and those design standards must be followed. Storm lines are designed for a two year storm event, whereas the channels are designed for a 100 year event. Once the water reaches approximately 6 inches above the top of the curb, the initial water has reached the ditch, allowing additional water to flow, thereby permitting the water to subside. The design of the storm sewers are to permit water to pond in the street, like a detention pond. Also, there are grills in the storm drains which are meant to catch debris that enters the drain and may sometimes impede the smooth flow of drainage. Please report anyone seen putting anything, grass clippings, etc. in the storm drains. For everyone's benefit, these drains must be kept clear of debris.

If your street drains particularly slow please report it to Severn Trent (281-398-8211) and ask that they check for items impeding drainage in your storm sewer.



PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

The driver should always pay special attention to the pedestrian and the bicyclist. However, there are certain safety rules which pedestrians and bicyclists should follow.

THE PEDESTRIAN (person on foot)

Laws and Other Safety Tips for Pedestrians

- Obey all traffic control signals unless you are otherwise directed by a pedestrian control signal.
- Do not cross the street between two intersections. It is dangerous to cross in the middle of the block.
- Use sidewalks when available, and do not walk/jog in the street.
- Walk/jog on the left side of the road if there are no sidewalks and step off the pavement when a car approaches.
- If you cross a street at any point other than within a crosswalk at an intersection, you (the pedestrian) must yield the right-of-way to all vehicles.
- If you cross a street without using a pedestrian tunnel or overhead pedestrian crossing which has been provided, you the pedestrian must yield the right-of-way to all vehicles.
- When crossing at a crosswalk, keep right if possible.
- Blind, partially blind, or disabled persons may carry a white cane while walking. Others must not display such a cane on any
 public street or highway.
- No person may stand in the roadway for the purpose of soliciting a ride, contributions, or business. A person may stand in a roadway to solicit a charitable contribution if **authorized to do so by the local authority having jurisdiction over the roadway**.
- Do not suddenly walk or run into the street in the path of a vehicle. These sudden actions may make it impossible for the vehicle operator to yield.
- Wait on the curb, not in the street, until the traffic signals change to green or read "Walk."
- Always wear white or light colored clothing, or carry a light or reflector when walking/jogging when dark.
- Look both ways before crossing the street and before stepping from behind parked cars.
- Be extra careful when getting off a streetcar or bus.
- Get in and out of cars on the curb side of the road when possible.
- Do not walk on a roadway when you are under the influence or consuming an alcoholic beverage. Alcohol is a contributing factor to pedestrian traffic crashes.
- If you see a pedestrian crossing or attempting to cross the street, slow down, use your horn if necessary, and be prepared to stop.
- Be alert to a pedestrian guided by an assistance animal or carrying a white cane. A driver shall take the necessary precautions to avoid injuring or endangering a pedestrian crossing or attempting to cross the street. The driver shall bring the vehicle to a full stop if injury or danger can only be avoided by that action. Remember, the white cane indicates the person may be blind, partially blind, or disabled.
- Watch especially for blind persons at bus stops, intersections, business areas, and near schools for the blind.

FSA – SPRING 2007 BASEBALL and SOFTBALL INFORMATION



Believe it or not the upcoming 2007 spring baseball and softball season is just around the corner! While it seems as far from spring as possible, the growth of baseball and softball leagues, coupled with the attempt to finish closely to the end of May will have us registering in early January.

Recently, the baseball and softball committee met during their annual winter meeting in order to ready the association for the upcoming spring season. For the most part everything will stay consistent with last year in terms of the game schedules and length of season. A few modifications have been made in an attempt to more adequately finish the regular season and provide an end-of-the-season tournament for the competitive age divisions (t-ball is not considered competitive) in both softball and baseball. Knowing that weather readily plays into our ability to keep to our proposed schedule we will do our best to finish near the end of May as possible. This is something we strive for on a yearly basis, yet cannot guarantee it and some games may slip into early June.

For baseball, please be reminded that the FSA does not offer a 13/14 year old age division. In addition, a child MUST be 4 years of age by April 30, 2007 in order to play instructional t-ball (no 3 year olds will be accepted).

For softball, we are excited about the growth and have reached a point of realignment and expansion of our older age divisions to better accommodate the development of our players. This year we will offer the Sweetees (5/6 t-ball), Darlings (7/8 coach pitch), Angels (9/10 modified kid pitch) and Ponytails (11-13 kid pitch).

A gentle reminder that the below dates, outside of the registration days, represent our planned calendar, yet can take a slightly different form due to a variance in registration numbers or inclement weather causing delays to the schedule. Please look to the website for the registration form, closer to the time of registration.

Spring Registration: January 6 and January 13

(look to website for location details)

Coaches Meetings: Week of January 15 Tryouts / Drafts: Week of January 22

(no tryouts or draft for any t-ball divisions)

Practices Start: Week of January 29
Games Start: Week of February 19

Opening Ceremony: February 27

Season End: Last week of May / first week of June

Please note that late registrations will not be accepted via e-mail, voice mail or through the recreation center this spring. There will be a one-time late sign-up date published on the website to handle all late registrations and after this date, NO further registrations will be accepted (late registrations based on availability, not guaranteed). Unfortunately, our size has dictated a more strict approach to this in order to handle all of the administration duties and preparation necessary to start the season.

In addition to the season schedule, there are not many changes to report in terms of the baseball/softball association for the upcoming season.

- ⇒ From a facilities standpoint most of the major capital improvements to our grounds were completed last year (new field, irrigation, sod work, bleachers, and scoreboards, etc.).
- ⇒ Practices at the time of this insert will be held at the Cypresswood Practice Facility as well as the "Hill" at the recreation center grounds and possibly one of the elementary schools.
- ⇒ No major changes were enacted by Dixie Youth for the baseball age divisions that are a part of this affiliation.
- ⇒ At the conclusion of this past year, there were some inquiries as to whether the baseball committee was considering a change of their affiliation from Dixie Youth to Little League. The short answer is that a subcommittee was formed and did have a fact-finding meeting with Little League, yet no changes are in place for the upcoming season, nor are any planned for the immediate future. This is a much more complex issue than what the surface level may appear and the affiliation issue in general requires a much more thorough study.

Lastly, I remind everyone to find a way to take part in your association. We are a volunteer organization and have jobs ranging from field maintenance to concessions duties that simply take people in order to provide the best facilities, amenities and baseball league for our children. I urge you to familiarize yourself with the Baseball Committee via our website and reach out to them to see how you can help. If you are interested in becoming a part of our association, please contact a baseball or softball committee representative! One of the growing activities is to become a part of our nightly field maintenance program (The Llamas)...it is a great way to help, plus get to know some folks and most of all assist in providing the best fields around!



People from the Woodlands, Kingwood, and Sugar Land **made** the drive to participate in the family event.

Pushing a stroller with two good-sized toddlers in it, Daniel Lawton still took first place in the men's division with a time of 19 minutes, 18 seconds.

"I had a terrible time staying out in front of him," said Jeanie Stahl, the lead cyclist about Daniel. "I kept hearing his footsteps right behind me and had to keep pedaling hard so he wouldn't catch up with me. And he carried on a conversation the whole time with the kids in the stroller!"

Daniel's brother Mark Lawton followed in second place with a time of 20:02 and Carlos Concha took third in 24:37.

First place in the women's division was taken by Sarah Spence with a time of 24:55. Rosa Shalang came in second at 25:47 and Shilo Duvall was third finishing at 26:27.

Following the race the crowd congregated in front of the Athletic Club to enjoy refreshments, raffle prize drawing and a costume contest. All items were donated by local area businesses.



Gums Receding and Causing Sensitivity?

Dear Friends,

First of all, we want to wish you the happiest of holidays and seasons greetings.

I believe to make the world a better place, we all need to take some time out to help those less fortunate then us. Even small good deeds add up, so I encourage all to open up your hearts and take an opportunity to make a difference.

Some basic advice from Dr. Sundrani:

Do not share toothbrushes with anyone. Bacteria and diseases can be transferred to those sharing the toothbrush.

Store the tooth brushes upright, and make sure they don't touch other toothbrushes when stored.

Do not store the toothbrushes in a closed container. This, over the long run, harbors bacteria.

Replace toothbrushes every 3 months and for children, more often because the bristles get worn real easily. Once they are worn, they do not clean effectively.

If you are sick and using a tooth brush, change it out immediately as you get better.

Harvest Bible Church

Did You Know? The term "fellowship" is used often in churches. We get together for a planned fellowship (a noun), we have fellowship (a verb), we go fellowshipping (a participle) and we even name our buildings "Fellowship Hall." Most often the term is used to signify people getting together to talk, relax, play sports, or eat meals together. But as enjoyable as these kinds of events can be they are not a reflection of what true biblical fellowship really

The New Testament was originally penned in Greek, yet nowhere in the Greek text do any of the Greek words translated "fellowship" ever involve fun and games. What they do involve is participation in something spiritual. In 2 Corinthians 8:4 the Greek term is used in relation to participating in giving financial relief to other Christians. The book of 1 Timothy says as much in 1 Tim. 6:18 when it speaks of being rich in good works and showing generosity in giving financially ready to "share" (fellowship).

The Apostle Paul thanked the Philippian Christians for their "fellowship in the gospel" (1:5) because they were participating with him by continuing to preach the gospel – even though Paul was in prison for preaching Christ at the time (1:7). So it appears that the kind of fellowship Paul spoke of in this context, namely preaching Christ, was the kind that brought severe persecution. Now that's a far cry from church members playing softball together!

It is the Christian's responsibility to imitate Jesus Christ's humility and his self-sacrificial love (Philippians 2:5-8) through the "fellowship of the Spirit" (Philippians 2:1). This kind of fellowship concerns a common participation in the fruits of the Holy Spirit which are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Gal. 5:22-23), and these can be shared together in many contexts. When is the last time you had fellowship in your church regarding those nine traits?

Christians have the incredible privilege of knowing in some small way the "fellowship of Christ's sufferings, becoming like him in his death" (Philippians 3:10) by simply humbling ourselves as Christ did and taking up the nature of a servant in order to glorify God. We also have that same privilege in the mystery of the Lord's Supper (Communion). The Apostle Paul said, "The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not participation (fellowship) in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not participation in the body of Christ?" (1 Cor. 10:16). So the Lord's Supper – eating together with other Christians and remembering the death of Christ – is true fellowship. What a travesty for Christians who never attend church or participate.

The Bible is clear as to what true fellowship is. It ought not ever be taken lightly or misunderstood. Biblical fellowship should always be accompanied by Bible teaching, submissive prayer, and even ministry to the poor (Acts 2:42-47). When it was done this way in the early church God brought the church into great favor with the community around them, and He added to the church people in great numbers (Acts 2:47). Apparently good fellowship also works evangelistically because people take note. They can't help but

Biblical fellowship pleases God and adds new believers to the fold. Actually the answer to "How to Do Church" is wrapped up in one single passage: "And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to praying" (Acts 2:42).

Harvest Bible Church is a conservative evangelical church where the Bible is not only believed but taught verse-by-verse. Empty Nest Chance To Chase Forgotten Dreams

Baylor College of Medicine

Middle age woes are hard enough to deal with, but throw in empty nest syndrome and it is a recipe for potential depression.

Psychologists at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston say not to look at it as an ending, but as the beginning of a new stage in life with more time to travel, develop new hobbies, rediscover forgotten dreams and get to know your spouse all over again.

Empty nest syndrome can happen twice in an adult's life, once when the kids start kindergarten and again when they move out of the house. The more challenging of the two is when adolescents move out of the house to begin their adult lives.

"Parents have channeled all of their energy into their children for so long they may not know what to do with their time once they leave," says Dr. James Bray, associate professor of family and community medicine at BCM. "It is actually one of the high points when looking at the divorce rate scale. The numbers really tend to go up during middle age."

When people are unhappy in their marriage they usually have internal anxiety about something else, like not knowing what to do with the rest of their lives after the kids leave.

"It is natural to reevaluate your life every so often and even more natural during this stage in a parent's life," says Bray. "Don't just assume that if you leave your spouse you will make the unhappiness go away. Marriage takes time and energy, so make the effort to get reacquainted."

It is a good idea to talk with friends to reevaluate goals and take note of some lifelong dreams you haven't had time to accomplish, says

Now that the kids have moved out, there may be more time to take dance classes, travel, exercise or go back to college to retool skills.

Kids need to remember to stand up for themselves if parents become too needy or clingy. Setting a phone schedule can eliminate the out-ofcontrol calling by some parents, while reassuring them can eliminate needless worry.

"Kids can also consult with counselors if they really have an issue with a clingy parent or one that is having a difficult time dealing with the separation," says Bray.

The empty nest transition usually lasts six months to a year, depending on how well parents can adjust to their newly found freedom.

Rules for exercising in the cold

- Check the temperature and wind conditions before you go out and do not exercise if conditions are dangerous.
- Keep your head, hands and feet warm.
- Dress in layers that can provide a trapped layer of dry air near the skin (avoid cotton sweats and other similar materials).
- Warm the air you are breathing if temperatures are below your comfort level (usually around 0° F).



Exercising In The Cold

The biggest concern for exercising in the cold is hypothermia, or too much heat loss. When you exercise in a cold environment you must consider one primary factor: how much heat will your body lose during exercise?

Heat loss is controlled in two ways:

- 1. Insulation, consisting of body fat plus cloth-
- 2. Environmental factors, including temperature, wind and whether you're exercising in the air or in the water. Each of these factors plays a role in the body's ability to maintain a comfortable temperature during exercise.

Insulation

Although many people aspire to have a lean figure, people with a little more body fat are better insulated and will lose less heat. Clothing adds to the insulation barrier and is clearly the most important element in performance and comfort while exercising in the cold. One study showed that heat loss from the head alone was about 50 percent at the freezing mark, and by simply wearing a helmet, subjects were able to stay outside indefinitely.

Clothing is generally a good insulator because it has the ability to trap air, a poor conductor of heat. If the air trapped by the clothing cannot conduct the heat away from the body, temperature will be maintained. Unlike air, however, water is a rapid conductor of heat and even in the coldest of temperatures, people will sweat and risk significant heat loss. With this in mind, you want to choose clothing that can trap air but allow sweat to pass through, away from the body.

By wearing clothing in layers, you have the ability to change the amount of insulation that is needed while many new products can provide

such a layered barrier, it is important to avoid heavy cotton sweats or tightly woven material that will absorb and retain water. Because these materials cannot provide a layer of dry air near the skin, they can increase the amount of heat your body loses as you exercise.

Keeping the hands and feet warm is a common concern when exercising in the cold. Lower temperatures cause blood to be shunted away from the hands and feet to the center of the body to keep the internal organs warm and protected. Superficial warming of the hands will return blood flow to prevent tissue damage. Blood flow will not return to the feet unless the temperature of the torso is normal or slightly higher (.5-1.0 degree Fahrenheit (F) above normal). So, to keep your feet warm you must also keep the rest of your body warm at all times.

Check with the weatherman

Always check the air temperature and wind chill factor before exercising in the cold. Data from the National Safety Council suggest little danger to individuals with properly clothed skin exposed at 20° F, even with a 30 mph wind. A danger does exist for individuals with exposed skin when the wind chill factor (combined effect of temperature and wind) balls below minus 20°

That can be achieved by any combination of temperatures below 20° F with a wind of 40 mph and temperatures below minus 20° F with no wind. If you are exercising near the danger zone for skin exposure, it also is advisable to warm the air being inhaled by wearing a scarf or mask over your nose and mouth to warm the air being inhaled.

Holiday Sugar Plums

- cup butter or margarine
- cup confectioners' sugar
- 1½ tsp vanilla
- cups all-purpose flour
- cup quick rolled oats (optional)
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- cup finely chopped pecans $\frac{1}{2}$
- 48 Maraschino cherries (about one 16-oz. jar)

Confectioners' sugar for finishing

Drain Maraschino cherries thoroughly on paper towels and set aside. Put butter and ½ cup confectioners' sugar in a large mixing bowl. Beat with an electric mixer on medium speed three to four minutes, or until well mixed. Stir in vanilla. Add flour, oats and salt; mix well. Stir in pecans.

Shape about 2 teaspoons dough around each cherry. Place on an ungreased cookie sheet about one inch apart. Bake in a preheated 350°F. oven for 12 to 15 minutes, or until set but not brown. Role in confectioners' sugar while still warm. Cool.

For a fun presentation, use cherries with stems. Remove stems, bake as directed and then insert stems in cookies while they are still warm but after rolling in sugar. Makes 4 dozen.



Baylor College of Medicine

Kids look to parents for healthy, active holiday season

HOUSTON — The holiday season brings pumpkin pie and lots of turkey, but it should also include a healthy lesson for children, say nutritionists at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

Trying to create a new set of rules for holiday eating makes it hard to eat healthy, especially with the traditional once-a-year type of food that everyone enjoys.

"Help children create a healthy plate by mentally dividing the plate in half, one side for fruits and vegetables and the other side for protein and starchy foods," says Roberta Anding, instructor of pediatrics at BCM and a dietician at Texas Children's Hospital. "Hopefully, this is an everyday activity and as such sets the stage for the holidays."

Parents can also help by increasing the family's activity level. Engage children in holiday preparation by collecting pine cones for center pieces or playing a game of touch football rather than only watching it on TV.

Kids learn by example, which means parents should take an active role in their child's daily nutrition and not just during the holiday season, says Anding.

J-word makes people with holiday blues see red

HOUSTON — The solution to the holiday blues seems obvious to people who love this time of year. "Just cheer up," they say. "Just get into the holiday spirit."

If only shaking the holiday blues was "just" that easy, said Dr. Jon Allen, senior psychologist at The Menninger Clinic and professor of psychiatry in the Menninger Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Baylor College of Medicine. He refers to the word "just" as the "j-word."

"'Just' is a criticism," Allen said. "If you say to someone who has the holiday blues, 'Just cheer up,' it is actually going to make that person more upset."

In some cases, people cannot tolerate a friend or family member being unhappy during what they believe is supposed to be the happiest time of year. They may use the j-word to try to spur action and good feelings in someone who is feeling blue.

A better approach is to invite your friend or loved one to spend time with you. People who are feeling depressed seek seclusion and avoid the company of others. However, low-key activities can help elevate their mood.

Alzheimer's patients benefit from simple holiday strategies

HOUSTON — A few simple strategies can help draw isolated Alzheimer's patients back into holiday gatherings.

"Too much holiday noise and activity can confuse patients with Alzheimer's disease, causing them to withdraw from surrounding social activity," said Dr. Mary Kenan, assistant professor of neurology and a psychologist with the Alzheimer's Disease Research Center at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. "Disruption of routine for those with Alzheimer's can trigger behavioral symptoms, which makes caregiving more difficult."

To cut down on confusion, Kenan suggests asking family and friends to arrive at different times or visit in small groups.

"Patients with Alzheimer's disease can still enjoy the holidays," Kenan said. "Be sensitive to your loved one's strengths and limitations as well as to your own as a caregiver, and celebrate accordingly."

Holiday travels require attention to childproofing

HOUSTON — If a trip to Grandmother's house is in your holiday plans, check ahead to make certain her house is safe for children.

"Some of the relatives and friends you visit during the holidays might not be used to having young children around," said Dr. Teresa Duryea, associate professor of pediatrics at Baylor College of Medicine and pediatrician at Texas Children's Hospital. "Their homes could present some dangers."

Parents of young children are familiar with the need to keep medications and hazardous materials out of reach, but these substances often are easily accessible in homes without youngsters. Other seemingly harmless objects like treadmills and trampolines can also be a danger if children are left unsupervised. Outdoor hazards like swimming pools, rivers and ponds are another concern.

Duryea offered these suggestions to make your holiday stay as safe as possible:

- · Call ahead to remind hosts of your child's ability to climb, roam and put objects in his or her mouth.
- Lock rooms that might be unsafe for children
- Be sure all medications are placed in a secure location.
- Firearms should be unloaded and stored in a locked environment. Ammunition should be stored and locked separately.
- Make a family plan to provide adult supervision of children and set limits clearly with the children.
