Empty Nest Chance To Chase Forgotten Dreams

HOUSTON – Middle age woes are hard enough to deal with, but throw in empty nest syndrome and it is a recipe for potential depression.

Psychologists at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston say not to look at it as an ending, but as the beginning of a new stage in life with more time to travel, develop new hobbies, rediscover forgotten dreams and get to know your spouse all over again.

Empty nest syndrome can happen twice in an adult's life, once when the kids start kindergarten and again when they move out of the house. The more challenging of the two is when adolescents move out of the house to begin their adult lives.

"Parents have channeled all of their energy into their children for so long they may not know what to do with their time once they leave," says Dr. James Bray, associate professor of family and community medicine at BCM. "It is actually one of the high points when looking at the divorce rate scale. The numbers really tend to go up during middle age."

When people are unhappy in their marriage they usually have internal anxiety about something else, like not knowing what to do with the rest of their lives after the kids leave.

"It is natural to reevaluate your life every so often and even more natural during this stage in a parent's life," says Bray. "Don't just assume that if you leave your spouse you will make the unhappiness go away. Marriage takes time and energy, so make the effort to get reacquainted. "

It is a good idea to talk with friends to reevaluate goals and take note of some lifelong dreams you haven't had time to accomplish, says Bray.

Now that the kids have moved out, there may be more time to take dance classes, travel, exercise or go back to college to retool skills.

Kids need to remember to stand up for themselves if parents become too needy or clingy. Setting a phone schedule can eliminate the out-of-control calling by some parents, while reassuring them can eliminate needless worry.

"Kids can also consult with counselors if they really have an issue with a clingy parent or one that is having a difficult time dealing with the separation," says Bray.

The empty nest transition usually lasts six months to a year, depending on how well parents can adjust to their newly found freedom.



Lakes on Eldridge North Holiday Sugar Plums That Dance On Your Taste Buds



These Holiday Sugar Plums are made with ruby-red Maraschino cherries.

(NAPSA)-The more the cherrier when it comes to holiday treats. And holiday sugar plums are no exception. These traditional treats are made with festive and fun Maraschino cherries.

Whether you are hosting a party or giving gifts to neighbors, these sugar plums are full of holiday cheer. And because they are so simple, the kids will have a ball helping you make them.

Holiday Sugar Plums

- 1 cup butter or margarine
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup confectioners' sugar
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ tsp vanilla
- 2¹/₄ cup quick rolled oats (optional)
- ¹/₄ tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup finely chopped pecans
- 48 Maraschino cherries (about one 16-oz. jar)

Confectioners' sugar for finishing

Drain Maraschino cherries thoroughly on paper towels and set aside. Put butter and 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar in a large mixing bowl. Beat with an electric mixer on medium speed three to four minutes, or until well mixed. Stir in vanilla. Add flour, oats and salt; mix well. Stir in pecans.

Shape about 2 teaspoons dough around each cherry. Place on an ungreased cookie sheet about one inch apart. Bake in a preheated 350F. oven for 12 to 15 minutes, or until set but not brown. Role in confectioners' sugar while still warm. Cool.

For a fun presentation, use cherries with stems. Remove stems, bake as directed and then insert stems in cookies while they are still warm but after rolling in sugar. Makes 4 dozen.



A New Explanation For "Brittle Bone" And Connective Tissue Disease

Baylor College of Medicine

HOUSTON -- Mutations in a previously unstudied gene key to the proper formation of the structure of collagen can cause osteogenesis imperfecta, or brittle bone disease, in both mice and man, said researchers from Baylor College of Medicine and a group of international collaborators in a report that appears in the journal Cell today.

Changes in genes that serve the same purpose for different forms of collagen may also be at the root of other connective tissue diseases, said the report's senior author, Dr. Brendan Lee, associate professor of molecular and human genetics at BCM, director of the Skeletal Dysplasia Clinic at Texas Children's Hospital and a Howard Hughes Medical Institute investigator.

"This is truly a novel molecular or biochemical mechanism that causes human connective tissue disease," said Lee.

Mutations in CRTAP (cartilage-associated protein) reduce or prevent chemical modification of a particular protein that helps to chaperone collagen as it assumes its proper structure. That particular modification, which involves attaching a hydroxy (OH) molecule onto the protein, is a process called prolyl 3-hydroxylation.

Mice that were bred to lack CRTAP have severe osteoporosis and low bone mass – the mouse equivalent of osteogenesis imperfecta. What makes this finding interesting, said Lee, is that it can cause a whole spectrum of brittle bone disease in humans from lethal to mild forms, depending on the effect of the mutation. When the mutation eliminates the protein associated with the gene, a severe, lethal form of osteogenesis imperfect results. Other mutations can result in less of the protein and are associated with a milder form of the disease.

More broadly, this finding lends itself to the hypothesis that mutations in similar genes might cause problems resulting in diseases related to defects in other types of collagen. Collagen is the most common protein in the human body, and the four most common types are found in different types of tissues including bone, cartilage, blood vessels, and kidney.

"A logical extension of this research might be that we would find mutations in related genes affecting these other types of connective tissues," Lee said.

More specifically, the finding explains a mystery surrounding osteogenesis imperfecta. Previously, the only gene mutation known to cause the disease was dominantly inherited. That means if a person has the mutated gene, he or she has the disease. This means that the mutation causing the disease in the first person in a family is spontaneous and not inherited from a parent.

However, in some families, more than one child has the disease, indicating it is inherited. This new mechanism for the disease is genetically recessive, with each parent having one mutated gene and one normal gene. They then have a one in four chance of having a child with osteogenesis imperfect with each pregnancy.

"This proves a new inheritance pattern for OI and a new mechanism for bone disease," said Lee.


Current studies are aimed at answering whether this problem with prolyl-3-hydroxylation is involved in other connective tissue diseases.

Boyce of the University of Rochester Medical Center in New York.






