Cook Middle School is recycling and would like your help. We are recycling empty laser, fax, copier, and inkjet cartridges as well as used cell phones, laptops, Palm Pilots, and iPods for two reasons. Recipe of the Month:

Perfect Pumpkin Bread

Moist and delicious- a great bread for the holiday season!

- 2 cups sugar
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 cup cooking oil
- 4 eggs
- 2 tsp. soda
- 1 ½ tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 tsp. cloves
- 3 ½ cups flour
- 2/3 cup water
- 2 cups canned pumpkin

Combine sugar and oil in large bowl. Add eggs and beat until completely mixed. Combine dry ingredients and add alternately with water. Mix well. Add pumpkin and mix. Pour into loaf pans, greased or sprayed with cooking spray, to about 2/3 full. Bake at 350 degrees for 30-35 minutes for small loaf pans, 45-60 minutes for large pans. Remove when loaf springs back when pressed on top, or toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool and wrap in plastic wrap. Will freeze well.

Yields: 6-7 small loaves or 2 large loaves From the kitchen of Carrie Diggins

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
