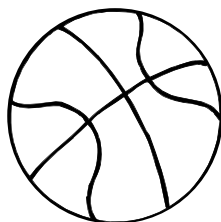

By the time this article appears homeowners will have received their 2007 notice of dues. As stated in our first article Bradford Creek Neighborhood Association, Inc. is in good financial condition so we were able to keep dues at the current rate for another year.

We are currently assembling an asset listing for all Bradford Creek owned amenities to include the obvious Community Center and pool to the less obvious neighborhood play sets and arbor seating areas. The intent is to then develop an estimate of the useful life of the each amenity so that monies can be set aside in the replacement fund account of our budget to cover future repairs or replacement of the amenity. This plan will allow your Board to keep dues at a more constant rate over the years and still maintain the beautiful surroundings we are accustomed to enjoying.

Several residents stated the need for more seating in the tree shaded vicinity of the play area to the North of our Community Center. An order has been placed for a picnic table, waste receptacle, and two benches to be installed on concrete pads early this spring. We are also getting close to making a decision on the addition of a shade structure over the shallow end of our pool and a pool slide attraction. Dental Tip of the Month.

Dear Friends,

People are living longer then ever before. People are keeping their teeth longer. There are fewer and fewer patients with full dentures. As a result more older individuals are visiting our offices for their dental care. Some of the more common areas of concerns among older population are root caries, where cavity is occurring on the root of the tooth. To prevent root caries, effort should be made to brush the gum line really well. Another problem, xerostomia, which is another word for dry mouth, is prevalent in this population mainly due to many medicines they are on. The solution for that is frequent professional cleanings. There are also artificial saliva producers that you can ask your dentist about.

Third problem I see is gum disease, or periodontal disease. This can be due to buildup of plaque and calculus, thus getting inflamed gums and bone loss. Gum disease can also occur due to shifting of the teeth, thus changing the bite. As a result of aberrant forces, can have bone loss that stabilize teeth.

We always try to be cognizant of patient's medical conditions and take that into account. We also understand that many patients have hearing loss and vision loss, thus we take our time and are very patient in tending to your needs.

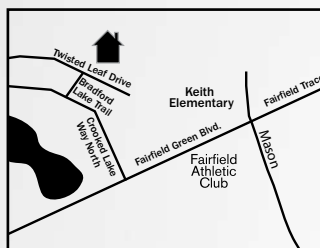

What's the deal with the Sabbath Day? Do Christians really need to cease from work one day a week in obedience to God like the Jews were commanded in the Old Testament (OT)?

The OT lists three different Sabbaths. First, the Sabbath is a reference to a single day of rest. God set forth one day in seven for His people to rest, and this was to reflect God's example of rest after creating the world in six days, resting on the seventh (Exodus 20:8-11). Exodus 31:17 says that God ceased from His work and "was refreshed." So, the Sabbath day was a day that commemorated God's work and a day to be observed by Israel as a day of rest and worship.

Second, the Sabbath day is used in reference to the Sabbatical year (Leviticus 25:2-5). God commanded Israel to allow their land to lay uncultivated in the seventh year after six years of sowing, pruning, and gathering. In the seventh year it was not to be worked, so God promised that He would provide enough food from the land for the next three years.

Third, there was the 50th year Sabbath – the Year of Jubilee (Lev. 25). After seven Sabbatical years (49 years) the following year was a year of celebration whereby property reverted back to its original owners, financial debts were forgiven, and Israelite slaves who had sold themselves to others in order to pay their debts were released from enslavement.

There is a fourth Sabbath, however, in the New Testament (NT). The OT Sabbaths were merely shadows of the NT rest found in Jesus Christ. Christ's rest is spiritual and attainable only by faith in Him apart from works. The one who truly enters God's rest is the one who rests on Christ's finished work on the cross and ceases from his labors to gain salvation through works.

So there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God. For the one who has entered God's rest has himself also rested from his works, as God did

from His. So let us be diligent to enter that rest... (Hebrews 4:9-11). So to enter Christ's "rest" one must "be diligent." This isn't a call to enter God's realm of rest by works but an exhortation to believe in Jesus Christ who has done the work of salvation for all who believe in Him. It's God's rest we enter, not our own.

The Sabbath day in the OT was given by God to Israel as a mere symbol of the coming rest they would be offered in Christ. This is why Jesus was able to break the Sabbath in the NT, and it's why there is no admonition in the NT for Christians to keep the Sabbath. Since Jesus is Rest, the symbol of the seventh day rest is useless. Consider Colossians 2:16-17: Therefore let no one act as your judge in regard to food or drink or in respect to a festival or a new moon or a Sabbath day – things which are a mere shadow of what is to come; but the substance belongs to Christ. If you are in Christ your entire life is a Sabbath! Your soul is at rest from useless works that can never result in eternal rest, and you spend every day worshipping Christ who saved you.

So how should Christians observe the Sabbath Day? The answer is that there is no one day Christians must observe, for their souls are constantly participating in the rest that God enjoys. As we "take up our crosses and follow Christ daily" (Luke 9:23) we commemorate the rest we enjoy every day just knowing Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. Our Sunday worship of Christ is not the Sabbath Day but a remembrance of our Lord's resurrection from the dead.

The two men had to remain on the tracks for 20 minutes until the power was turned off. When he spoke to the media later, Mr Autrey still had dirt on his beanie. And like a true hero he continued on his way and went to work. The New York Post called him the Subway Superman.

5. Before you start taking a dietary supplement, talk it over with a knowledgeable person like:
 - A. Your doctor or health professional
 - B. Your pharmacist
 - C. A supplement salesperson
 - D. a friend who takes them

Answers:

1. D. The term "natural" may suggest to consumers that the supplement is safe, especially when compared with prescription drugs that are known to have side effects. But natural is not necessarily safe. Although many supplements can be used safely by most people, other supplements, including some herbal products can be dangerous.

Aristolochic acid, which has been found in some traditional Chinese herbal remedies, has been linked to severe kidney disease. And the herb comfrey contains certain alkaloids that, when ingested, have been linked to serious, even fatal, liver damage. Animal studies suggest that the herb may cause cancer, too. Even certain vitamins can be toxic at high doses. And certain supplements have been found to interact with other medications in ways that could cause injury.

2. False. Studies have shown that some herbal products interact with drugs and can have a wide range of effects. For example, St. John's Wort can lower the effects of indinavir, a protease inhibitor for treating HIV.

St. John's Wort also may interfere with drugs used by organ transplant patients and drugs used to treat depression, seizures and certain cancers. In addition, there are concerns that it may reduce the effectiveness of oral contraceptives.

Garlic, ginkgo, danshen and dong quai can cause blood to thin, which could cause serious problems for people on drugs like warfarin or aspirin.

Dietary supplements are not required to go through the same pre-market government review for quality, safety and efficacy as drug products. But that doesn't mean they should be taken lightly – or without consulting your healthcare professional, especially if you have a medical condition or are taking other drugs.

3. False. It's unwise to judge a product's efficacy or safety based only on testimonials.

First, it is very difficult to verify the accuracy of the account: Some marketers may embellish or even make up testimonials to sell their product. Second, you can't generalize one person's experience to others. Anecdotes are not a substitute for valid science.

4. True. Studies suggest that several popular supplements, including herbal products, may provide health benefits. For example, calcium can reduce the risk of osteoporosis, folic acid during pregnancy can prevent birth defects, and there is some evidence suggesting that St. John's Wort may be helpful for some people with mild depression.

Check out any health claims with a reliable source, such as the National Institutes of Health's Office of Dietary Supplements, a public health or scientific organization like the American Cancer Society or the Arthritis Foundation, and your health provider.

5. A or B. Talk to your doctor, pharmacist or other health provider about any medicines you take, as well as any dietary supplements you're using or thinking about using. Though some doctors have limited knowledge of herbal products and other supplements, they have access to the most current research and can help monitor your condition to ensure that no problems develop or serious interactions occur.

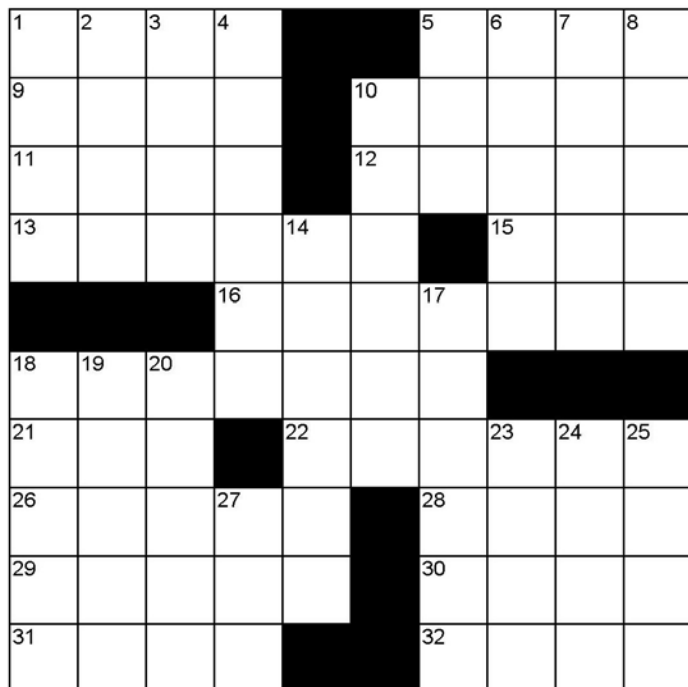
Retailers or marketers can be good sources of information about their products and their ingredients, but bear in mind that they have a financial interest in their products. If your doctor or pharmacist has a financial interest in the product, get a second, independent opinion.

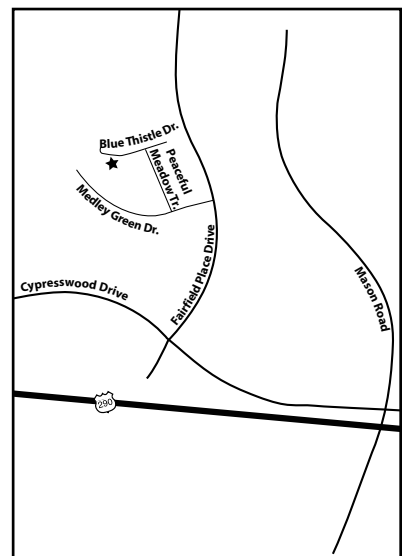

High-Heeled Hazards

Baylor College of Medicine

HOUSTON - Does looking chic leave your feet screaming for help? Listen to them -- not fashion pundits -- for a change, says a foot and ankle expert.

Dr. John Marymont, associate professor of orthopedic surgery at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, said that wearing a two-inch heel subjects the ball of your foot to 50 percent more pressure than flat shoes.

High-heeled shoes do not usually have a foot-friendly design.

"High heels can cause bunions, hammer toes and neuromas -- problems accounting for more than a billion dollars a year in healthcare costs," said Marymont

The American Orthopedic Foot and Ankle Society, of which Marymont is a member, suggests the following when considering high-heeled shoes:

- Don't choose a shoe based on its marked size; sizes vary among types of shoes and brands.
- Select a shoe similar to the shape of your foot.
- Try on high-heels at the end of the day when your feet are at their biggest.
- The shorter the heel, the better.
- Limit wearing high-heels to special occasions.
- Make sure your heel fits comfortably within the shoe with minimal slippage.

In other words, put your best foot forward by lending an ear to those podiatric pleas. Your feet will thank you for listening.

Don't Let Stress Make A Mess Of Work And Home Life

(NAPSA)-Statistics don't lie. The facts are in and research suggests that stress is making Americans sick. According to the National Institutes of Health, 80 to 90 percent of all illnesses are either directly or indirectly caused by stress.

In another study conducted by the Center for the New American Dream, researchers found that more than 50 percent of Americans would be willing to take a day off work without pay in an effort to feel less stressed and have more time with their families.

And ongoing public opinion research finds that the majority of stress that people feel is directly related to work issues such as time management, deadlines, and dealing with difficult co-workers. Fortunately, there are action steps that people can incorporate into their daily routines to help them regain control of their lives.

Here are some tips for relieving workplace stress.

- Eat Right. Avoid eating unhealthy snacks. Eating healthy food can increase

- your energy.
- Drink Less Caffeine. Drinking lots of coffee and sodas can increase your stress levels. If you can't cut out caffeine beverages completely, try to alternate your caffeine intake with healthier beverages or snacks.
- Exercise. Exercise is a great way to relieve stress, so try to take a brisk 10-

minute walk during the day, even if it means a walk around the office or building. Walking will help to get your blood moving and give you a mental break from your tasks.

- Stretch. Stretching can help to relieve stiff muscles, which can hold tension and make you feel more stressed.
- Simplify the Morning. Getting up 15 minutes earlier, and packing lunches or laying out clothes the night before, can help create a routine and get you organized.
- Think Positive. Take a few minutes to reflect on the good things in life. Taking stock of what you have can instantly improve your mood and outlook.
- Breathe. When we are stressed, we have a tendency to take shallow breaths, which can result in feeling more tense. Start by inhaling deeply through the nose for a count of eight, then exhaling slowly for a count of 16. Concentrate on your

counting and breath.

- Rest. Be sure you are getting enough sleep at night. Not feeling rested can add to your stress level and make you feel more overwhelmed. If you have been experiencing recurring sleepless nights, consult your physician for guidance.
- Do Things You Enjoy. Try to do something you love every day to give yourself something to look forward to.
- Most stress arises due to feelings of life being out of control. By taking time to get yourself organized, and taking care of yourself, you can begin to gain control and ensure that your workday is as relaxed as possible.
- E-mail Stress-out. E-mail has become one of the most common forms of communication but it can also be one of the most stressful. Opening a full e-mail box can be overwhelming, not to mention time consuming. Learn how to use your e-mail software, so you can organize your in-box and file away all those important messages in a way that makes them easier to access. Also, don't forget to trash any spam or useless e-mails. Change your habits so that instead of leaving a message in your in-box until it's completed, try placing the task from the e-mail on your task list along with the contact information, then filing the e-mail away until you are prepared to reply.

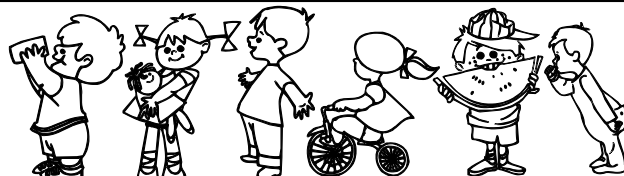

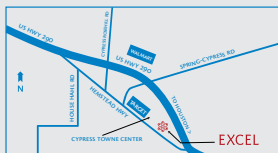
