More recently, many friends who had not seen me for a while would say that I was looking younger. Certainly, these were statements of courtesy because children had started to call me "Grandpa Hu". Even my wife began to call me "Old Man" sometimes. With this, I began to feel really old.

Nobody can avoid old age. Confucius spoke about human life transformation very clearly. He said: "When I was fifteen, I was determined to study hard. When I was thirty, I began to achieve. When I was forty, I really understood life. When I was fifty, I begin



to believe in fate. When I was sixty, I began to feel tolerant. When I was seventy, I found freedom." "Twenties are about promotion, thirties are about building reputation, forties are about understanding limitations, fifties are about experience, sixties are about intuition." Generally old age begins at fifty or more. People begin to accept fate and appreciate what they have. They become more homogenous with nature. They have accumulated experience and are able to use good judgment. Therefore, old age is a mature age.

During the Ming Dynasty, Liu Shin Wu had further observations of the life stages. He said "People's attitudes change with age. Before forty, people are of an impulsive mind but not necessarily completely knowledgeable. After forty, people are of a stable mind. They comprehend more and are able to form a plan for life. After sixty, people are of a retiring mind. They are very knowledgeable but may not be as energetic. However, not all people fit into the mold. There can be young persons who are unmotivated and may act like zombies. Also there can be crazy old guys who are aggressive and energized. Tung-yu even though young, was calm and systematic. The famous general Ma-Yuan was old yet ever alert. Although older people may be limited by their physical strength, they are unlimited by their rich experiences. If an older person can stand up, life is still unlimited. Like Ma-Yuan, many people in their sixties or seventies can still make positive contributions. For example, after WWII, Charles Dugaulle helped to establish stability for France. Toscanini conducted a world famous orchestra. Da Vinci helped shape the Renaissance in Italy. Ghandi led India to independence. Deng Xiao Ping directed economic reform for China. These cases prove that even if people are older in age, they remain young at heart; many things can still be achieved. We can call these people "Old Youngsters". Although I am getting old in age, I am still young at heart. Old age looks like a new beginning.

Well it's hard to believe that we are already more than a month into the New Year. Hope this year is a great one for all Wortham Residents. The recreational facilities include the pool, clubhouse, tennis courts and playground area (including the pool and retention pond areas).

We have identified some items for the facilities that we will be addressing as far as upgrades and maintenance to the pool area, tennis courts and playground equipment. For this year we are planning on replacing some of the pool furniture with new furniture and hopefully in 2008 will replace the remainder. We will also have to repair/replace the lifeguard stands.

Additionally we are planning a few things for the tennis courts, including replacing of the lights (glass covers, upgrade bulbs), new windscreens and repairs/repainting of fence poles/gates. On another note we are requesting that for any resident who uses the tennis courts at night, that when they leave and the courts are empty, to turn off the lights. Quite often we see the lights on with no one playing and they do not turn themselves off until the timer turns them off at 10pm. Obviously, we are wasting electricity/money, so please help us be energy conscious.

Another item we are looking at is installing new playground equipment at the pool area. The current playground equipment is beginning to break and we would like a more functional, multiple

Neil was selected to the U.S. National Junior Team in September. Traveling to the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colorado in October, Neil trained with the 40 other National Junior Team members, (17 males and 23 females).

The team traveled to Kihei, Maui,

Hawaii on January 9-15 to compete with 11 other countries, including USA's swimming rival, Australia. Neil is swimming the following events: 200 Freestyle, 200 Butterfly, 100 Freestyle, 100 Butterfly, 50 Freestyle and a 10k Open Water Swim. He will also participate on various relay races.

Neil has already qualified for the 2008 Olympic Trials in Omaha, Nebraska in three events: 200 butterfly, 100 butterfly and the 200 freestyle. The Olympic Trials will be held June 30 - July 7, 2008.

Neil began swimming for the Wortham Whitesharks at the age of 6 and began swimming in a year round swim program when he was 12. He is now a member of the Elite group, swimming for the Cypress-Fairbanks Swim Club. He also swims for the Cy-Falls Eagles.






