

FAIRFIELD JAZZERCISERS PARTICIPATE IN A FUND-RAISER HALFTIME SHOW

Cypress, Texas -- It's a fact that exercise is important for good health. And it's even better when that exercise helps others in the community. Nine Fairfield Jazzercisers combined healthy exercise and helped the community by participating in a Houston Rockets halftime show that was also a fund-raiser for The Pink Ribbons Project. It was a lot of hard work."

The Jazzercisers who performed this routine are not professional dancers. They came from all walks of life — nurses, doctors, teachers, architects, secretaries, business owners, and parents.

And the driving force behind this performance — in addition to the excitement of performing in front of a sold out crowd at The Toyota Center — was raising money to benefit breast cancer awareness, research and medical care. In the last two years, Jazzercisers have raised more than \$40,000 to benefit this worthy cause, and they are expected to raise another \$20,000 this year. Each participant was required to raise at least \$50 to be eligible to participate. Others have raised additional money.

Storm water runoff from urban areas can carry pollutants and trash into the storm water drainage system. Water that flows down the drains in our homes first goes to sewage treatment facilities before it's released to bayous and rivers. But, water that flows into our storm water drainage system, along with other substances it collects, goes directly into our bayous, rivers, and ultimately into Galveston Bay. Unlike sewage, storm water receives no treatment.



Harvest Bible Church

Did You Know? Here at Harvest Bible Church we believe in the Great Commission of Jesus Christ in Matthew 28:19-20. In that Commission Jesus first commanded the apostles and prophets of the first century to makes disciples of all nations by preaching the good news. And second, he commanded that those disciples be taught everything that he had commanded.

In the modern day the apostles and prophets have passed from the scene. But their unique offices allowed them to walk and talk with Jesus and experience the Son of God first hand. And before they died a handful of them left behind their writings about Jesus and all that he taught. God kept those writings accurate by inspiring the pens they used and keeping their doctrine error free (2 Tim. 3:16). Then God miraculously handed those writings down to each generation that followed all the way to the modern day. So the Bible we carry today contains the very words of Jesus, and those words are meant to be taught in keeping with Jesus' Great Commission to not only share the good news of Jesus Christ but also to teach all that he commanded.

The apostles taught what Jesus taught, and they were able to perform miracles like he did, albeit to a lesser extent. In addition, they spoke in various kinds of languages (tongues) that they had never learned so that the world around them could comprehend the gospel message, for not everyone spoke or understood the mother-tongue of the early Jewish disciples. As a result, 60 or so years after Jesus Christ left the earth his disciples – the apostles and prophets – had taken the gospel to the entire known world of their day. The Apostle Paul made it all the way to Spain. And the Apostle Thomas made his way eastward all the way to India where he was killed because he wouldn't stop talking about his friend who died and came back to life three days later. The others lived and died within the realm of the Roman Empire, but each one (except John who died an old man) died for simply preaching the Great Commission.

Today, because the apostles and prophets have all passed, it's the church that carries the task of doing evangelism (making disciples), and of teaching disciples everything that Jesus commanded. The only difference between today's evangelists and teachers and those ancient apostles and prophets is that the teaching of Jesus is second-hand. We are simply piggy-backing on the testimony of the apostles and prophets. They laid the foundation of the church, and now evangelists and teachers build upon that foundation by teaching from the Scriptures – the divinely inspired words written by the apostles and prophets in the first century.

At Harvest Bible Church we believe that there are essentially two offices: evangelists and teachers (to include pastors), and this belief stems from the teachings in Matthew 28:19-20 and Ephesians 4:11. But there are of course many different ways to evangelize, and each one of God's children has been gifted with a passion to teach and evangelize in some capacity. For some they serve behind the scenes in order to help those who serve in front of people. Others give sacrificially from their God-given means to propagate the teaching of God's Word. Some teach and preach, some lead, and others show mercy and encourage various people who have needs – financially and otherwise. When all of God's people come together and work in the ways that God has gifted them to work the church functions like a fine-tuned and well-oiled machine.

The whole purpose of the church is to bring glory to the Lord God Almighty. All that the church does is not to shine light on the people for the sake of the people receiving praise. No, it's about God receiving praise. The church isn't about large buildings with high-tech machinery and loud rock-n-roll music groups. It's a place where the Bible is taught verse by verse, paragraph by paragraph, book by book in order to direct people to Jesus and to teach them all that he taught. After all, he is the Lord and Savior – the Almighty God, Creator of heaven and earth.

Dental Tip of the Month.

How to deal with Dental Emergencies

Don't get caught off guard with dental emergencies. Know what to do when it happens, time can be a critical factor.

Dear Friends,

I am starting a series where we will discuss frequent dental emergencies that arise.

It happens to many people where either a toddler head butts a parent and the parent's front tooth gets knocked out.

In another instance, your child's front tooth gets knocked out while he or she is horse playing with a sibling or a friend or if he or she takes a fall.

Here is what I recommend to do if a tooth gets knocked out.

- If the tooth is dirty, rinse it in cool water.
- Do not scrub the tooth at all as the tissue still attached to the tooth could prove to be vital in saving that tooth.
- Gently insert the tooth in the socket and hold it there.

Situation can arise where it is very painful to place the tooth back into the socket, in that case, place the tooth immediately in a cup of milk. If no milk is available at that time, then place it in a cup of cold water.

Chance for saving the tooth is the greatest if you get your loved on to the dentist in 30 minutes or less.

Before You Start an Exercise Program

there are a few questions to ask yourself to determine whether you should see your doctor first.

QUESTION YOURSELF

Your first step is to ask yourself how active you want to be. This may sound like a silly question - you're probably planning on doing whatever you're capable of, whether that's a slow walk around the block or a vigorous step class. But if you're of a certain age or have certain cardiovascular risk factors, you may need to see your physician before beginning a program that involves vigorous (as opposed to moderate) aerobic activity.

Here's how exercise intensities are typically defined:

Low-to-Moderate - This is an intensity that can be sustained relatively comfortably for a long period of time (about 60 minutes). This type of exercise typically begins slowly, progresses gradually and usually isn't competitive in nature.

Vigorous - This is an intensity that is high enough to significantly raise both your heart and breathing rates, and is usually performed for about 20 minutes before fatigue sets in.

Are you planning to participate in vigorous activities and are a man over 40 or a woman over 50? You should receive a medical exam first. The same is true for individuals of any age with two or more coronary artery disease risk factors. If you're unsure if this applies to you, check with your physician.

MORE OUESTIONS

Now that you've made it through the first questions, there are a few more to answer. A YES to any ONE of the following questions means you should talk with your doctor, by



phone or in person, BEFORE you start an exercise program. Explain which questions you answered "yes" to and the activities you are planning to pursue.

- 1. Have you been told you have a heart condition and should only participate in physical activity recommended by a doctor?
- 2. Do you feel pain (or discomfort) in your chest when you do physical activity? When you are not participating in physical activity? While at rest, do you frequently experience fast, irregular heartbeats or very slow beats?
- 3. Do you ever become dizzy and lose your balance, or lose consciousness? Have you fallen more than twice in the past year (no matter what the reason)?
- 4. Do you have a bone or joint problem that could worsen as a result of physical activity? Do you have pain in your legs or buttocks when you walk?

- 5. Do you take blood pressure or heart medications?
- 6. Do you have any cuts or wounds on your feet that don't seem to heal?
- 7. Have you experienced unexplained weight loss in the past six months?
- 8. Are you aware of any reason why you should not participate in physical activity?

If you answered "no" to all of these questions, and you passed the first round of questions, you can be reasonably sure that you can safely take part in at least a moderate physical activity program.

But again, if you are a man over 40 or a woman over 50 and want to exercise more vigorously, you should check with your physician before getting started.

So, are you ready? If you are, but are unsure how to get started, consider contacting an ACE-certified Personal Trainer or joining a reputable fitness facility.

Use Only Water In Sippy Cups Or Increase Cavity Risk

AAPD Highlights Importance of Proper Use of Toddler Drinking Device

(NAPSA)-Most parents are well aware of the importance of taking care of their children's teeth, so it comes as a shock when they learn their toddlers have cavities during a checkup.

Tooth decay among young children is on the rise-and many experts believe that sippy cups containing sugary beverages are responsible.

The Misuse of Sippy Cups

Because sippy cups prevent spills, they're often used by children for long periods of time over months and years-rather than as a transitional drinking device, a purpose for which they were intended. "Sippy cups were created to help children transition from a bottle to drinking from a regular cup, but they're too often used for convenience," says American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD) President Philip H. Hunke, D.D.S., M.S.D. "When kids sip for extended periods on sugared beverages, they're exposed to a higher risk of decay. Sippy cups should only contain water unless it's mealtime."

In fact, a report from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) comparing the dental health of Americans in 1988-1994 and 1999-2002 found that while cavities decreased among older children, cavities in two- to five-year-olds actually increased 15.2 percent.

A Child's First Visit


Hunke views the misuse of sippy cups as just the symptom of a larger issue-the fact that many parents wait too long before taking their children to the dentist for the first time. The AAPD recommends that a child's first dental visit occur shortly after the first tooth erupts and no later than the child's first birthday. But according to the 2005 National Survey of Children's Health (NSCH), only 10 percent of 1-year-olds and 23.8 percent of 2-year-olds had been taken for a preventive dental care visit in the past year.

At the first visit, the pediatric dentist provides information about proper sippy cup use as part of the presentation of a complete program of preventive home care. The dentist also checks the child's teeth to make sure they're developing properly.

"Studies show that children with poor oral health perform worse in school and have less success later in life," says Hunke. "Establishing the right oral care habits early helps get kids headed on the path to a lifetime of good oral health."
