Dear Homeowners:

Last month, two residents of Lakes on Eldridge North were victims of a home burglary. One of the thoughts about this burglary was that the criminals entered by tailgating at the subdivision's back gate on Little York. Though this event did not occur in our own neighborhood, it brings to mind that it has happened here, and could happen again.

The Board stresses very strongly how important it is that you not let anyone tailgate you as you come in through the Tanner Road gates unless that vehicle clearly belongs to an LOE resident, or to let a vehicle waiting outside enter when you leave through these gates. On numerous occasions, residents have reported cars sitting off to the side of one of our back gates waiting for a resident to drive through, so they can gain access, sometimes with the engine idling. Why would someone be prepared to waste time and fuel waiting there for an indeterminate length of time to come through one of these gates rather than simply going to the main gate and identifying themselves to the gate attendant to secure admission? If someone does not have an LOE sticker and their own access clicker, they have no business coming into our neighborhood through the back gate. Would you let an unidentified stranger come through the back door of your home? Well, this is home for over 700 of us. If something like this happens to you, just pull through the gate and stop until it closes. No exceptions. The Board asks that everyone be very vigilant about this.

The Board has again reminded our gate attendants that they must strictly enforce the requirements for allowing non-residents to enter LOE. This may result in some inconvenience for your visitors, but we urge you to understand the reasons. We hope you will continue to let us know, through AMI, of incidents where the procedures are not being followed.

Annual Easter Egg Hunt

The annual Easter Egg Hunt for the young children of Lakes on Eldridge will be held on Saturday, March 24, 2007 in front of the Beach Club. The hunt begins at 10:00 a.m. **SHARP!**

To participate in the hunt, parents are asked to fill a dozen plastic eggs for each child hunting and drop them off at any neighborhood drop site no later than March 23rd. Egg hunt flyers, containing complete information, are distributed door to door throughout the neighborhood. Please also watch for gate signs.

The children hunt in two separate areas in front of the Beach Club. One area is designated for the younger children, ages 1-4 and the other for children ages 5 and up. After the hunt, everyone is invited to enjoy light refreshments. Also, Ann Knoche of Heritage

Texas Properties will once again offer her adorable face painting for the children. Please bring your Easter baskets and remember your camera!



Are My HOA Assessments **Tax Deductible?**

Every year as tax time approaches, homeowners ask if their homeowner assessments are tax deductible. For most of us, the answer is no. (Revenue Ruling 76-495 specifically denies the deduction of annual assessments as property taxes.) Assessments are not charitable donations either, even when paid to a tax-exempt homeowner association. (The IRS prohibits tax-exempt homeowner associations [IRC Section 501(c)(4)] from accepting tax-deductible donations.) One twist - if the assessments are paid on rental property, then they are deductible as a rental expense on Schedule E.

On a positive note - the amount of the assessments that represents "Capital Assessments" will be an increase to the homeowner's basis in their property. (This treatment is provided by Revenue ruling 81-152.) This could help in reducing the amount of capital gain when you sell your home. Good news/Bad news for most homeowners - this won't help because of the very generous exclusion of gain on the sale of a residence (\$250,000 for a single taxpayer and \$500,000 for joint filers). However, the basis adjustments would be useful to the owner of a second home or a high dollar primary residence. As always, seek the advice of a competent tax advisor.


