This is a good time to remind Timarron homeowners of the Design



Guidelines that govern Modifications, Covenants and Restrictions. The Modifications Design Guidelines assist owners in clarifying modification requirements when making decisions to change existing or new improvements. All changes to the outside of your home require submission to and approval from the New Construction / Modifications Committee. If a change is in question, please call the office for clarification.

Mending and Replacing Fences

As Timarron neighborhoods age, fences are sometimes in need of repair. Some homeowners may have questions regarding party walls or shared fences. As stated in the Timarron Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions, Article V Section 5(b), Sharing of Repair and Maintenance, the cost of reasonable repair and maintenance of a party wall, fence or driveway shall be shared equally by the owners who make use of the wall, fence or driveway. Please work with your neighbors to keep Timarron looking great!

Fences that provide privacy are also the responsibility of the homeowner to maintain. Many fences throughout Timarron are in need of repair or replacement. Please take the time to inspect your fence to determine if it falls into this category.

Refer to the Timarron Design Guidelines for more information. Be sure to complete a Modification Submission Form before making any changes or staining your fence. The submission must be approved prior to start of any work. If you have any questions please call the office at 817-424-3027.

Pro's Pointer

Keys to Better Pitching

There are three ways to control the distance your pitch shot will travel.

- 1. Loft of the club.
- 2. Tempo of the swing
- 3. Length of the swing.

When a player is pitching, they usually only have one SW with a loft of 56 – 60 degrees. A player should also always swing the club at a consistent tempo. This leaves the only way to modify the length of the pitch shot by the length of the swing. Try swinging your arms to an 8 o'clock, 9 o'clock, and 10 o'clock positions. This will vary the length the pitch shot will travel. Reminder: The loft of the club and the tempo of the swing must remain consistent. Use a mirror to help visualize and feel the correct length of the three positions.
