

At the time this article is being prepared for inclusion in the May issue of the Fairfield Community Gazette it is still early April. However, construction is moving along on the new water flume slide such that the concrete pad extension to accommodate the slide is complete. The slide itself is scheduled to ship in time for finished installation by the opening of pool season May 5th. Barring weather or vendor delays the new shade structure will also be installed over the shallow end of the pool prior to opening day. We hope these new amenities meet with resident approval and allow for extended summer activities without leaving the subdivision. Parents please advise your children to utilize the slide in a safe manner by following the direction of the lifeguards on duty. Safety at our pools is always the first consideration.

On a different subject but one that many residents have expressed concern over lately; an announcement was made at a recent Fairfield Village Community Association, Inc. Board meeting that MUD 322 and 354 are considering funding the cost of one additional Sheriff Deputy each for patrol duty primarily in Fairfield subdivision. This is much needed coverage since Fairfield continues to expand rapidly. A final decision and announcement should be made in the near future.

INWOOD PARK BOARD OF DIRECTOR NEWS

Look for changes at the Inwood Park Pool Facility, happening soon. A new play structure is ordered for the pool park and hopefully will be installed shortly. New pool furniture is also ordered and should arrive prior to the opening of the pool for weekends in May. Along with the new furniture a shade cover is also being installed at the pool facility.

As many of you may have noticed, the pine trees on the cul-de-sacs are ailing and tree experts have advised that treatment is a waste of Association money. The Board is reviewing cul-de-sacs for removal of the sick pines and planting a replacement oak or crape myrtles. As we are getting out of "tree planting season" some replacement may not occur until the fall, but be assured these cul-de-sacs will be addressed.

Inwood Park included the perimeter trees at Ten Acre Park with the spring mulch to enhance the appearance of the park.

We continue to receive complaints on motorcycles and ATVs speeding along the greenbelt, we have asked the Sheriff's Department to provide bicycle patrol in attempts to apprehend and ticket these individuals. We also continue to see poly carts stored prominently in view, please be Fairfield proud and store your poly cart out of view, or 10 feet behind the front of your home screened by a shrub per Inwood Park Board of Directors.



Gum disease and Cancer in men?

Dear Friends,

According to a recent study, men with a history of periodontal disease could be at an increased risk of developing pancreatic cancer.

To analyze this periodontal-systemic association further, the authors reviewed 16 years of health data on over 51,000 male health professionals, all between ages of 40 and 75 years at the study's inception in 1986.

Over a 16-year follow-up period, 216 men developed pancreatic cancer. After adjusting for age, smoking history, diabetes, obesity, diet and other potentially confounding variables, the reviewers found that men with a history of periodontal disease had a 63 percent increased risk of pancreatic cancer than men without a history of periodontal disease.

Today, over 70 percent of the adult U.S. population has some form of periodontal disease. To maintain oral health and prevent periodontal disease, the ADA promotes the importance of good oral hygiene and regular dental care.

Did You Know... It takes faith to believe in the unseen future that God has promised to those who trust in Him and to believe in the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, but the righteous shall live by faith (Habakkuk 2:4). Now who are the righteous? And what is faith? Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. For by it the men of old gained approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things which are visible (Hebrews 11:1-3).

The faith we have is our "assurance of things hoped for" – our unwavering belief that God is who He says He is. And since "assurance" means "to support" our faith supports us like the unseen roots of a tree support it. Roots are unseen, but the tree they support give it assurance.

Now faith isn't an entity all to itself. Faith in faith is worthless, and unless our faith is set upon something or someone that worthy of our trust, then it won't bring us much support. This is why the context in Hebrews 11 draws the reader to faith in Jesus, for faith in Him stems from a "conviction of things not seen" – specifically our eternity with Him. God's word, the Bible, is where faith begins. Any faith worth having begins with believing God through His word.

The second thing that Hebrews 11 teaches is that faith gains the approval of God (v. 2). The saints of old gained salvation the same way modern-day Christians attain it – through faith. Their faith pleased God, for "without faith it is impossible to please God" (Heb. 11:6). These saints of old bore fruit in keeping with their faith, for none of them wandered about with blind optimism merely wishing God to be true or acting superstitiously. Neither did they gain salvation by merely acknowledging history and doctrine. They gained God's approval simply because they believed God even during times when God seemed so unbelievable.

Third, faith acknowledges the power of God (v. 3). The author of Hebrews had Genesis 1:1 in mind when he said, "By faith we understand that the world was created by the word of God..." So to reject God as the Creator of all things is to reject the very basis of what true and right faith is, namely believing God's word which clearly says that He created the world.

Of course there are other faiths to have faith in, but are they true? Is evolution true? If you believe it, then you have faith, but does your faith make it true? Of course not. And not even science has proven that vile doctrine to have any basis whatsoever for our assurance. We believe something because we know it to be true, and if it isn't then we reject it. Hats off to those who believe that evolution created the world, for they have more faith than Christians. But it's not faith in and of itself that saves; it's the object of our faith that saves us: Jesus Christ.

Faith is to a Christian what a root is to a tree. It provides support and assurance of salvation. That root then produces a shoot, as it were, which is evidence of life in the tree and nourishment in the root. Then it produces a fruit which nourishes those who partake and in turn creates more seeds that can take root and start the whole process over again. So true faith is about a root, a shoot, and a fruit – all three of which work together in God's plan to multiply and make more and more disciples of faith in Christ. At Harvest Bible Church we are about the task of planting the seeds of faith (evangelizing) and of watering those seeds (preaching all that Christ taught). Only then can we sit back and watch God cause growth (cf. 1 Corinthians 3:5-9). It all starts with faith in Christ – believing His word, obtaining God's approval for such, and acknowledging God's power.







LANDSCAPING

The definition of landscaping is: "to improve the appearance of a piece of ground by contouring and decorative planting." Most homeowners desire to have a pleasing and pleasant yard. We also want our yards to be unique-different from our neighbors.

By choosing from the hundreds of plants available, it is easy to make your home and garden appear the way you want it. Some yards are bright and colorful. Others utilize evergreen plants. Blooming plants usually require more attention than evergreen plants. Typically, non blooming plants need only occasional pruning. Native plants are more disease resistant and withstand local weather conditions better.

No matter which landscaping plan you choose, weeds will be a problem. A weed, according to the dictionary, is "a plant considered troublesome, useless or unattractive, especially one growing abundantly in cultivated ground."

Weeds can grow anywhere-cracks in concrete, joints in the street, gutters on your house if dirt has accumulated, your lawn and their favorite place, your flowerbeds. When you add soil or mulch to your flowerbeds, you are probably adding weed seeds also.

There are three ways to eliminate weeds in your flowerbeds:

- 1. Eliminate flowerbeds and expand your lawn.
- 2. Pull weeds by hand.
- 3. Use a chemical weed killer.

Doing away with flowerbeds is not the best choice. Although a well-manicured lawn is pretty, flowers add a lot to the appearance of your yard. The best way to eliminate weeds is to pull or dig them up by the roots. You not only get rid of the weeds, but you also get some healthy exercise for free. Using a chemical weed killer requires care and caution. The manufacturer's instructions should be followed. A weed killer will also harm or kill desired plants.

If you see your plants being attacked by a disease or insect, immediate action is required to control the problem. Most plants cannot defend themselves, especially if stressed. Determine the cause and begin treatment. A plant nursery may be able to help you decide exactly what your problems are and offer solutions.

With a little money. time, work and luck, you may have a "Yard of the Month".



Bike + Mountains = Excitement And Challenge

Tired of paved roads? Want to go where there aren't any speed limits? If you answered yes, then your vehicle of choice could very well be a mountain bike. Ever since a group of friends took a fast-paced ride down a steep incline in Northern California, mountain biking has been an exciting challenge to off-road riders.

Its inclusion as an event in the 1996 Olympics confirmed what riders already know: Mountain biking is one of the fastest growing sports in the world, both in popularity and participation.

If you've never been on a mountain bike you might wonder what all the fuss is about. Many riders say it's the freedom. After all, destinations are unlimited on these machines built for rough terrain.

THE RIGHT EQUIPMENT

Mountain bikes are sturdier than your average 10-speed or hybrid bicycle so they can withstand rough roads. They have wide tires that grip the trail, and cantilever brakes, similar to those found on a motorcycle.

When purchasing a mountain bike, be sure that it isn't too large. You should always be able to put a foot on the ground to steady yourself. A helmet is a must, and knee and elbow pads are sure-fire scar preventers.

YOUR BODY ON A BIKE

Riding a bike is one of the best cardiovascular exercises around. Not only does it provide an aerobic workout, but it strengthens the large muscles of the lower body, including the thighs, hips and buttocks, without putting a lot of stress on the joints. The upper body and arms come into play when climbing hills.

Always warm up before you begin your ride. Pedal in a low gear over flat terrain until you begin to sweat or feel warm.

This usually takes about five to 10 minutes. And don't neglect to cool down when you come to the end of your ride. Gradually lowering your heart rate can help prevent the pooling of lactic acid in the muscles. Again, pedal slowly in a low gear.



ON THE TRAIL

Practice makes perfect isn't a cliché when it comes to handling a mountain bike. Once you start heading up hills and mountains and over rocks and steep falls, you'll need to rely on your instincts, which, if they don't come naturally, develop through practice.

One of the first things to do is to get a feel for how the brakes work. The front brake on a mountain bike usually has more power than the back, and pulling it alone may send you flying over the handlebars. Practice quick stops before you hit the trail so you can feel how your weight may affect how you stop. Cantilever brakes are stronger than those on other bikes, allowing riders to control factors such as their rate of decline. When descending a hill, lightly squeeze and release the brakes - a technique called feathering - to prevent the wheels from locking.

Change gears as it becomes necessary in order to keep a steady cadence. Use a low gear when you need power, and a high gear when you want speed.

Climbing requires a shift in your weight that will control the tires' grip on the ground. Short, steep hills may require out-of-the-seat pedaling to garner more power.

If you try this on a long climb, however, you'll likely tire before you reach the top. Shift your weight forward, off the seat if necessary, to gain the power you need.

GET PEDALING

You can obtain information about trails in your area from your local library or mountainbiking group. The sooner you start pedaling, the sooner you can test your limits - those set by both your body and your mind.

A Charlotte That's A Peach Of A Fine Dessert

(NAPSA)-Here's a fresh approach to using canned peaches as part of a memorable dessert.

Using canned peaches may help a cook cut down on preparation time, but it won't cut down on nutrition or taste.

California Peach Charlotte

Ingredients:

- 3 (15-oz.) cans California Cling Peach slices, well drained (reserve 5 slices for garnish)
- 8 ounces (2 sticks) unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 1 cup sugar, preferably superfine
- 5 tablespoons Amaretto almond liqueur, Grand Marnier, or syrup from the peaches (if using peach syrup, add ¹/₂ teaspoon almond extract)
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups finely ground almonds (reserve
- 1 tablespoon for garnish)
- 2 cups whipping cream
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Equipment:

1 8¹/₂" springform pan Waxed paper and plastic wrap

Preparation: Line the bottom of the springform pan with a circle of waxed paper.



Even when used in a luxurious dish, such as this Charlotte, canned peaches can be a source of vitamins A, C and E.

Using an electric mixer, cream the butter and superfine sugar together for 4 or 5 minutes, until pale and airy. Add the Amaretto almond liqueur, Grand Marnier or reserved peach syrup and almond extract. Continue to beat for a few more minutes until the sugar has nearly dissolved. Blend in the almonds. Reserve. Whip the cream with the sugar and vanilla until it just holds very soft peaks. Fold the lightly whipped cream completely into the almond mixture.

Cover the bottom of the springform pan with 1/3 of the almond cream. Arrange half of the peach slices in a sunburst pattern on the almond cream. Cover with another 1/3 of the almond cream. Repeat with another layer of peach slices and cover with the remaining almond cream. Firmly tap the filled pan onto work surface to settle the mixture and remove any air pockets that may have formed. Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for at least 5 hours or overnight. The California Peach Charlotte may be prepared a day in advance to this point.

To Serve: Remove the plastic wrap and run a knife around the edge of the pan. Unlatch the springform pan, leaving the ring in place. Place the selected serving plate upside down over the mold and reverse the finished charlotte onto the plate. Remove the ring and the bottom of the pan. Remove the waxed paper. Garnish with reserved peach slices and sprinkle with the reserved ground almonds.

Refrigerate until service. For best results, slice with a damp knife.

Stop Colon Cancer in Minutes

Baylor College of Medicine

In just a few minutes, it can help stop colon cancer before it begins.

Getting screened regularly is the most effective way of preventing this "silent" but deadly disease, say doctors at Baylor College of Medicine (BCM) in Houston.

"There are several screening options, but a colonoscopy is the most sensitive and accurate way to find precancerous growths," said Dr. Waqar Qureshi, associate professor of medicine and chief of endoscopy at BCM. "Colon cancer has no warning signs and without screening you won't know you have it until it's too late."

By the time symptoms such as rectal bleeding, abdominal pain, weight loss, or anemia occur, the cancer has more than likely spread beyond the point of being cured. Screening, on the other hand, can catch precancerous growths at a time when life saving treatments are still effective.

During a colonoscopy, a thin, flexible device called a colonoscope is used to view the colon. A small video camera helps doctors look for abnormalities such as polyps, which are growths found on the colon wall. Almost all instances of colon cancer begin as polyps, which are easily removed during a colonoscopy.

"It takes a polyp about six to eight years to turn into a cancer," Qureshi said. "That is a huge window for polyps to be detected."

Colonoscopy screening should take place every ten years starting



at age 50. If colon cancer runs in a family, testing should begin earlier in age and be preformed more often.

Colonoscopies take about twenty minutes and, since sedation is used, they are painless. Qureshi said most patients tell him they don't remember the procedure.

"There isn't an excuse to not have a colonoscopy," Quershi said. "It is a quick, painless, and life saving procedure."

A proper diet has been shown to lower the risk of colon cancer. Qureshi suggests eating more fruits, vegetables and diets low in saturated fat. Adding calcium supplements to your daily routine can also help.

"Improving what you eat is always good, but nothing can replace regular colonoscopy screenings." Qureshi said. "It is a routine procedure, and it can save your life."



With Seasonal Allergies, The 'Eyes' Have It

Baylor College of Medicine

HOUSTON – Red, itchy, swollen eyes don't have to keep you from enjoying the season, say doctors at Baylor College of Medicine (BCM) in Houston.

"The same pollen that causes nasal allergies also causes eye allergies," said Dr. Yvonne I. Chu, assistant professor of ophthalmology at BCM. "Like in the nasal mucosa, when allergens such as pollen touch the ocular surface, the conjunctiva, mast cells release histamine which causes many symptoms. However, the two allergies can have different issues that can appear separately."

Seasonal allergic conjunctivitis, eye allergies that begin to show up this time of year, can cause the eyes to become red and irritated. Symptoms include itching, swollen eyes along with burning, tearing, and discomfort.

"Rubbing your eyes is a natural reaction, but it's only going to make matters worse," Chu said. "Prevention is the key, keep allergens from getting into the eye in the first place.

Chu recommends keeping track of pollen counts and staying indoors if too much pollen is in the air. Using an air filter and keeping windows closed can also help reduce allergens indoors.


Because many of the allergens that trigger eye allergies are airborne, the following steps can be taken to relieve unavoidable seasonal allergy symptoms that pop up:


- Use over-the-counter artificial tears to dilute and flush out allergens from the eyes. This will also relieve some of the itching and redness.
- Apply a cold compress to the eyes to ease discomfort and reduce puffiness.
- Over-the-counter antihistamines that are designed to help nasal allergies can also help treat eye allergies.
- For more severe seasonal allergic conjunctivitis cases, an ophthalmologist can prescribe eye drops such as mast cell stabilizers and topical antihistamines which block histamines from being released.

Histamines are derived from an amino acid and once released; it increases the blood flow to areas that are injured or to areas where a foreign substance has entered the body. In the case of allergies, histamines kick in when materials such as pollen or ragweed touch the surface of the eye.

Don't let this time of year get you irritated: preventative measures and topical treatments can help allergy sufferers get the "spring" back in their step.









Kidz Crossword Puzzle






