### **Pool News**

It's here! The 2007 Swim Season has officially begun! Starting May 1 the pool will be open Tuesday – Sunday for your enjoyment. There will be no lifeguards on duty until Memorial Day Weekend, so please be sure to accompany all children for their safety. Also, the Splash Pad is open Thursday – Tuesday, with cleaning taking place Wednesdays. Please take a moment to look over the rules and regulations of our water amenities to ensure we can all enjoy them throughout the summer!

### **Swimming Pool Rules and Regulations:**

These rules and regulations, for the safe and sanitary operation of the pool, are for your protection and benefit.

- No glass containers in the pool/park area.
- All persons using the pool or pool area do so at their own risk and sole responsibility.
- Children under 10 years of age must be accompanied at all times by an individual 18 years of age or older to be admitted to the pool area.
- All members and their guests must register with the lifeguard upon entering the pool facility.
- Members will be held responsible for the actions of their guests.
- Management will not be held responsible for loss or damage of any personal property of any kind.

- The pool may be closed or its use limited at any time because of weather, operational difficulties, overcrowding and at the discretion of the manager. In case of lightning or thunder, Red Cross current standards will be used.
- No pets are allowed in the pool area.
- Alcohol and other drugs are prohibited.
- Profanity, improper behavior and intoxication are not allowed.
- It is requested that any individuals infected with a communicable disease, please not enter the pool facility for at least two weeks.
- All non-toilet-trained babies must wear swim diapers.
- The wading pool is limited to children under the age of 6 years old. Parents are responsible for the supervision of their children at all times.
- Running, pushing, wrestling, ball playing, dunking, splashing or causing undue disturbance in or about the pool area will not be tolerated.
- No diving in areas 6 feet deep or less per Texas code.
- Only Coast Guard approved life preservers are permitted and the supervising adult must be within arms reach of the child wearing the life preserver.
- Appropriate swimwear must be worn in the pool. No cut off jeans or pants, shorts or tennis pants, and only white shirts can *(Continued on page 5)*

be worn as protection from the sun in the water.

- Smoking prohibited inside pool area.
- Persons under the age of 18 are required to leave the pool upon signal of the lifeguard for adult swim/safety break. During this period, persons under the age of 18 must be completely out of the water.
- For the safety and enjoyment of all, the lifeguards have full authority to ask disruptive or unruly guests to leave the facility.

### **Splash Pad Rules**

In order to maintain the surface of our splash pad, wagons, skateboards, bicycles, tricycles, rollerblades, strollers or any other object may not be used on the surface of the pad. The only things allowed are the pitter patter of little feet and water.

When there is a street light that is out near your home, please report these to the website www. centerpointenergy.com/outage or 713-923-3213. You will need the home address near the street light that is in question and the number located on the pole. Help keep our neighborhood safe!

### Are You Registered To Vote?

On Saturday, May 12; voters will go to the polls to vote on a \$198 million school bond referendum. The bond package provides for new district facilities, renovations at existing campuses, new technology, security cameras and additional school buses.

Over the next five years, Tomball ISD is projected to grow by more than 3,000 students. In order to accommodate student growth, the District is proposing to add classrooms by building new facilities and constructing additional classroom wings at some schools.

This anticipated student growth prompted the District to commission a Facility Study Steering Committee, which was organized last summer and comprised of 41 community members. These individuals, and other volunteers who served on three subcommittees, looked at enrollment projections, analyzed district needs and then made recommendations to the Board of Trustees. TISD Board of Trustees reviewed the recommendations and unanimously approved the \$198 million bond proposal being presented to voters.

In order to vote, you must be registered. To be a registered voter you must complete a Texas Voter Registration Application and place the application in the mail. This form is pre-addressed. No envelope or postage is required.
