



#### A GENTLE REMINDER: LOOSE PETS/BARKING DOGS GOOD DOGS NEEDS LEASHES TOO!!

Now that Spring is upon us and the weather will become pleasant, many of us will be outside more often and taking our pets walking with us. To most of us, our pets are members of our family. Sometimes we forget that our best friend won't snap at us but may snap at an unfamiliar face or another dog. Harris County law states that when your pet is outside the confines of your property, that pet (dog or cat) must be leashed and under the direct supervision of a responsible person.

It has been brought to our attention by many residents of Fairfield, that there has been an increase in the amount of dogs (and cats) running loose (being left outside of backyards and homes) and unusually prolonged and noisy barking. We have been receiving an increasing amount of "barking dog" calls. This problem can be easily solved by the purchase of a bark collar. They have become fairly reasonable in price and have been advised this is a humane way to control barking.

Again, some of us forget out pets are strangers to others and just by letting them out for a few minutes or longer can lead to a dangerous situation. As stated above, the Harris County Animal Control Ordinance governs all pets within Harris County, which includes the Fairfield Community. Please adhere to these laws as they have been put in place for the safety and well being of everyone in the community. No dog obeys 100% of the time and a leash goes a long way to comfort people who fear dogs. Dogs, even good dogs, can sense fear and aggression. They communicate with body language that often is not read until it's too late. If your dog truly stays at your side, putting on a leash should not cause an inconvenience to.

Harris County Animal Control has been notified of this problem and will consider any roaming animal a stray. Your pet could be picked up by Animal Control, taken to the Harris County Animal Control facility and, if your pet is not claimed within three days, it will be destroyed. (To claim a pet from this facility can be expensive and very sad and frustrating). The Harris County Deputies and Constables are also aware of this problem and may, at their discretion, issue citations to owners whose pets are roaming loose in the community or being walked without a leash. Ownership of animals is fairly quickly ascertained by talking with neighbors and the children who play outside.

Also, should your pet need to relieve itself, please be prepared to immediately clean up after your pet.

#### Harvest Bible Church

Did You Know? Why are there so many versions to the Bible, and can we really trust a document that has been translated and re-translated so many times?

The King James Version (KJV) was first published in 1611, and it was a masterpiece of literature. For hundreds of years people read it and came to know Jesus Christ. So why would anyone attempt to improve greatness? For the same simple reason that the KJV was originally published: in order to create a readable text in a modern tongue. The KJV was put together so that everyone in England could read their Bibles and understand what they were reading. The same is true today with each new translation of the Bible from the TNIV to the Message.

Of course there are many different translations of the Bible in print today. Most of them are good translations insofar as they reflect the earliest and most accurate Greek manuscripts of the New Testament and Hebrew manuscripts of the Old Testament. But be assured that each and every new translation of the Bible published today stems not from a previous translation of the Bible but from the earliest Greek and Hebrew manuscripts. And the best English translations are published not by one person but by entire teams of scholars who work together to not only reflect the thought of the original author but also to put that original thought into the modern lingo.

The modern translations, however, have omitted some of the stories that the KJV scholars included. For instance, modern translations end Mark's gospel at 16:8, they omit the reference of the angel of the Lord stirring the waters at the pool of Bethesda in John 5:4, and they delete the story of the woman caught in adultery in John 7:53-8:11. Why? Because the earliest manuscripts that have been discovered since the creation of the KJV do not contain these stories. Because there were only a half dozen Greek manuscripts available in the 17th century when the KJV was put together – dating back only as far

as the 9th century – these stories appear to have crept into the text as later additions by that time. The modern English translations utilize more recent Greek manuscript finds – manuscripts which date back to the second, third, and fourth centuries – over 500 years earlier than the manuscripts used to put the KJV together. And these older manuscripts don't contain the three citations listed above. These seem to have been added by later scribes describing actual events, but they weren't words written by the original author.

Besides omissions, modern versions do change the text slightly. For example, the KJV text of 1 Timothy 3:16 says, "God was manifest in the flesh," but most modern translations read, "He was manifest in the flesh" (simply because the earlier Greek used the pronoun). Altogether, there are hundreds of textual changes just like this between the KJV and modern translations, but as you can see they are insignificant. The truth is, the textual changes in the modern translations affect no major doctrine. The deity of Christ, the virgin birth, salvation by grace alone, and all the others are all perfectly intact. Though certain passages are omitted or changed, the doctrines are not. And even when you put all the minor changes together, the Greek manuscripts behind the KJV and the ones behind the modern translations are literally more than 99% in agreement!

Has the Bible been translated and re-translated through the centuries? Of course it has. But the English translations today are more accurate to the original time of writing than ever before. And altogether there are over 5,600 Greek manuscripts of the New Testament to compare with each other to determine the accuracy of any given text. The closest book of antiquity with manuscript evidence is Homer's The Iliad, and it only has 643 manuscripts (the earliest dates to the 13th century!). The Bible is believable, and praise God! It just so happens to be His Word. Permeated throughout the Bible is God's revelation of Himself. It's worth studying.

## Heart-related Strokes Trigger 'Double-jeopardy' Race Against Time

Baylor College of Medicine

HOUSTON -- When a stroke stems from disorders of both the heart and mind, the window to save a victim's life closes nearly as fast as the onset of symptoms.

"In terms of damage, a stroke originating from the heart presents a double jeopardy for the patient," said Dr. Wayne Franklin, assistant professor of medicine-cardiology at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. "The treatment and recovery effort are magnified."

Roughly 20 percent of all instances of ischemic stroke, in which blood supply to the brain is blocked, result from cardioemboli, or clots in the heart that break off and clog blood vessels in the brain.

During onset of heart-related strokes, or cardioembolic strokes, doctors are in a race against time to treat them, given that the brain cannot survive more than a few hours without treatment. The complicated nature of cardioembolic strokes, which can block blood flow to parts of the brain, makes it all the more challenging for doctors to arrive at a proper diagnosis.

"They need a whole work-up – head CT scan, head MRI, carotid Doppler exam, EKG, echocardiogram – to determine if the cause is from a clot in the heart or from a narrowing of blood vessels," said Franklin, who is also medical director of the Texas Adult Congenital Heart Center. "Time is of the essence."

Fortunately, clot-busting medications can be administered shortly after the onset of stroke to reestablish blood flow to the brain, although room for improvement remains.

"Anti-clotting oral medications are in development that are easier to monitor and less erratic in their effect," said Franklin.


Cardioembolic stroke from clots that originate in the heart have several possible causes, the most prevalent being atrial fibrillation, a condition caused by an abnormal heart rhythm that can go undetected.

"It is quite common to have atrial fibrillation as people get older, but it can be treated with medication to prevent clot formation, and it can also be treated with drugs that control heart rhythm and rate," said Franklin.

For ischemic strokes from narrowed arteries, surgical options include carotid endarterectomy, a procedure that cleans out diseased neck blood vessels, as well as ballooning and stenting of carotid arteries, all of which go a long way toward preventing further ischemic strokes.

"Stroke is the number three killer in this country and has caused a great deal of sickness and disease," said Franklin. "But we can prevent more of it by detecting and treating it earlier."



# Pregnancy and Dental Care?

Hello Friends,

Now that you are pregnant, so many exciting changes await your body.

Those changes can include changes in the mouth as well. If you have tender gums, or if the gums bleed when you are brushing then you have pregnancy gingivitis.

This is caused by plaque accumulating in the gums and on the teeth surfaces.

Usually if gingivitis is left untreated, it can cause irreversible gum disease called periodontitis. However, if the pregnancy gingivitis is left untreated, it can additionally cause complications with your pregnancy, such as premature childbirth.

The increased blood flow during pregnancy and the increased hormone production makes you more susceptible to gum disease.

I will recommend the prevention method. Brush twice a day for 3 minutes minimum. Be really gentle when brushing your teeth. Use a mouthwash twice a day, morning and night. Avoid eating too much sugar. However, if you have consumed a large amount, brush right after.

All pregnant women should receive at least two thorough dental cleanings during pregnancy. This will help prevent getting gingivitis during pregnancy.
