

The plans for the outlet mall continue to roll along. A meeting of concerned citizens was held at the Fairfield Methodist Church a few Saturdays ago. As you are aware trash days are Tuesday and Friday of each week. What you may not be aware of is that your contract with Waste Management is for back door pick up. Back door pick up is "at your garage door". Please refrain from placing your trashcans at the curb, it's truly unattractive. Dental Tip of the Month.

Dear Friends,

As we all know, over time most teeth typically will loss their brightness and luster due to various factors. Staining of the teeth is very common and some individuals have a yellow or grayish color, but this does not necessarily mean that they are not healthy. There are two categories of dental stains, extrinsic and intrinsic. Extrinsic stains such as coffee, tea, and wines can be minimized by brushing twice a week with a mixture of equal amounts of baking soda and hydrogen peroxide. Also, regular visits with your dentist to remove the accumulation that is impossible to remove at home. The second kind of discoloration occurs during early tooth development. The contributing factors are antibiotics, excess fluoride, injury of a baby tooth, iron supplements, and high fever. Also habits such as grinding, brushing with a hard tooth brush, and biting into lemons can thin the enamel, causing the layer under it to show through. This makes the tooth appear a lot darker as the darker second layer of the tooth is a lot more visible.

Remember, if you feel as though your smile is not as white and bright as you would like ti to be, only your dentist can determine the reasons and true causes behind it. There are several reasonable and effective procedures to whiten your smile and it starts with a visit to your dentist.

Water Safety

National Recreational Water Illness Prevention Week was May 21st - 28th. The purpose of this is to educate people about water illness prevention that is mainly caused by swimmers that have or have had diarrhea within the past 24 hours and also from those that don't wash their hands well after using the restroom or changing a diaper.

There is a chlorine-resistant pathogen, Cryptosporidium (Crypto), which is easily transmitted through the water.

Only 38% of Crypto outbreaks are primarily the result of poor pool maintenance.

Go to http://www.cdc.gov/healthyswimming/rwi_prevention_week. htm for more information on this subject. They recommend that you remember to swim your LAAPS, which stands for:

Look at the water and surroundings. Is the pool water clear, are the pool sides clean (no sticky or slippery tiles)? Is there a strong chemical smell? Do you hear pool equipment running?

Ask questions of the pool staff. What is their specialized training? Are chlorine and PH levels checked at least twice per day (more often during crowded times)? What was the health inspector's grade for the pool after the last inspection?

Act by being proactive and educating others. Urge your pool management to educate the public on the health matters. A lot of people don't know that you shouldn't swim if you've had a diarrhea episode within the past 24 hours – so tell all your friends. Check the chemicals yourself by using simple test strips (follow the link above for more information).

Practice healthy swimming behaviors. Don't swim if you have diarrhea or had it in the past 24 hours. Don't swallow the water. Parents of young children should be aware that they sometimes swallow water when going under without your knowledge. Look for signs of a bulging stomach, or much urination after swimming. If you see signs of your child drinking the water, keep them above the surface until they are old enough to know to keep their mouth closed while underwater. Take children on frequent bathroom breaks. Adult swim is the perfect time to do this. If your child has a bowel movement, be sure that hands are washed well and long before getting back into the pool. Always change diapers away from the pool area and fully clean area where changing took place. Wash hands well.

Safety is of utmost importance. Keep your eyes on your child constantly. Drowning can happen in seconds and is silent. Don't use air-filled arm floaties in place of Coast Guard approved lifejackets. Protect against sunburn by using sunscreen before getting to the pool. Use water-proof sunscreen with UVA and UVB protection. Give it time to soak into skin before getting into the water. Remember to reapply when staying at the pool for longer than 1-2 hours. Even though it's water-proof, it needs a second or third dose when staying in the sun for a prolonged time.



Did You Know? The Bible says, "He who is without sin among you, let him be the first to throw a stone" (John 8:7). These were the words of Jesus when the religious leaders brought a woman caught in the act of adultery to him as they sought to trap him so as to persecute him. Now the Law of Moses declared that adulterers were to be executed by stoning, so if the religious leaders who were setting Jesus up could get Jesus to let her go on mercy, then they could charge him with disregarding the Law. It was an exceptionally clever trap, but Jesus escaped it with a simple statement that cleared the crowd of executioners and silenced the religious leaders.

Now even though it is popular today to quote this passage to people who are seemingly judging us, the Bible does not forbid judging the behavior of Christians who sin. Matter of fact, the Bible commands Christians to hold other believers accountable to the biblical standard of perfection. Christians who stray from the truth are to be rebuked, corrected, and encouraged to repent (2 Tim. 4:2). The Bible does, however, forbid hypocrisy – judging the sins of others when we ourselves are guilty of the same (Matt. 7:1). With this in mind, John 8:7 makes so much more sense. But before that is addressed a couple of things should be noted here about the text itself.

First of all, the text of John 7:53-8:11 does not appear in any of the numerous Greek manuscripts of the New Testament (NT) until the sixth century. This means that the hundreds of manuscripts handed down from the first century to the sixth century do not contain this account.

Second, the account is clearly not the writing of John the Apostle. The style and vocabulary of the passage differ from the rest of the John's writings, and it interrupts the sequence from 7:52-8:12. That said, the account most likely contains the genuine words of Jesus along with an accurate account of the event. It is probably a part of true oral tradition which was added to later Greek manuscripts by scribes who wanted to include the story in John's Gospel.

Now back to the application of John 8:7. Jesus was seemingly in a quandary. To let the adulterous woman go was to ignore Moses. But to execute her would be merciless. So Jesus looked at everyone who had stones in their hands to throw at the guilty woman and said, "He who is without sin among you, let him be the first to throw a stone at her." Now if this statement were applicable for all Christians then none of us would be able to obey the NT command to rebuke sinful behavior since all of us are guilty of sin. What Jesus was really saying was, "He among you who is without the exact same sin, let him be the first to throw a stone at her." No wonder all of the woman's accusers dropped their stones and walked away. They were all hypocritical adulterers! Jesus actually was upholding the Law of Moses but commanding only those who were not adulterers to perform the execution.

Christians are to recognize and judge sin within the Christian community (Matt. 18:15-20; 1 Cor. 5:11; Gal. 6:1). The Bible demands it. Ongoing rebellious sin is not to be tolerated in the church. Jesus made it clear that Christians who tolerate immorality and false teachers among themselves would be judged harshly by him (Rev. 2:14-16; 19-24). We are to hate that which God hates and hold one another to the highest standards as written by God in the Bible. No more judging the judges with "he among you who is without sin..." That would give believers a license to sin without any ramifications. And it would prevent math teachers from putting an "x" on tests that say 2 + 2 = 5. It would also keep the police from judging law breakers.

When people look at Christians they are supposed to see Christ. We are to be holy as Christ is holy and to exhibit Christian behavior – always. No excuses. Our pride may be hurt when rebuked, but how much more severe will Christ's discipline be not only for the rebellious sinner but for those who refuse to rebuke sin and call it what it is?

Summer Skin

Once again, winter has faded into spring and spring has burst into summer. Along comes the invincible summer sun, your skin's arch-enemy, particularly if you exercise outdoors. Most people know that using a sunscreen is essential protection, but knowing and doing are often two different things. There are a number of ways to promote a healthy glow without exposing your skin to harmful rays.

Sunscreen

Every sunscreen has a sun protection factor, or SPF, which is a measure of its strength or effectiveness. Each of us needs a different SPF, depending on whether, and to what degree, our skin burns or tans. A tan is the direct result of melanin, a brown pigment found in the epidermis that is produced when skin is exposed to sunlight. Melanin protects the skin by absorbing, reflecting and scattering ultraviolet radiation before it penetrates the dermis, or underlying skin. However, armor that it is, melanin can't prevent all the negative effects of the sun, and is often representative of damage. That's why we need to use sunscreens.

To determine what SPF your skin requires, you must know how long it takes your skin to burn when unprotected and exposed to sunlight. As a rule of thumb, anyone whose skin burns, whether or not it turns into a tan, should use an SPF of 15. Check with your doctor or pharmacist if you are taking antibiotics, antidepressives or antidiuretics. Some of these medications increase your skin's sensitivity to sunlight and may decrease the time it takes your skin to burn.

Creating a Barrier

When exercising outdoors on a hot, sunny day, light-weight, light-colored clothing combined with plenty of sunscreen on both exposed and unexposed skin is the way to go. However, if overheating isn't a concern, dark-colored, tightly woven clothing is more effective at blocking UV rays than say, a white T-shirt, which allows UV rays to reach the skin. Another barrier against sun damage comes in the form of eyewear. Protect not only your eyes, but the skin around them by wearing sunglasses that block 90 percent to 100 percent of the sun's UV rays.

And, last but not least, wear a hat. Though a cap may be more comfortable for jogging, try a wide-brimmed hat that will shade your neck and face while gardening or walking outside.

Sunscreen Facts

- Wear sunscreen every day if you will be outside for more than 20 minutes, even when it's cloudy.
- Sunscreen should be applied 15 to 30 minutes before going outdoors, and reapplied every two hours or after swimming or sweating.
- Don't skimp: One ounce—enough to fill a shot glass—is considered the amount needed to properly cover exposed
- Limit your exposure to sunlight from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. during Daylight Savings Time (9 a.m.-3 p.m. during Standard Time) when the sun's rays are the strongest and most harmful.
- When choosing a sunscreen, look for one with an SPF of 15 or higher that provides broad-spectrum coverage against all ultraviolet light wavelengths.
- Throw out old bottles of sunscreen, which can lose strength after three

Start with the Inside

Now that you know how to protect the skin's surface, it's time to start thinking about what you can do to make it glow from the inside out. You're already off to a good start with exercise, which gets the blood circulating and delivers fresh oxygen to the skin all over your body. The next step is to drink plenty of water. Outdoor exercise, especially in the summer, increases your risk of dehydration. This is one risk you don't want to take since it not only affects your performance and robs your skin of its vitality, but



may be potentially hazardous to your health. Be sure to drink fluids before, during and after activity. To replenish your fluids after any outdoor activity, weigh yourself before you participate and then again after. Any weight you lost is water and should be replaced by drinking two glasses (16 ounces) of water for every pound you have lost.

Everyone Needs a Little Sunlight

It's been shown that a lack of sunlight can cause depression. After all, most plants won't even grow without sunshine. And when the sun comes around and makes the days longer, our first instinct is to peel off our sweaters and bask in it. Go ahead. Just take precautions so vou won't have to deal with the unpleasant (and unnecessary) consequences.

What SPF Do You Need?

Follow these steps to calculate what SPF you should look for in a sunscreen:

- 1. Determine how many minutes your bare skin can be exposed to the sun before it
- 2. Divide that number of minutes into the total number of minutes you want to remain in
- 3. The result is the SPF you should look for in a sunscreen. For example, if your unprotected skin burns in 10 minutes, and you plan on being in the sun for three hours, you would need a sunscreen with an SPF of at least 18 (180 minutes divided by 10 minutes).
