I was recently asked about the Red Onion Restaurant that was 'alleged' to move into the space formerly occupied by the Southwest Buffalo Grill and this is not going to happen because of a lease disagreement. I passed along information that I heard at the time and this deal blew up so it won't be coming here. As I stated before and got reconfirmed, Lupe Tortilla and Goode Company Barbeque are coming and they are now negotiating with the Tex DOT to get a cut out in the street on the frontage road to 290 for both stores to be accessible.

Kids are out in force and will be for the next few months so please let's all be careful driving down the streets and look out for children playing.

On a final note, we've been very fortunate with our communications in newsletters in that we had Tricia McDonald (our originator), Emily Roeber (editor of our newsletter) and now Vicky Yanowski (newsletter 'coordinator'). I recently learned that Vicky is leaving us and moving on and we wish her the best of everything and she has done a great job in coordinating our newsletter and getting it ready to hand off to our publisher, Peel. Now we are beginning our search for Vicky's replacement. 
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Women's Tennis Team Places Second



I live in hope, though, that someday he will see the wisdom of getting rid of stuff you haven't looked at or used in a year. Then maybe we could get our cars in the garage....





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

With kids home from school for the summer, donations of canned meats and snack foods of all types would be greatly appreciated.

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


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
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




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
