

# Texas Rattlers 12AAA Baseball Team Finishes 2nd in the Nation!!

The Texas Rattlers, a Cy-Fair 12AAA team, went to the USSSA World Series in Hutchinson, Kansas this past week (7/9-15/2007) to fulfill their dreams of winning the championship. The boys went into the World Series seating in the number one position in the nation, a position they've been in for most of the year. With the dedicated and knowledgeable coaching staff of Jerry Boling, Robert Knode, Welton Whitley, and Joe Toliver the Rattlers have been winning tournaments from League City to Dallas and from Brookshire to Baton Rouge and all areas in between this season. In preparation for the World Series, the team had practices three to four times a week for up to 3 ½ hours at a time. "I know what it's going to take to get through the World Series tournament - and I just want to make sure the boys are up to the physical demands of it," explained Coach Jerry. After three games of pool play to determine the seeding for the tournament the Ratters seeded in the 11th spot due to one loss. The Rattlers went into the 1st game of the series and lost to the Mississippi Mustangs. Being a double elimination series, two loses and you're out, Coach Jerry gave the boys a major pep talk before game two. After that the boys went out and beat the number one seeded team of the tournament, the Illinois Lake in the Hills Thunder, 7 to 4. The team went on to win the next 5 games. On Saturday morning the boys lost their last game and ended up 5th out of 56 teams from around the nation. With all the points tallied up after the World Series the Texas Rattlers ended the season in the number 2 position in the USA. "There's nothing to be disappointed about with our performance here, we fought

back and that's what it takes!" cheered Coach Jerry. "I'm very proud of the way our boys played. They had the lowest average runs allowed in the tournament and that's something to brag about."

# **Harvest Bible Church**

Did you Know?... Therefore, since we receive a kingdom which cannot be shaken, let us show gratitude, by which we may offer to God an acceptable service with reverence and awe; 29 for our God is a consuming fire (Hebrews 12:28-29).

God's kingdom "cannot be shaken." It is not of this earth which was cursed from Genesis 3 onward due to man's sin. His future kingdom is a new heaven and earth that is not susceptible to sin. The fact that it is unshakable means that the events which occurred in Genesis 3 cannot occur again when God completes His plan in eternity. This is the place where believers go in spite of their sins simply because they believed in Jesus Christ's atoning work on the cross for salvation. They don't deserve salvation, but God has graciously granted it as a gift.

Now since Christians will receive such a kingdom by God's grace, the genuine ones will worship Christ continually. The tense of the Greek verb in Hebrews 12:28 literally says, "Let us be continually grateful." Now the only way to exist in a continual state of gratefulness is to never lose sight of what Jesus Christ has graciously done for us. It's quite possible that the reason people don't think too much about heaven today is because they have it too good here on the earth. But genuine believers in Christ always remember and live in a continual state of gratitude.

Gratitude for what Christ has so graciously given allows Christians to "offer to God an acceptable service with reverence and awe" (v. 28). Reverence for God entails caution, respect, discretion, and pious care. Awe over God is a timid apprehension of danger. It's not the same concept as "fear" in the sense of being horribly frightened, but it is closely related. Taken together, being continually thankful to God translates into a life wholly focused on Jesus Christ.

This proves that non-Christians absolutely cannot worship Christ, for true worship comes from a thankful heart over what Christ has done. Unbelievers do not accept Christ's atoning sacrifice, and until they realize that they have been forgiven of sin they simply can't worship. The pep-rally churches many of them attend – filled with rock music and theatrics – only serve to deceive these previously unchurched people. They come home fired up believing that church is supposed to entertain. But their souls are still lost and in need of the Lord Jesus Christ.

True worship is acceptable to God, and it is offered with reverence and awe for God. In the Old Testament when an animal was offered on the altar of burnt offering, the fire consumed it. This is what it means in Heb. 12:29 that "our God is a consuming fire," for God is either going to accept our worship or reject it. If it's offered with reverence, awe, and gratitude to Christ, it is acceptable – consumed on the altar of worship. But note the terror surrounding God for those who do not offer proper worship and who fall back into a religion of works to gain God's approval. For them God is a consuming fire, one that devours His enemies when He shakes the earth at the end of time (cf. Heb. 10:27; Num. 11:1; 16:35; Ps. 97:3; Isa. 66:15; 2 Thess. 1:8).

If God has led you to worship Him, and if you want to know Jesus Christ as He has revealed Himself in the Bible, we invite you to visit Harvest Bible Church. At HBC we seek to know what the Bible says, what it means, and how it applies to us. It's not a pep-rally, a concert, or a stage show. It's simple music, biblical expository preaching, and sinful hypocritical people gathering together to know Christ better to be sufficiently equipped for the work of ministry. It was 1978, twenty-six years ago. I was eight, and it was my birthday. I was told to make a list of four or five friends who'd enjoy the water theme park in nearby Tampa, Florida. Since we didn't have any spare money, the trip would be a packed lunch and no extras. I didn't care -- I was getting a special treat! The great day arrived and my mother, younger brother, six friends and I piled into our old beat-up station wagon. We headed out of town for an hour and a half ride to the amusement park, for a day of sun and fun. About halfway to the water park the car started running bad and the "check engine" light came on. My mom pulled the car over. We were stuck, wondering when someone would stop to help. An hour passed. A police officer stopped to see if we were all right and called a tow truck to pick up the car. On the way to the service station, Mom told the officer where we were headed, as it was my birthday and a special treat. The officer dropped us off and left after giving me a short ride in the police car "as a birthday present". At the service station, the mechanic explained the water pump needed to be replaced. The cost, plus the tow, would be \$135. Mom started crying and pulled me aside. She explained we wouldn't have enough money to go anywhere but home, and we'd have to save up to go somewhere else for my birthday later. I was disappointed but tried not to show it, knowing even at that age that we didn't have much money. We tried to make the best of the day, the nine of us having a picnic at the service station with the cake Mom had baked. Eventually the mechanic called Mom into the office, saying the repairs were completed, but he had to make a phone call before we could leave. He hung up the phone and said to have a seat and wait. The next thing I knew the police officer came in the door of the service station. He walked up to me with a wrapped present, handed it to me, and wished me a happy birthday. Then he paid the

mechanic for the repairs and tow. The officer told mom his family didn't have much money growing up and he knew we didn't either. He said my birthday trip shouldn't be ruined because of something we had no control over. Out of a simple act of kindness this officer changed my life. I'm a single father raising two children of my own now and am not rich, but I remember that day and try to help others in need whenever I get a chance. A small act can change a person forever, and I try to instill this concept into my children's daily lives. ---- A True Story by Chris Avera
