Request to COA <u>Re: Slaughter Lane and new SW Middle School</u>

As some of you may be aware AISD is constructing a new middle school at the corner of Slaughter Lane and FM 1826. They asked the CCHOA to join them in their request to the City of Austin to lower the speed limit along Slaughter Lane, east of Escarpment, and to allow a median cut to be created at the north drive of the middle school.

Below is the CCHOA's letter to the City; the Education Committee is requesting that residents individually contact the City of Austin regarding this request. The correct contacts to send your request are:

On behalf of the Circle C Ranch community, we are writing concerning traffic issues on Slaughter Lane, primarily east of Escarpment. The Austin Independent School District (AISD) is currently constructing a new middle school at the corner of Slaughter Lane and FM 1826, to be completed in August 2009. According to design plans, buses traveling south on Slaughter (from FM 1826) would turn into a north drive, continue around the school, and exit onto Slaughter at the existing median cut. Parent traffic would turn in to the south drive, travel through the drop-off loop, and exit onto Slaughter, turning left or right.

However, we have learned that the City of Austin has not approved the design plan for the median cut along Slaughter Lane at the north drive of the school, due

to the speed limit along Slaughter and the proximity of the new median cut to the existing median cut. We are requesting that the speed limit on Slaughter Lane be reduced immediately and the new median cut be approved.

The Circle C Ranch community remains one of the fastest growing communities in Austin and the speed limit along Slaughter Lane is no longer suitable for the increased traffic traveling on that road each day. Upon completion of this new middle school, it is imperative the City of Austin take every possible measure to ensure the safety of the children attending the school, as well as cyclist and pedestrian traffic, and promote an efficient traffic flow around the school, as well as on Slaughter.

Without the proposed median cut, both buses and parent traffic would be forced to use the south drive, and parent traffic would be forced to make only a right turn upon exit. This is an unnecessary situation which will only increase residential traffic and create a dangerous situation for children and parents walking or cycling to school.

We join AISD in requesting the City of Austin take action to lower the speed limit along Slaughter Lane, east of Escarpment, and allow the median cut to be created at the north drive of the middle school. We appreciate your consideration of our request and look forward to seeing this matter addressed appropriately.



Circle C Landscape Submitted by Susan Hoover

Hopefully, by the time you get this newsletter we will have had enough dry weather that we will have caught up on trimming and treating the commons areas. The unusual summer weather really caused a lot of growth for our vegetation and trees—literally about 5 times the normal growth rate. It was also the perfect climate for all kinds of weeds, sort of like having a string of Aprils rather than our usual summer hot drought weather.

We have some good things to report. First of all, over the past three years, Circle C Landscape has made numerous recommendations regarding the irrigation system that waters the commons areas. It is very extensive with the water being controlled by 36 irrigation controllers, each that have about 20 sections (valves) with an average of 15 heads each. That amounts to about 700 valves and 10,000 irrigation heads. With the support of the CCHOA Board over the years, we have standardized all the controllers, installed remote capacity for irrigation checking, upgraded all of the rain sensors, installed gate valves on the major boulevards to allow convenient shut off in the case of a repair, and most importantly found a good solution to areas where we have irrigation but had no electricity to run a controller. Three years ago, we had approximately 60 valves that ran on batteries (not good). By the end of this year, there will be only one place where we have to run something in this manner. All of this adds up to much more efficient water management and water savings.

We will be working on improvements this fall to include installation of native perennial beds on Escarpment. These will be initially located at the corner street entrances and in the medians where there are tree wells under the trees with no vegetation. Hopefully, some of these will be done by the time you get the newsletter.

On the home front, the end of October is a good time to put on

your winter fertilizer. This treatment is really important in getting your grass off to a good start next spring. You can pick up some good tips for how much to apply at the City of Austin Grow Green website at www.ci.austin.tx.us/growgreen/

Since we began our drive of the entire neighborhood in March we have sent over 400 notices of deed restriction violation. We have had 300+ residents cure their violation and we would like to THANK YOU for cooperating with the association. Violations may include, but are not limited to: excessive weeds, areas of no turf, dead shrubs and/or trees, yard art, grass that is not edged or mowed and areas of dead grass. We encourage each of you to evaluate your lawn now so that you have time to re-sod if needed before the heat of summer. Please also refer to the City of Austin Grow Green website at www. growgreen.org. We are required to send notification of deed restriction violations via certified mail and we also send regular mail. If you receive a deed restriction violation notice and would like to speak to us about your plans for improvement, please contact the HOA office at 288-8663. It's impossible to know everyone's individual situation, so we appreciate communication from you. We also recommend that you review the architectural control committee's landscape design guidelines located within this newsletter.

If you have a deed restriction to report, you may email us the specific address at info@circlecranch.info or give us a call at 288-8663. Violations that are reported are generally checked with 2 business days and if we are able to confirm a violation, we will begin the deed restriction process (which you can access on the website at http://www.circlecranch.info/documents/AssociationDocuments/DeedRestrictions/CCHOA-DeedRestrictionPolicy2003.pdf

Deed Restriction Tip: Homes that are 12years+ need to closely evaluate the condition of their roof, paint or power-washing of siding, trim, shutters, tree pruning and sprucing up their front landscape. Remember that improvements must go through the Architectural Control Committee for approval, you can access the instructions and form online at www.circlecranch.info/landscape

September Circle C Swim Center Director's Corner

We have had quite a wild ride at the Swim Center this Summer. The weather and construction sure did present their challenges however with all that behind us now we do have lots of new and exciting changes are underway. The new administrative office/entrance is up and running we will begin taking photos of residents in February to accompany the existing pool pass system. To date we have produced 9149 pool passes for Circle C residents. It has been wonderful for staff to put names with the many faces that we see daily at the Center.

The baby pool has been a welcome long awaited addition. Use has been restricted to children 6 and younger with adult accompaniment. For the first few weeks staff have been lenient and flexible on siblings being present but based on overcrowding we have begun strictly enforcing the age requirement. Non-swimmers should be within arms reach of an adult at all times. Floatation devices of any kind i.e. water wings, noodles, life jackets, floats, are not permitted in the baby pool because every inch is needed to accommodate users. Water wings and float vest devices not only take up space but quite often they are heavily relied upon as "life saving devices" and encourage guardians to not be as attentive, interactive or within arms reach.

Overall, the slide has been great and lots of fun. However, there have been some user practices that need curtailing. Please be sure that your child is old enough to hold their seated position upright while going down the slide. If the rider is not able to stand once they reach the bottom of the slide please be sure to catch them before their face submerges into the water. Standing on the side holding the hand of a slide participant has been causing injury. If the child is not ready to independently slide (usually 2 or younger) then the parent must ride down the slide with the child seated on their lap.

I'd like to share some information that may facilitate a better understanding of pool operations and aid to ensure optimum swim time for all participants. Some of you may have arrived at the pool looking forward to enjoying our latest amenity to find a "Pool Closed Due to Contamination" sign upon your arrival. Contamination may include one of 3 various culprits; blood, fecal matter, or vomit. While

these topics are not popular discussion points by any stretch of the imagination it is imperative to explain how their occurrences impact our facility and may be avoided.

A Blood closure usually occurs after a sever injury with copious amounts (approx ½ a cup or more) entering the body of water. Luckily we have not had one of these at our facility this season. Fecal contamination may occur when frequent trips are not taken (usually with younger swimmers) to the bathroom during one's visit or if there is an ill swimmer suffering from diarrhea. Vomit, which has been the most common contamination closure occurs often when a child has swallowed too much pool water. This usually transpires in non-swimmers who do not have the skill set to manage breath control in the water i.e. toddlers. This may be avoided by constant vigilance of the child's water intake during his visit to the pool. As we all know eating prior to swimming has long been a discouraged practice not only for the potential of cramping but also because this too coupled with water intake may cause regurgitation and as a result contaminating the water.

When one of the aforementioned contaminants enters the communal bathing water the pool must be closed for an amount of time specified by the Texas Department of Health for proper sanitation. With due diligence and a watchful eye hopefully together we can prevent any further disappointments from the occurrence of pool water contaminations.

Thanks to all who came out to participate in the Back to School/Baby Pool Grand Opening. We had over 900 visitors to the pool that day. Also, a special thanks to Carlos Martinez for supplying the D.J. and to Vitamin Water for handing out free samples to very hot and thirsty swimmers. Please check out our fall program offerings that include a master's style adult coached swim, a women's only fitness boot camp, water aerobics and private swim lessons in this edition of the newsletter or call us at the Swim Center for more information 288-6057 or with any questions you may have.



Music Education and Your Child: Part 2 - How to Start Your Music Study?

"When should my children begin music lessons? What instrument should they start with? How do I find the right teacher? Is music just a waste of time?" I hear these questions daily from concerned parents who want the best for their children. Over time, music education is being removed from the primary and secondary education curriculum, and more and more parents are finding themselves in the position of being responsible for their child's musical education.

To get started, first decide what instrument to pursue. The age of the student has a bearing on instrument selection. Many students as young as three years old can be successful with either piano or violin. Students should usually be at least 7 or 8 years old to pursue guitar, drums, or voice study. Woodwind and brass instruments are usually best undertaken after the age of 9 or 10. The cost of the instrument should have less bearing on the instrument choice, as rental instruments are readily available. Many parents choose to rent an instrument during the beginning phases of study, until they are sure that the students likes the instrument they have chosen. That way, parents can postpone a sometimes expensive purchase.

Regardless of the student's age, piano is an excellent first instrument for several reasons. First, children learn to read both treble and bass clefs. Second, piano is a linear instrument which helps develop an understanding of musical scales and note reading. Third, piano is the only instrument that teaches both chords and melody, and how the two relate. Fourth, students don't have to be concerned about proper tuning of the notes - this is helpful because beginning students can be easily demotivated if the music they produce sounds bad because the notes are not in tune. Many parents are concerned about pursuing piano because of the size and cost of pianos. However children can begin their study on an inexpensive keyboard for the first few years. During that time, parents can make sure the child is interested in continuing piano study before purchasing one.

Once you and your child choose the instrument to study, the next challenge is finding the right teacher. Unfortunately, too often, parents pick teachers for all the wrong reasons. Parents often choose teachers because they play their instrument well, because they have a master's or doctorate degree in their instrument, because they are located close by, or because they charge a low tuition rate. However, the most competent player or the most educated person may not interact well with children. The neighborhood teacher may not have any training

in how to teach. The cheapest teacher is almost never the best teacher. So what should a parent look for when choosing a teacher? First, find someone with formal musical training, which will ensure that your child will be taught the correct fundamentals of music. Second, it is essential that you find a teacher who enjoys working with young people and can help inspire and motivate your child. Remember, this person will have a huge influence on your child. Third, ensure that the teacher you choose has been properly trained in the proper methods to use when teaching children. There is a good chance that your child will remember their music teacher for the rest of their life – choose wisely!



Longhorns Score Big with Local Economy

The University of Texas Longhorns boost both the fans' spirits and the local economy.

Based on reports from AngelouEconomics, a leading economic development consulting firm, each home game adds an estimated economic impact of \$24 million to Austin's economy. This fall's six home-turf showdowns translate to a total economic impact of \$144 million for the 2007 season. An average of 36,000 out-of-town fans attend each home game and account for a demand of more than 14,500 hotel rooms on the accompanying weekends.

With out-of-town supporters purchasing about 45 percent of all tickets, some 216,000 fans contribute to local hotels, restaurants, retail stores and transportation systems during each season.



Fall Gardening After A Wet Summer

The summer of 2007 has been a unique experience for many Hill Country gardeners. With July bringing 17 days of rain, more than nine inches in the rain gauge, and relatively mild temperatures in the 80s, many yards were transformed into jungles — a far cry from the hot, parched plots we usually encounter as summer comes to a close. Now as fall approaches it is the perfect time to undertake most landscaping activities.

Abundant moisture has produced extraordinary growth in all of our landscape plants, including weeds. Begin your gardening efforts by removing weeds that have taken root in your yard. Try to remove weeds before they set seed. If you don't have time to remove the whole weed, at least remove the flowers.

In an established garden, an important task is keeping plants pruned, shaped and divided to maintain the original design intention. Many of our landscape plants will likely require pruning following this wet summer. Pruning perennials prevents spindly plants and helps keep

them vigorous. Shrubs may also need shaping now. Use clean, sharp pruning equipment, and disinfect pruning shears between plants to help prevent the spread of disease.

Fall is the ideal time to divide and transplant perennials. The lush growth this year may mean that you have many plants to share with friends and neighbors. Keep the plant roots dark and moist while you are moving them to their new locations, and plant them as soon as possible after digging them up.

Perennials and shrubs planted now will have a great advantage over those you plant next spring because of the extra time over winter to establish deep roots. August through October is the time to sow spring wildflower seeds, and October heralds the beginning of tree planting season in Central Texas.

Soil can benefit from the addition of compost at this time of year, especially in areas such as vegetable beds that have been in full production all summer. If you have thin soil under your turf, top dress your yard with $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch of compost now. This will work wonders

for your turf, eliminating the need for fertilizer while improving the water holding capacity of the soil.

Finally, don't forget to check in with your irrigation system. Although you may not have run the system much during this wet summer, this is a good time to check for broken and misaligned sprinkler heads. Also, cut back your watering schedule to 50 percent of the summer schedule for the cooler, wetter days of fall.

Now is the perfect time to take advantage of prime gardening season in Central Texas, under the harvest moon. And, don't forget: Just because we've had a wet year doesn't mean conserving water isn't a good idea. Test your knowledge and obtain water-saving landscaping tips for your area at http://lcra.wateriq.org.

Recognizing National Breast Cancer Awareness Month

October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month (NBCAM). Since the program began in 1985, mammography rates have more than doubled for women age 50 and over and breast cancer deaths have declined.

While this is exciting progress, there are still women who do not take advantage of early detection at all. Others do not get screening mammograms and clinical breast exams at regular intervals.

- Women age 65 and older are less likely to get mammograms than younger women even though breast cancer risk increases with age.
- Hispanic women have fewer mammograms than Caucasian women and African-American women.
- Women below poverty level are less likely than women at higher incomes to have had a mammogram within the past two years.
- Mammography use has increased for all groups except American Indians and Alaska Natives.

If all women age 40 and older took advantage of early detection methods – mammography plus breast exam – breast cancer death rates would drop much further, up to 30 percent.
