Did You Know?... In Genesis 1:24 it is written that God created all the landdwelling animals on the sixth day of creation along with mankind. Now if one takes the biblical genealogies, which date all the way back to the first man (Adam), the age of mankind and the earth itself is only about 6,000 years old. According to the Bible there is no way the earth, and no possibility that mankind, dates back 3.2 million years. But this is exactly what secular scientists want us to believe as fact, in spite of the fact that their "science" changes year after year.

Such is the case with Lucy. Lucy is a fossil discovered in 1974 from Ethiopia depicting an ape-like human that scientists hail as a possible "missing link" between apes and humans in the course of man's evolution (of course the Bible says that man was created as a man side-by-side with the animals on the sixth day of creation). All of this in spite of the physical improbability that Lucy and her kind could actually walk upright. Evolutionary scientists seem to use their education most shrewdly in cases like Lucy, mostly revealing their ability to use circular reasoning as opposed to giving facts.

Essentially in almost every way, the evidence surrounding Lucy points to an ape, not a human. Why is Lucy hailed as the greatest evidence for the "missing

link" by evolutionists? Because she's the best they've got! As one geologist said: "It is a credit to an educational establishment that banks on the ignorance of taxpayers that Lucy remains a "missing link."

So which is more believable? The so-called "science" found in textbooks and magazines or the Bible? The former changes with every new hominid fossil found in the ground and causes a reshuffling of the human evolutionary tree. The Bible, however, has never changed. God created a beautiful and perfect world in Genesis 1-2. There was no death, and all living creatures were vegetarian (since eating meat would entail death). In Genesis 3 man sinned, and sin brought death. Therefore God killed an animal in front of Adam and Eve and used its hide to cover the two shamed sinners. This was a precursor to the animal sacrifices God commanded Israel to perform when they sinned. In doing this the sinner's sins were atoned for, they were covered.

Then Jesus appeared on the scene, and he gave historical credibility to Adam and Eve's literal historical reality (Matt. 19:4-6). Then after revealing himself as the true God and Creator of all things he died as the "Lamb of God" – a once for all sacrifice to atone for the sins of man. The atonement that God gave to Adam and Eve in the beginning was merely a precursor to the perfect sacrifice Jesus offered to God on man's behalf. If you reject God's literal creation in six days and the historical reliability of Adam and Eve's sin, which plunged the entire human race into sin, then you also reject Jesus Christ, the perfect sacrifice who alone atones for sin.

Fluoride and Bottled Water

Dear Friends,

An official statement of the American Dental Association says, "There are no scientific studies to indicate an increase in the tooth decay rate because more people are drinking bottled water. Nonetheless, the ADA wants people to be aware that if they drink bottled water as their primary source of water they could be missing the decay preventive effects of optimally fluoridated water available from their community water source.

Although there there is no standard for a minimum daily dietary requirement of fluoride, the recommended level of water fluoridation for those who favor the process is from 0.7 to 1.2 milligrams per liter.

Howard Bailit, with the University of Connecticut School of Medicine's department of community medicine and health care agreed there essentially is no such thing as a fluoride-free diet, but addressed the question of whether or not using fluoridated toothpaste would be enough for someone who consumed no dietary fluoride.

Drinking fluoridated water is more effective than using toothpastes or mouth rinses that contain fluoride. Fluoride from toothpaste is only on the teeth for a short time, whereas consumption of fluoridated water allows fluoride to continually be delivered to the teeth through the blood-stream and saliva. Fluoride can therefore also be incorporated into teeth as they form in childhood.

Therefore, it's important that parents buying bottled water for their family determine how much fluoride is present in the water.



FIT Facts

A Walk a Day

The popularity of walking as a fitness activity is growing by leaps and bounds. Low risk and easy to start, walking has proved its health benefits in numerous studies.

An eight-year study of 13,000 people found that those who walked 30 minutes a day had a significantly lower risk of premature death than those who rarely exercised.

A regular walking program can help:

- Reduce blood cholesterol
- Lower blood pressure
- Increase cardiovascular endurance
- Boost bone strength
- Burn calories and keep weight down

Get ready

A walking program is simple to start. All you need are comfortable clothes and shoes. Layer loose clothing, keeping in mind that exercise elevates the body's temperature. Shoes specifically designed for walking are best.

Every workout should begin with a brief warm-up and a few simple stretches. Walk around the house or in place for a few minutes to get the blood flowing to the muscles before you attempt to stretch them. Although walking primarily works the major muscles of the legs, don't forget to stretch your back, shoulders and arms. This will help to loosen up any tension you may be carrying and make your walk more enjoyable as well as more effective.



Get moving

Beginning walkers can make their workouts less strenuous by limiting how fast and far they walk. Keep in mind the following:

• Walk short distances

Begin with a five-minute stroll and gradually increase your distance.

• Forget about speed

Walk at a comfortable pace. Focus on good posture, keeping your head lifted and shoulders relaxed.

· Swing your arms naturally

Breathe deeply. If you can't catch your breath, slow down or avoid hills.

• Be sure you can talk while walking
If you can't converse, you are walking too
fast.

Get fit!

Walking is one fitness activity that allows you numerous options. Once you have reached a point where you can walk a few miles with relative ease, you can start to vary the intensity.

Walking hills, in addition to increasing your cardiovascular endurance, is a great way to tone the legs. Concentrate on lengthening your stride or increasing your speed. And don't forget to reward yourself after each workout with a few minutes of relaxing stretches to help prevent sore muscles.


Listening to lively music while you walk is also a great way to energize your workout. But if you wear headphones, keep the volume down and watch out for traffic that you may not hear.

Keep track of your progress. Many experts recommend that you walk a minimum of 20 minutes a day. But there are no hard and fast rules. Fit walking into your schedule whenever you can. That may mean two 10-minute walks each day, or even hour-long walks two to three times a week. The best schedule is one that keeps you walking and keeps you fit!







