I have heard of another way to keep our homes and property safe. If you do not have an alarm system for your home and even if you do, this will be very useful. If you have a car that has a remote button that will sound its horn or alarm system keep it with you by your bedside when retiring for the night. If you hear a noise outside your home or someone trying to get in your house, just press the panic button for vour car. The alarm will be set off and the horn will sound until either you turn it off or the car battery dies. It will go off from most everywhere inside your home. Try it! A robber or rapist won't stick around because after a few seconds neighbors will be looking out their windows. Anything we can do to make our lives safer is welcomed.

Remember to get your keys out of your purse or pocket before leaving a store and sound that alarm if you feel threatened. Also, when working outside (especially with older residents) keep you keys with you. If an accidents occurs and no one is with you sound the alarm for help.
