2008 Fairfield Village Neighborhood Assessments are Due!

Dear Residents,

The 2008 maintenance assessments for the individual neighborhoods in Fairfield are due in January and considered delinquent after January 31, 2008. The individual neighborhoods are as follows:

Fairfield Village South NA – includes Fairfield Village North
Fairfield Village Patio Homes
Bradford Creek NA
Chappell Ridge NA
Garden Grove NA
Inwood Park NA
Lakes of Fairfield NA
Trails of Fairfield NA

The amount of your assessment is determined by the expenses of each respective neighborhood and is set in the fall of each year by the Board of Directors at a budget meeting specifically held for that purpose.

This is a separate assessment from the Fairfield Village Community Association (called the "Master" Association) fee which is due July 1 of each year. The fee structure was set up this way in the governing documents of the respective Associations by the Developer. This means all homeowners have two assessments in Fairfield, sometimes confusing for new homeowners.

If your assessment is not received by the due date late letters are sent, then a certified letter prior to an attorney letter issued for collection. If you live in Bradford Creek, Inwood Park, Lakes of Fairfield or Fairfield Village South there is a \$15.00 dollar charge for a certified letter which is added to your account balance. There is an additional \$25.00 charge for referral to the attorney (in addition to the cost of an attorney demand letter) for residents of Bradford Creek, Lakes of Fairfield and Fairfield Village South, which is incurred by the homeowner if this step becomes necessary.

It is not the intent of the Associations to incur penalties for the homeowners – especially attorney fees which are so expensive. Please do not ignore assessment statements, or collection letters. If you experience difficulty with your assessment please contact our office at 713-932-1122 – we will be happy to work with you in order to avoid the above penalties. Your Association requires these funds in order to pay the expenses of your neighborhood – street lights, insurance policy, mowing of cul-de-sacs and common areas, pool share costs, administrative, etc.

It is the homeowner's responsibility to provide your Association with a correct billing address – if you are leasing a home and see mail from the Association please assist our office in obtaining a current mailing address in order to help avoid penalties.

In order to use the Fairfield Village recreational facilities your assessments must be paid per the governing documents of the Associations.

Trash and Debris

No one likes to drive around Fairfield and see trash and debris strewn on the ground or on the street. It is unfortunate that some people find it necessary to toss their trash out of the car window to the ground. Just about everything imaginable has been picked up from beer bottles to ladies shoes. The landscapers do pick up trash along the way when they mow, however at this time of the year they're on the winter schedule and only mow one time per month, therefore in the interim the trash remains where the person dropped it. Due to the volume of trash seen on major through streets and around the lakes, your Association has hired the services of a contractor to pick up trash at those locations twice per week. Unfortunately, this cost is passed along to you, the homeowner, in your assessment. With the unexpected beautiful weather we've had, more people have been using the facilities therefore, there's more trash. If you see a trash can is full, please don't leave your trash on top of it, it'll just blow away, but rather find another trash can or bring it home with you and please let us know so we can have the trash can emptied.

We appreciate any assistance you can offer to alleviate this ongoing dilemma.

Managing the business of our organization is much easier when funds are available to maintain assets in a condition that meets your expectations of Fairfield. Thank you for your past support. We look forward to serving your needs during 2008.





Fairfield Homeowner Publishes Mystery Novel


Because Eva is involved with Houston's homeless community, the authors plan to have links to charity outreach on their website to allow readers to find out more about how to help the Houston homeless.

Did You Know?

According to Psalm 127:4-5 children are a gift from God: "Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one's youth. Blessed is the man who fills his quiver with them!" Sadly, there are many parents who curse their children by failing to raise them properly. But since they are God's gift to us we as parents we are responsible for their upbringing.

First, children are to be raised as youngsters who love and respect the Almighty God, who are taught to obey His commands as given in the Bible. Deuteronomy 6:7 says, "You shall teach [God's words] diligently to your sons and shall talk of them when you sit in your house and when you walk by the way and when you lie down and when you rise up."

Second, children are to be diligently disciplined. Consider Proverbs 22:15: "Folly is bound up in the heart of a child, but the rod of discipline will drive it far from him." Of course those of us with children learn early on that they don't need to be taught how to rebel, get angry, or be selfish. They are born with these sinful inclinations. It's no wonder Deuteronomy 6:7 says what it does, for children must be taught to submit. How does a parent do this? Through spanking! Proverbs speaks of using the "rod of discipline" which was a flat wooden stick used on the hind side of a child when their behavior was sinful. The "folly" in a child is literally a state of foolishness with a lack of wisdom. It is "bound up" in that it is fastened to them spiritually. What is it that frees them from their bondage? A spanking. And if you perform this properly and diligently on your child you will have accomplished your task if you have accompanied your discipline with the teaching of God's words (see also Prov. 13:24; 19:18; 23:13-14; 29:15, 17).

The children also have a part in this process. Ephesians 6:1-3 says, "Children, obey your parents in the Lord for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother,' which is the first commandment accompanied by a promise, namely, 'that it may go well with you and that you will live a long time on the earth." Of course the apostle was quoting the fifth commandment in Exodus 20:12, and in doing so he gave authority to his command.

The fathers of children, who are to be the primary disciplinarians, are told in Ephesians 6:4: "Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but raise them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord." So all of it comes right back to Deuteronomy 6:7 to the command to teach your children the decrees of the Lord and raise them to know Jesus Christ.

The Bible is filled not so much with examples of great fathers but of fathers who failed greatly to raise their children properly. One example would be King Solomon who instructed his son Rehoboam, who became king after him, throughout the book of Proverbs with the greatest wisdom ever written. But Solomon's actions did not back his words, for he had many wives and followed foreign gods toward the end of his life. Rehoboam, therefore, was a wicked man. And Solomon's father - the good King David - though a great king and leader in Israel, was apparently a less than stern father to his sons. Their wicked behavior was indicative of children who are not disciplined appropriately.

Being a parent is hard work, for it involves dealing with children who have been born into a sinful bondage. The greatest parents are the ones who discipline consistently and teach Scripture incessantly. Parents are never told to be a friend to their children, but neither are they to exasperate them. When we stand before God one day we will most certainly give an account for what we did with the quiver of gifts He gave to us.



Understanding Sciatica

Sciatica is a nerve-related condition that can have a major impact on your fitness program and your ability to perform simple, daily tasks with ease.

A relatively common form of back pain, sciatica refers to irritation of the sciatic nerve, which is made up of five branches of nerves that come out of your lumbar and sacral spine.

In many cases, sciatica is caused by a herniated disc that is putting pressure on the sciatic nerve. A herniated disc, which is often brought on by a sudden twisting motion or injury, is sometimes referred to as a slipped, ruptured, bulging or protruding disc, or a pinched nerve.

For others, sciatica may be caused by a narrowing of the spinal canal, or stenosis, which can be congenital or may develop over time. In this case, lesions can form and protrude into the canal and press on the nerves. Sciatic irritation may also be caused by slippage of a vertebral body in front of another, a condition known as spondylolisthesis.

Poor biomechanics, curvature of the back, weak abdominal muscles or pregnancy can contribute to this slippage, which can press on the nerve.

Symptoms of sciatica

As the longest nerve in your body, the sciatic nerve runs down from your lower back through the back of your thighs, where it divides into two branches just above your knees. It further branches out into the muscles below your knees, all the way down to your feet.

Classic symptoms of sciatica often start



out with back pain, which may improve over time. However, you may begin to feel pain in one of your hamstrings or calves, and some numbness or tingling in your toes.

For some people, the pain from sciatica can be severe and debilitating. For others, the pain might be infrequent and irritating, but has the potential to get worse. While sciatica can be very painful, permanent nerve damage is rare.

Fortunately, because the spinal cord does not extend through the lumbar (lower) spine, there is no danger of paralysis from a herniated disc in this area.

(Note: If your symptoms include progressive weakness in the legs or bladder/bowel incontinence, this may indicate a serious condition called cauda equina syndrome, which requires immediate medical attention.)

Treating sciatica

How sciatica is treated depends on the severity of the problem. You should, of course, see your doctor for an evaluation and diagno-

sis if the pain is keeping you from everyday activities.

Nerve pain is caused by both pressure and inflammation on the nerve, and treatment is concentrated on relieving both of these conditions.

For acute pain along the sciatic nerve, heat and/or ice packs can help relieve pain. Begin by applying heat or ice for about 20 minutes at a time, and repeating every two hours as needed. You can also alternate the two to see if this provides more relief.

For some people, taking oral steroids or an anti-inflammatory such as ibuprofen will help. If the pain is severe, your doctor may inject an epidural directly into the affected area to reduce the inflammation that is causing you pain.

Manual treatments, osteopathic or chiropractic, may help relieve the pressure. Your doctor may also suggest a physical-therapy program that includes back-strengthening or lumbar stabilization exercises.

Fortunately, most people with sciatica can expect their symptoms to improve within a matter of days. For others, relief may come within two to three months.

In a small percentage of cases, where pain is severe and the combination of manual and medical treatments have not provided relief, surgery may be necessary to help relieve both pressure and inflammation.
