



What is Neighborhood Watch?
Neighborhood Watch is a voluntary program organized by concerned citizens to reduce crime in their community.
Working with local law enforcement agencies, citizens can learn when and how to report suspicious activities, assist in property identification, conduct home security measures and precautions.



Who can join a Neighborhood Watch?

Any resident of this community can join Neighborhood Watch, and there are many ways for each of us to come together and help make our community a safer place to reside.

As we begin this program it's important for you all to know that we have been coordinating with local law enforcement so that we can partner with them. Also, we have a coordinator, Mike Preiser, who will organizing the program and meetings.

In addition, we have a goal of getting at least 50% of the households on board. By doing this we will be able to have Neighborhood Watch signs put up in the community.

Please review the following information as there is a clarification on our handling of non-standard waste receptacles.

A. Garbage collection days are: TUESDAY & FRIDAY

Recycling collection days are: FRIDAY Items collected: newsprint, aluminum & bi-metal


cans, plastics coded #1 & #2)

- B. Your trash, garbage and recycling must be out, ready for pickup by 7:00 a.m. on your scheduled collection days. All household garbage and rubbish will be collected from the curb.
- C. Trash and garbage shall be contained in standard containers of less than 40 gallons capacity such as lightweight metal cans, plastic cans and/or sturdy plastic garbage bags that are designed for use as residential garbage containers. Bags must have sufficient wall strength to maintain physical integrity when lifted by the top. All trash and garbage must be bagged if placed into waste receptacles larger than 40 gallons capacity. Please note: A 65 gallon container is the largest receptacle collection crews are permitted to service as specified herein. Crews will remove only the bagged trash from these larger receptacles with capacity up to 65 gallons. Collection crews, for safety considerations, are instructed not to attempt to lift any receptacles larger than 40 gallons capacity.
- D. Bagged yard waste material such as grass and leaves must not exceed forty pounds (40 lbs) when full. Branches and tree trimmings of less than three inches (3") in diameter must be *bundled and securely tied*, as not to exceed four feet (4') in length, a total circumference of the bundle shall be less than 24 inches, nor exceed forty pounds (40 lbs) in total weight. Limbs larger than three inches (3") in diameter are not collected. Bags and bundles will be collected at the curb along with your trash and garbage. Garbage collection is limited to fifteen (15) items (cans, bags and/or bundles) per collection day. Moving boxes must be flatten, bundled and securely tied.
- E. Bulky or heavy trash such as old furniture, appliances, garage cleanups, Christmas trees and similar items are to be collected each Friday, except on observed holidays, with a limit of **two** bulky items. Please contact our *Residential Customer Service Department at 713-686-6666*, if you have a question or unusual item for collection. Our office hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday and 8 a.m. until noon on Saturday.
- F. Waste Management will not pickup hazardous waste (HHW) such as motor oil, gasoline, paint, batteries, garden chemicals, smoke detectors, etc. Additionally automobile tires, tree trunks, auto body parts and similar items will not be collected by our personnel. Material generated from remodeling, carpeting, or roofing materials are not considered as typical household garbage and rubbish. Consequently, they will not be collected. Note: Refrigerators must have the compressor removed, refrigerant drained and lines sealed by a licensed technician with appropriate recycled content tag affixed to the unit.
- G. If an observed holiday as specified below falls on your garbage collection day, there will be no collection that day. Collections will be take place on the next regularly scheduled collection day following the observed holiday. Please refrain from placing bulk items out on this day due to the large volumes of household garbage. Scheduled and observed holidays are:

New Year's Day Memorial Day July 4th
Labor Day Thanksgiving Day Christmas Day

H. Please direct inquiries about appropriate disposal options for **Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)** such as used oil, paints, pesticides, etc; to Harris County Pollution Control at 713-290-3000 or www.cleanwaterclearchoice.org. They can direct you to the nearest appropriate disposal site for HHW items.

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Pet Owners

Pet owners; please keep your pets on leashes when walking in the neighborhood, as a courtesy to others. Also, take care to pick up after your pooch if they leave a gift in someone else's yard or in any common area. No one likes to see, smell or step in those gifts!
