Mason Road Expansion Update

As a member of the Fairfield Homeowners Board, I agreed to contact Harris County for an update regarding the progress in expanding Mason Road to four lanes from just north of Maple Village Drive to Schiel Road. The homeowner boards were of the opinion that the engineering work for this segment has been completed. Several members of the board had met with county representatives regarding the connections and sidewalks on the east side of this road segment.

Our concern for getting this expansion under way at the earliest date is due the greatly increased traffic on Mason Road in the last six months. It is not uncommon at times to see northbound traffic on Mason Road backed up at Chappell Knoll Drive with the line extending well past the bridge over the green belt pedestrian tunnel north of Maple Village Drive. This congestion is created by the constriction of Mason Road from four lanes to two lanes. Mason Road is a major county thoroughfare in the Fairfield Subdivision used by the 4000+homeowners. We are also seeing a great increase in the traffic using Mason Road from the subdivisions to the north of Fairfield such as The Lakes of Fairhaven and Saddle Ridge. We expect increased use of Mason Road with the opening of the Fairfield Premium Outlet Mall on March 27 and the future Fairfield Town Center which is expected in early 2009.

It is the opinion of the Homeowner Boards that the expansion of Mason Road must include the extension of the two box culvert pedestrian tunnels north of Maple Village Drive and north of Country Fair Lane for the safety of our residents. We currently have two elementary schools to the west of Mason Road with a third school to be constructed in the near future. These pedestrian tunnels provide a safe way for our many elementary students and citizens to cross under a busy Mason Road. Our board members indicated that these pedestrian passageways were included in the engineering plans shown to our Homeowners Association members.


I sent Randy Schilhab, P.E., Harris County Manager of Engineering, a request to confirm the box culvert pedestrian tunnel extensions are to be included when Mason Road is expanded to four lanes. I am sure that the 17,000+ people living in Fairfield were a big factor in helping to pass the recent bond issue for more road funds. We are eager to see these funds spent wisely before the traffic congestion for this segment compounds the construction problems and increases this project's cost.

Randy Schilhab responded to my inquiry. The engineering to widen Mason Road from Maple Village Drive north to Schiel Road to be a 4-lane concrete boulevard is nearing completion. The project includes new traffic signals at Mason/Maple Village and Mason/Chappell Knoll. He further commented that the county's limited road and bridge funds must be dedicated to providing the best possible roadway and drainage improvements that the engineering budget can reasonably afford. Amenities such as sidewalks, street lights, pedestrian tunnels, signal upgrades from the standard box span configuration to mast arms must be funded by private developers, MUDs, HOAs, etc. We routinely enter into joint participation agreements with others to fund such amenities. The cost of the amenities on this project is \$300,000. This amount includes the extension of the two pedestrian tunnels and upgrading both signals to mast arms. To date, we have not been successful in securing a partner to fund the amenity pack-

age.

It is interesting to note that the county considers a safety issue as an amenity! The main concern is for the pedestrian tunnels to be extended. It would be extremely unsafe for a bike rider or walker to emerge from the tunnel into two lanes of northbound traffic. I do not believe that a concrete box tunnel could add very much cost to this project. The Fairfield Homeowners do not have funds to give the county \$300,000. This work also will benefit traffic originating outside this subdivision. Harris County should build this county road in the safest possible way with the funds we voted to them. Please let your county representatives know your feelings about this project.



First Dental Visit of Children

Dear Friends,

Teeth whitening is a very popular procedure in dentistry. However, there are limitations that people need to know about. Teeth whitening is not recommended for pregnant women, women who are nursing children, people who have gum disease, people who have cracked teeth, people who have cavities in the area to be whitened, and for children under 13 years of age. If you have crowns or bondings, you need to know that those will not change color when you whiten.

People who have yellowish teeth have a better chance of getting their teeth bleached well compared to people with brownish teeth. Unfortunately, for those with grayish teeth, brightening will be minimal at best. Also for those who have deep stains within the teeth, like with tetracycline or just genetics, these teeth will not lighten up either.

Take-home trays are tooth whitening kits that can be used at home under the supervision of a dentist. These work very well as you place the gel in the custom trays made just for your teeth. It takes two weeks to whiten and the results last longer then any other methods. When the teeth get a bit darker, it is very easy to touch up over the weekend to get the brightness back.





1 tablespoon parsley flakes

1/4 tsp. garlic powder

Follow instructions on Hot Roll Mix. Punch down & roll out to a rectangle about 18 x 12". Beat the egg with the ricotta cheese and spread on the dough. Sprinkle all remaining ingredients over the dough. Roll up and place in a curved shape on a greased cookie sheet. Cut the dough almost through the roll about every inch. Let rise again for about 1 hour. Bake in 350° oven for about 40 minutes or until browned.







Nutrition Road Tips

- Always drink plenty of water, particularly if you're flying.
- Conjure up a healthy meal in your mind prior to entering a restaurant, and stick to your plan as closely as possible.
- Try to eat at least three times per day to keep you from feeling famished and overindulging at any one time.
- Pick up portable, healthy snacks at a local market so you won't be caught hungry in front of the mini-bar.
- Go ahead and splurge on regional dishes or local cuisine, but balance your diet by choosing lower-calorie foods at other meals.

Travel Fitness: A Plan of Action to Keep You Active

IT IS EASY TO LET A VACATION OR

business trip destroy your fitness schedule and eating habits, but why let something as rewarding as a vacation or as exciting as a business trip leave you feeling unhealthy upon return. With a little research and proper planning, you can create an easy-to-follow plan to keep you fit and healthy no matter where you travel, and you can come home feeling more healthy and energized then when you left.

Nature's Playground and Man's Monuments

There is no excuse for not finding places to exercise when every city has a great staircase, stadium, or tall buildings where you can master the stairs without a machine. If stairs aren't your thing, cities have lots of places good for walking, running or even hiking. Ask the hotel concierge if there are parks or trails nearby; or if you have ventured to the mountains, ask for a map of local hiking trails. It is also a good idea to ask the concierge for a map of the city to find out how many of your destinations are reachable by foot. (Walking will increase your fitness and decrease your taxi fares.) Prior to departure on your trip, find out if your hotel has a workout facility and a pool, and remember to pack your bathing suit and workout clothes. If they don't have a facility, they may be affiliated with a local gym where you can get a one-day pass for a small fee. There are no limits to the exercise you can do while exploring new territory. Make the most of your trip, and get to know the city by foot.

Prepare for Power, No Excuses

If your hotel doesn't offer fitness accommodations, bring along a jump rope and an exercise tube. They are both lightweight and easy to transport. Jumping rope is one of the best forms of cardiovascular exercise, and you can do it anywhere.

With the exercise tube and a pre-arranged plan to keep you motivated, you can keep your entire body toned and energized without entering a gym or stepping on a piece of exercise equipment. Numerous magazines and Web sites offer workout instructions for each body part. And, of course, body-weight exercises such as push-ups and crunches require no equipment at all. The point is to find a workout routine that suits your needs and follow it. Plan a specific time each day or every other day to do your strengthening and cardiovascular routines (a good plan is to alternate days between the two). Remember that the 20 to 60 minutes you spend working out each day is for you, and try to stay on schedule.

Have Fun

Be sure to enjoy yourself and make the most of the area to which you have traveled. Remember to bring comfortable shoes so that you can easily get a workout while using your feet as your main mode of transportation. Whether your trip is for business or vacation, remember that you should have some time for yourself every day. Why not dedicate that time to improving your health and making yourself feel better!



Harvest Bible Church

Did You Know?

One of the great things about the Bible is that it doesn't hide or gloss over the sins of the saints. Abraham lied, Judah sought sex from a prostitute, David committed adultery and murder, and Peter denied even knowing Jesus the night of his crucifixion. In Genesis 9:21 even Noah is said to have planted a vineyard and gotten drunk! Was it a one time moral lapse, or was Noah a drunkard? Now it is possible that Noah's drunkenness wasn't entirely his fault. That possibility is hypothesized from the new environmental conditions of the earth following the Flood.

The pre-Flood earth may very well have been encased in a vapor canopy made of water ("the waters above" in Gen. 1:6-7) that kept the earth at a uniform temperature – no wind, no rain, no extreme cold or heat. This goes a long way in explaining how rain forests, animal fossils, and remnants of fruits/berries are found frozen in Siberia and surrounding areas. The atmospheric pressure of the pre-Flood earth was about 21/4 times greater than afterward, and this new air pressure difference would have considerably increased the fermentation rate of grapes, which occurs when CO 2 escapes from grapes. However, when air pressure increases CO 2 fails to escape (e.g., bottle caps on carbonated drinks prevent the gas from escaping, but when they're taken off the fizz fades). The pre-Flood vapor canopy may have acted like a bottle cap, and the increased air pressure slowed the release of CO 2. This would have slowed the natural process of fermentation. In other words, prior to the Flood fermentation would have taken far longer, and Noah would have drunk without getting drunk. After the Flood the fermentation process

increased, and Noah would have been taken by surprise at how little it would take to make him drunk. One scientist says, "Drinking alcohol in the pre-Flood atmosphere would have been like a man today drinking at sea level. On the other hand, drinking in the post-Flood atmosphere would be like a person drinking today at an elevation of 10,000 feet or more, where the air pressure is $2\frac{1}{4}$ times less than at sea level." So after the ark came to rest on the mountains of Ararat where he lived for a time after the Flood, whose base is 3,000 feet above sea level, it's obvious that alcohol consumption would take less to make one drunk because of the atmospheric conditions. The air pressure there could have been as much as three times less than it was prior to the Flood, and Noah's tolerance for alcohol would have decreased by up to 75%. Hence, his drunkenness.

Now Noah's drunkenness shouldn't be seen as a license to abuse alcohol any more so than King David's adultery gives license to commit adultery. Both are sinful in God's eyes, and yet both vices are forgiven by those who turn from their sin to the only One who can grant forgiveness, namely, Jesus Christ – the only name under heaven by which man can be saved.
